You can then click the "request form" and complete the requested information and submit.

## Recycling is Always on Friday

Regular recycling pick-up is done by Residential Recycling of Texas. For bins, please call Stephanie Wolff at 866-516-9805. Recycling is always on Friday for paper, cardboard, plastic, and aluminum containers. For large and hazardous items, special arrangements must be made. #### Residential Trash Reminders

Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Waste Corporation of America: 832-230-8223 Hours of Operation 7am-7pm Office hours 7am-4pm. Pickup days are Tuesday and Friday. Please do not put your trash out until Monday evening or Thursday evening.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along

curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

# **MUD 136 Report**

At its November meeting, the Board reviewed the District's water and sewer operations during the previous month, as well as the garbage and recycling operations. Detailed information about the month's business has been posted on the District's website, www.hcmud136.org. We are planning to modernize the website using the latest software and are looking for a website hosting company to do this. If you have any recommendations, please email director Harry Price at hlp485475@sbcglobal.net.

Certified tax rolls from the Harris County Appraisal District indicate that the assessed value of Deerfield homes has risen, on average, a little less than 9%. To mitigate the effect of this on your property taxes, the Directors voted to reduce the tax rate

by the same percentage. The tax rate for 2015 will be 17.8 cents per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation. Tax bills have been mailed out. If you have not received your tax bill or have a tax questions about it, contact the District's tax collector, Bob Leared Interests, 713-932-9011. You can also get information from their web site, www.bli-tax.com.

Three new circular recycling containers are going to be placed around the Rec Center. They are solely for empty drink cans and bottles. If, as we hope, they are well used, more will be placed on the greenbelt.

If you have questions or comments about any District business, plan to attend the next District meeting, which will be held on Thursday, December 10, at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.

# Holiday Safety Checklist

The holidays are upon us and along with the festivities we need to remember to be alert for criminal activity and overall personal safety

- When out shopping always be alert. Before leaving a store, always have your keys in your hand. Keep your cell phone close by, using only if and when necessary. Remember, if you are distracted by talking or texting on your phone, it is an open invitation to criminals.
- If you see something that makes you uncomfortable when walking to your vehicle, go back to the store and request an employee or security guard to watch or walk you to your vehicle.
- Do not leave packages or other valuables in plain view inside your vehicle as this is an invitation for criminals.
- 4. When shopping, watch your purse and bags, thieves watch for any opportunity to catch you unaware. Do not leave your child, purse or other purchases in your basket and walk away to look at something further down the aisle.
- When at home, lock your doors and use your alarm systems. Keep your garage door closed.
- 6. If you are traveling, put your home on Vacation Watch with SEAL. Put a vacation hold on your mail and newspaper or have a neighbor collect them for you. If possible, set up timers to go on and off at various times so that it appears that someone is home.
- 7. During extremely cold weather, remember the 3 P's: Pets, Plants, and Pipes. Bring pets inside or provide a warm safe place for them to go, cover tender vegetation, and wrap pipes if needed. These precautions can save a lot of heartache and money!
- Call and report any suspicious activity, persons, or vehicles you see right away! And in an emergency, Call 9-1-1!

If you are considering any work outside of your home, please be sure to complete and return an Application for Architectural Control to the DVCA Office. Your Application will then be forwarded to the Deeds Committee for their review and approval. As soon as approval has been received, you will be notified.

Applications can be found on the website: **www.deerfieldvillageonline.com** then click on DVCA Forms.

The Deeds Committee is in need of more members to help with the review of the Architectural Applications and monthly inspections for Deed Restriction Violations. The neighborhood is divided into smaller, workable Sections (no one does their own.) Deerfield Village Residents are very responsible and protective of their neighborhood and keeping the Protective Covenants enforced. However, there are those few that need reminders occasionally, and then some that need a little more pressure applied before deciding to comply with the Deed Restrictions.

The next meeting for the Deeds Committee will be on Monday, December 7, 2015 at 7 pm at the Clubhouse.

# Financial Services Committee

There will be no meeting in December. The next meeting will be January 19th.

#### **Assessments:**

YTD collections are at 98.32% which is .99% **ahead** of last years rate

By now you should have received your assessment invoice. If you have not received it contact the DVCA office and request a copy be sent.

Assessments remain the same as last year, \$630.00 for single family homes and \$710.00 for patio homes. Payment is due 1/1/2016 and is past due after 1/31/2016 and will be subject to a late fee of \$100.00

Tags from another city or state make it hard to get your pet back as quickly asap. The Pet Hotline tag has my home and cell #. I keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep your pet several days.

You don't have time to get it's shots and check for heartworms.

You don't have time to get a collar with ID and a phone # on a tag.


