Presidents Report

Greetings Neighbors,

I am happy to announce the election results, Trustees Bruce Bott, Brent Burris and Stuart Cory have been re-elected to another term by the residents of Deerfield. We had a good number of members come out and vote this year.

Voting of officers was held at the Annual Board meeting, and elected as Secretary was Arthur McDanel, as Treasurer was Stuart Cory, as Vice President was Larry Burkham and as President was Eric Toureilles. All voted and agreed to represent the same Committee's they served in 2013.

In the Annual Meeting of the Members, I reported that the Association's financial position is strong, both reserves are in check and budgets are being adhered to. Our facilities are well maintained, both Clubhouse and Annex have recently been painted and kitchens modernized. We added new railing that will last longer, and blend better with the iron fence around the pool. New furniture was added, and we are in process of adding nice drapes to the Clubhouse. We are planning on resurfacing one of the Tennis courts in April/May, to maintain the performance of these courts. Landscape continues to do a good job keeping up with the grounds, while keeping in mind the rising cost of watering when choosing plants and flowers.

Overall, the condition of the neighborhood is very good, and the investment we made in placing the exercise machines along the Greenbelt has been well received. The team from SEAL is well visible, and has proven to be an asset to the community on multiple occasions. Al-

though multiple investments made to improve our community, and the rising cost of utilities, we again have kept Annual Assessments the same in 2013. Also, I thanked all the volunteers and Committee chairs, current and past for their service to the community. We truly could not do this without the help of these residents.



In 2014, we will focus on improvements to the DVCA website and looking into a system to email, text and even make calls when there is news around our community. You will continue to receive the Village Pipeline by mail and the Deerfield Newsletter via email, and we have paper copies in the office, depending on your preference. We will also be looking at a tech solution to replace the aging Marquee, while bringing a more modern look and feel.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

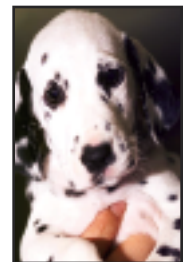

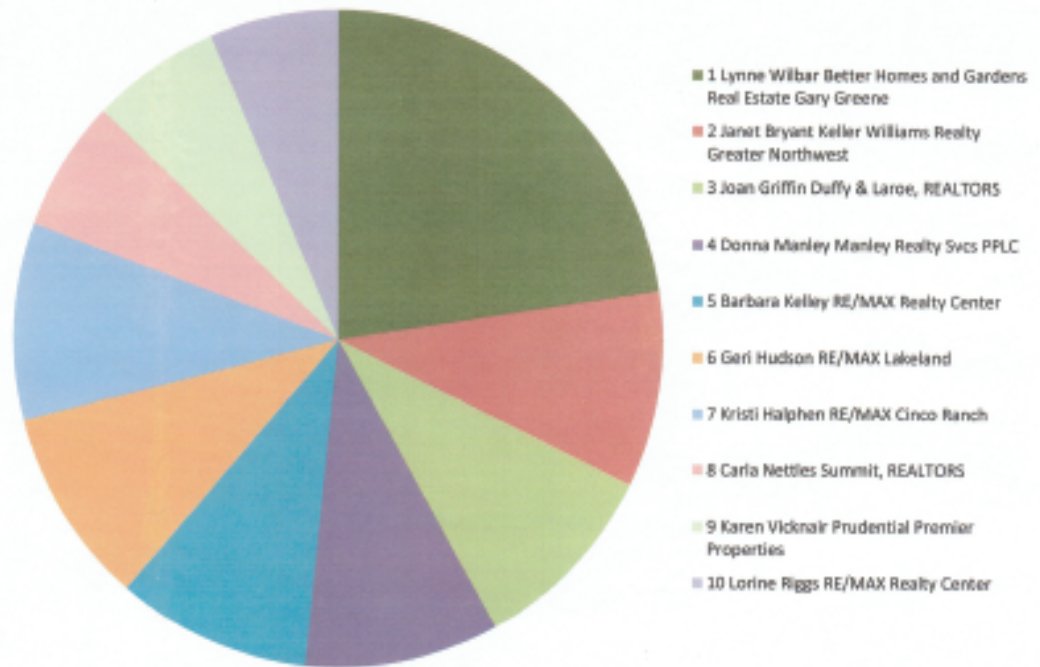

Are you aware that Deerfield Village has a “Neighborhood Watch Program? The Neighborhood Watch program contains information that can help keep your home and family safe and secure.

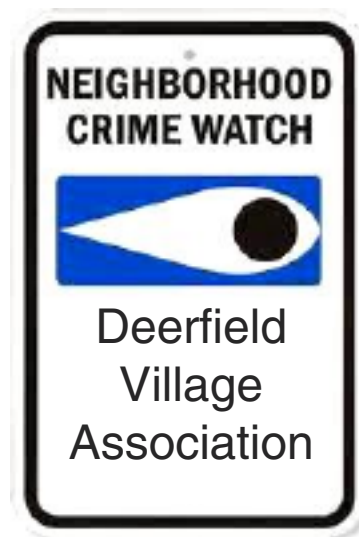
The Security Committee is in the process of updating the Neighborhood Watch Program with current block captain and section leader information. This information will be updated on the Deerfield Village website soon.

Please call me for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. If your pet gets lost and has the tag the finder can call me and I will call you and arrange to return your pet. Tags from another city or state make it hard to get your pet back as quickly asap. The Pet Hotline tag has my home and cell #. I keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep

your pet several days.

“ATTENTION!!! ALL PET OWNERS

Keep your dog safe by making sure the gates are locked during garbage day pick-up. Pets will bark and jump at the gate, and if it is not latched properly, they will get out. Tuesdays and Fridays are the days I get the most calls for missing pets!”

Mud 136 Report...

The District’s fiscal year begins on April 1st of the current year and runs through March 31 of the following year. At the March board meeting, the Directors approved the budget for fiscal year 2014-2015. Details of the new budget are contained in the Bookkeeper’s Report, which is posted on the District website, HYPERLINK "<http://www.hcmud136.org>" www.hcmud136.org.

The District has a contract with Texas Trash Co. to handle Deerfield’s trash removal. The terms of the contract cover, among other things, trimmings from plants and trees. Those trimmings are to either be held in trash cans or tied up in bundles. Bundles cannot exceed 4 ft. in length or weigh more than 45 lbs. The complete set of requirements is posted on the District’s website. The ice storm last month created a lot of debris. We thank

all of you who followed the contract requirements stated above. Your continued cooperation is appreciated. For any of you who did not, you were probably passed by. The volume of trash, especially after a big storm, is simply too big to give the anyone’s trash special handling. Arrangements can be made with Texas Trash if you have an unusual disposal situation. Their phone number is 281-888-3688.

Until now, we have been holding special recycling days to handle the disposal of hazardous materials. Starting in May we are changing to a service provided by Waste Management Co. It is called At Your Door Special Collection. With this program, you will be able to schedule a pick up at your home. Complete details will be sent to you in a special mailing. A summary of the program will appear in next month’s newsletter.

Our next meeting will be held on April 10 at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM. Residents are encouraged to attend.

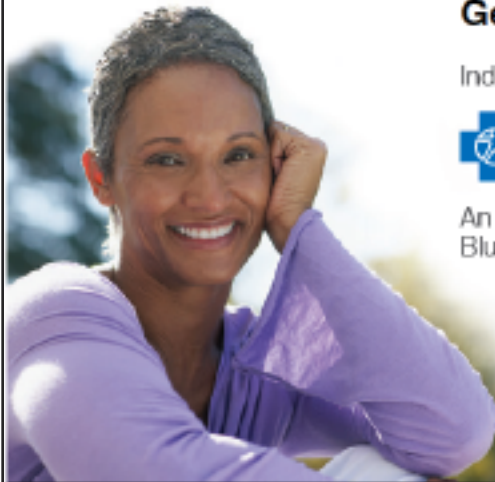

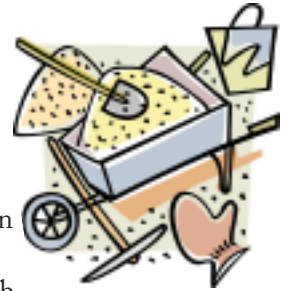
Coffee & Donuts
