

# ANTS IN YOU PLANTS By Landscape Committee

Recent rains have produced a lot of fire ant mounds. Fire ants are difficult to control because they mate year-around. Rainwater will float a mated pair from the mound. The female queen starts a new mound. The queen can produce up to 1,000 eggs per day! Old time remedies include pouring boiling water or cow urine on the mounds. A more effective way to treat the mounds is to use one of the ant baits on the market, which are made of defatted corn grits, soybean oil, and poison at a lower level than other insecticides, making them less toxic to wildlife, pets, and people. The bait should be applied when the ground and grass are dry and there is no rain expected for at least 24 hours. Treat the mounds in the early morning or late evening, their usual feeding times. Any uneaten bait will eventually degrade into the soil. Since mounds can have more than one queen, more than one treatment may be necessary to eliminate the mound. The DVCA landscape maintenance contractor is responsible for treating ant mounds on the common areas. Members of the Landscape Committee continually survey these areas and have given the contractor a list of mound locations for treatment. We will have an ongoing program of ant control. It is a big job and we invite you to join the Committee and help in the effort.




## Following is a partial summarization of many restrictions. (Not inclusive; see Protective Covenants for all restrictions).
