Keep Deerfield Bright at Night...

Please report Street Lights and Greenbelt Lights that are out to the DVCA Office; phone: 281-463-2624. It is necessary to provide the pole number and the location address of the pole that is being reported. Street Lights that are not on the Greenbelt and not in the Patio Home Section may be reported directly to Center-Point Energy at the following website:

Click on the "Report a Streetlight Outage" located in the middle of the page. You can then click the "request form" and complete the requested information and submit.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Waste Corporation of America: 281-368-8397. Hours of operation are 7 am to 7 pm, office hours are 7 am to 4 pm. Pick-up days are Tuesday and Friday. Heavy trash day is Friday, limit 1 heavy item per service day per household. Please do not put your trash out until Monday or Thursday evening.

MUD 136 Report

At its May meeting, the Board reviewed the District's operations. During the previous month, over 10 million gallons of water were provided to customers. 100% of the water was from the West Harris County Regional Water Authority (WHCRWA) who purchases the water from the City of Houston. The City's treated water meets or exceeds all quality standards for potable water. WHCRWA monitors the quality of the water received at their Jersey Village distribution facility. Lastly, it is analyzed at our water plant. If further treatment is needed, it is done using our injection facilities.

REMINDER: Since chloromines are used in water treatment, the water cannot be used in dialysis machines or fish tanks.

Annually we publish the Drinking Water Quality Report for our District. A link to the electronic version of the report will be posted in your June water bill. Also, the report will be posted on the District's website (www.hcmud136. org). Please take the time to read it, as it contains very important information about the water we provide. The report confirms that "our drinking water meets or exceeds all federal drinking water requirements".

If you have questions about water quality or any other District matter, plan to attend the next monthly meeting on Thursday, June 8, 6pm, at the Rec Center.

Financial Services Committee

YTD expenses \$221,357 Annual Operating Budget \$665,138 YTD budget \$200,057 Annual Reserve Budget \$87,802 Under/ (Over)/budget \$ 21,300

There doesn't appear to be any major expenses issues. Over budget is cause by insurance payment in April budgeted in May

The YTD assessment collection rate is 95.9%. This is .5% behind the 2016 comparable rate.

Assessments not paid before 2/1/2017 have incurred a late charge and interest is accruing.

Pet Hotline News

- Make sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were microchipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- If you are going out of town and have a pet sitter, let Marie know your pets name, what it looks like (a picture is also great), and a contact number.
- And if you are thinking about owning a pet Ask yourself IF:
 - You have time to get its shots and check for heartworms
 - You have time to get a collar with ID and a phone number on the tag
 - You have time to walk it on a leash and PICK UP THE POOP.
 - You have the money, time and commitment to care for a pet.

IF you answer NO to any of these questions, maybe you should NOT get a pet.



Have you recently taken a look at the outside of your home from the viewpoint of a visitor to Deerfield or a prospective home buyer? For example,

- Is your grass mowed and edged regularly? Are flower and plant beds, tree wells, and expansion joints free of weeds? Are trees and shrubs trimmed?
- Does your home have mildew on the brick or siding?
 Is there rotten wood or fencing that needs replacing?
 Is there painting that needs to be done?

Keeping the exterior of your home in a neat and attractive condition is a requirement of the Deerfield Protective Covenants; it also makes sure Deerfield remains a desirable place to live.

Please remember that any and ALL exterior improvements, modifications and major repairs require submission and approval of an Architectural Application prior to beginning the work. Failure to do so could result in having to remove and return the exterior of your home to the original condition at the homeowner's expense. The Architectural Application form is available on our website (www.deerfieldvillageonline.com) under the Documents section. You may also call the office to have the form emailed to you, or stop by the office and pick one up.
