## “SWIM POOL ID TAGS – SWIM SEASON IS HERE!”

If you are a newcomer homeowner or resident in Deerfield Village, please contact the DVCA Office at 281-463-2624 or send an email to deerfield4@sbcglobal.net to set up an appointment to have your photo made and to obtain information for issuance of your 2013 Swim Pool Tag. Residents that are NOT “homeowners” are required to obtain a letter annually



from the homeowner relinquishing the homeowner’s rights to the DFV Recreational Facilities naming the resident (tenant) that has their permission to be allowed use the DFV facilities on their behalf. All assessments must be current, paid in full with no balance due or owed on the property account, in order to obtain a pool tag.”

## STAY SAFE THIS SUMMER WITH THESE TIPS!

Around the Rec Center Pool and Playground: Always supervise children while they are around the pool and the playground. It only takes one mis-step to cause an injury. Please do not allow children to collect or play with the rocks in the flower beds surrounding the pool area; and, assist us by NOT removing the flagstones that have been placed as a walkway behind the pool building, adjacent to the playground area. A flagstone that has been moved from its proper location could cause loss of balance and result in a possible fall.

Getting Ready for Fun Family BBQ’s: It’s very important to be safe at home when firing up your grills this summer. The gas, or propane, in gas grills is highly flammable. Never use a grill indoors! Place the grill at least 10 feet away from your home, or any building. The grill should not be used in your garage, breezeway, porch, or under any roof/surface that can catch fire. Charcoal produces carbon monoxide fumes, do not use indoors, in vehicles, tents or RV’s. Make sure all charcoal is completely extinguished and remove all freshly used coals before storing the grill in any indoor area.

## Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

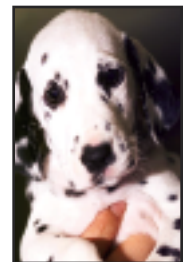

# Important information for Residents with new pets and New Residents with pets!!!

A very important thing you as a responsible pet owner can do is to have a collar with ID tags on your pet. A rabies tag is great for ID but if your pet gets lost on the weekend no one who finds the pet can get it back to you until the vet office opens on Monday. The finder may not be able to keep your pet over the weekend. It is essential to have another tag or tags on your pet with YOUR PHONE NUMBER on it.

You can be contacted any day of the week. I will be happy to call that number and let you know that your pet has been found and if necessary bring it to you.

For all new Deerfield residents, I now have a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. When a pet is in a new location it will not know how to find his new home if it gets out. The Pet Hotline tag will have my home and cell #. I will keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and your phone contact numbers. Chipping is also a good idea, but be sure to change the info on it if need be.

## Mosquitoes Beware!!!

### Spraying Schedule For Mosquitoes

Basic spraying of the subdivision, will be once a week, between Thursday and Sunday. starting after 9:00 PM, ending before 6:00 AM, weather permitting. Spraying will end the first weekend of November.

Larvicide treatment of the storm drains on a monthly basis April - October, weather permitting.

Green Belt fogging as needed April - October, weather permitting.

Chemicals used are free of carcinogenics and safe to be used around pets and children. However, don't let children run behind the spray trucks breathing the fumes, that would not be good for anyone.

Expenditures: Under budget is do to some utilities bills processed after closing date and monthly budget forecasting. At this point there is no indication of an expense issue.

Assessments: We have collected \$620,093(93.38%) of the 2013 assessments. We are 1.45% behind last years collection rate. This is an improvement over February's collection rate.

## MUD 136 Board Report...

---

At the April meeting, the Board reviewed the District's operations during the previous month. District Operator, Municipal Operations & Consulting (MOC), reported previous month's water usage of 9.2 million gallons. Preventative maintenance on the sanitary sewer system continues with the Phase 3 sewer repair program. No water leaks were reported or repaired. MOC operations completed routine bacteriological sampling and all results were good.

Our fiscal year ended March 31. The District has engaged McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot, CPA to audit the prior fiscal year. The audit includes evaluation of the accounting policies and reasonableness of estimates by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. The audit will review the District's financial statements for reasonable assurance they are free of misstatements, from errors, fraudulent reporting, misappropriation of assets, or violations of applicable laws or government regulations. 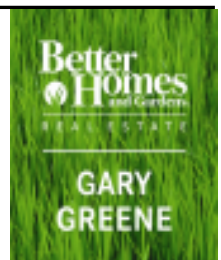
