President's Report

I promised to keep you up to date regarding the greenbelt ditch situation. Here it is. A representative of the Flood Control Division attended the MUD's June meeting. The MUD Board and I were shocked to discover that the drainage channel easement is 150' wide. That means that the walkways and lights on either side of the easement are on the Flood Control Divisions easement. Not to worry though, Deerfield and the Flood Control Division have an agreement in place allowing Deerfield to place such things. The reason that the easement width is of importance is that the catch basins and conduits that drain water from one level of the channel to the bottom belong to the Flood Control Division. Those drainage systems need work. Because of this, cleaning of the ditch has supposedly been held up to do engineering on the drainage systems. The MUD Board and I employed the representative to have the ditch cleaned now and deal with the drainage system later. The representative agreed to look into that possibility. We are eagerly waiting a response.

I want to thank the MUD Board for their support in getting the ditch cleaned.

Last month, I encouraged you to enjoy the wild flowers in the ditch. Boy, was that a mistake. No sooner did the News Letter go to press, than the Flood Control Division mowed the wild flowers down. Wouldn't you know it? Well, the flowers weren't all that great this year anyway.

Although the wild flowers proved to be a bust, I encourage you to enjoy the new planting in front of the fence that hides the air conditioners and trash bins at the recreation center. It is great. What an improvement and a wonderful greeting to those who approach the building. Thank you Landscape Committee.

Speaking of the Landscape Committee, you just have to thank Jay Singleton for his role in shepherding the trimming of the trees along the whole green belt. He was out there early in the morning when I walked the dogs and still out there that evening when I took the dogs for their evening stroll. It was sunny and hot that day and Jay looked really well done by the time I saw him that evening. What dedication. Thanks Jay.

The Post Office must really be impressed with the new planting at the recreation center. One day when I was leaving the office, I noticed an official looking person in the parking lot by the post box. When I found out she was with the Post Office, I pointed out the new planting and jokingly told her that the planting really made the old beat-up post box look even worse. I suggested that the planting and a new box would compliment each other. Well what do you know, a new, spiffy post box showed up a couple of day later.

I told that story to Susan Vargas in the patio homes. She and a neighbor had power washed the concrete path leading to the centralized mail boxes in their cul -de -sac and cleaned the boxes. Thank you Susan for taking pride and doing your part to keep Deerfield looking good.

The Deeds Committee would like to say "Thank You" to all of you who have received violation letters and fixed the violation in a timely manner. We would also like to remind everyone to keep in mind that we still have many issues in the neighborhood that we are actively trying to get resolved and have now turned over several issues to the Deerfield Village Lawyer. We regret that we have had to start to involve our lawyer because some residents do not feel like the Protective Covenants pertain to them. We obviously would prefer not to get a lawyer involved but have gotten to a point that we have no other options.

With the neighborhood aging we are seeing more violations but many violations are easy and cost free to fix. The biggest violation we are seeing right now is **GARBAGE CANS, TRASH DEBRIS, MULCH BAGS, AND MISC. ITEMS** being stored in sight of the street or out several days before pickup. All items **MUST** be stored out of view until the evening before trash pickup or stored behind a fence or in the garage. It costs you nothing to move your items behind the gate or in the garage but it does cost all homeowners money when we have to start sending letters to get the problem fixed! Another violation that can be fixed easily is minor mold on brick or siding. A spray bottle with a mixture of water and clorox can sometimes clear that problem up quickly. Remember you need architectural approval to do any outside work...roofs, fences, additions, pools...

The Deeds Committee's goal is to help insure that our neighborhood stays attractive and a desirable place to live. Please help us by keeping your property maintained. If you need a copy of the Protective Covenants or an Architectural Approval form visit the website: www.deerfieldvillage.net.

Swimming Pool Committee

The use of ID's has helped reduce non-resident use. If you still need an ID please check with the office. Remember, you must be current on your Homeowner's Association dues to use the pool. Cards are being checked.

One of the questions we have been asked is how many guests can a resident bring to the pool?. Deerfield residents with a pool ID card who are under 18 can have 4 guests. Residents 18 and older can have up to 8 guests. If there are more than 8 guests, it constitutes a party and may require an additional guard. A guest is a non-resident, or a family member who is not residing in Deerfield. At no time can a Deerfield resident be a guest of another Deerfield resident.

Timely Tip for July Gardeners Summertime Watering

If you have lived through a summer in Texas, then you know how valuable water is to our landscapes. It is our responsibility to conserve water yet keep our gardens thriving through the heat. If you own a sprinkler system, each zone should be programmed differently depending on the needs and you should always operate it manually.



Established lawns should be watered once every five to seven days, applying about one inch of water. This soaking encourages deeper rooting which leads to stronger, healthier plants.

Shrubs and flowerbeds may require more watering depending on the age of the plant material. A good test is to dig down 4 to 6 inches and feel the soil. If the soil is dry, a good deep watering is in order. Plants in full sun will require more moisture as well as those growing in containers. Please remember, any newly planted tree or shrub requires hand watering for that first year.

The best time of day to water is early morning before the temperatures begin to rise. Also, early mornings tends to be a time of lower winds and thus reduced evaporation.

Mulching is an excellent way to retain moisture. It will also insulate the soil surface from the direct rays of the sun and prevent weeds from germinating. Apply a two to three inch layer of mulch to all beds and plantings.
