Please call me for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. If your pet gets lost and has the tag the finder can call me and I will call you and arrange to return your pet. Tags from another city or state make it hard to get your pet back as quickly asap. The Pet Hotline tag has my home and cell #. I keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep your pet several days.

# "ATTENTION!!! ALL PET OWNERS

Keep your dog safe by making sure the gates are locked during garbage day pick-up. Pets will bark and jump at the gate, and if it is not latched properly, they will get out. Tuesdays and Fridays are the days I get the most calls for missing pets!"

# Mud 136 Report...

At its November meeting, the Board reviewed the District's operations during the previous month. In October, the District delivered 14,100,000 gallons of water, a 35% reduction from September. Since the current usage is closer to normal for this time of year, we have lifted the watering restrictions and removed the alert signs. However, the need for water conservation has not gone away. Texas has experienced drought to a greater or less degree for 8 of the last 10 years and the annual pattern of lower than normal rainfall in Texas is expected to last for the rest of this decade. For information about this forecast, log on to www.whcrwa.com/index.html. There you will find a slide presentation by the meteorologist for the Harris County Flood Control District given at a town hall meeting. It explains how concerning the outlook is. A great start toward being prepared for any future water shortage is to make a New Year's resolution to conserve more water. The website HYPERLINK "http://www.wateruseitwisely.com" www.wateruseitwisely.com offers manly useful tips for doing this.

The West Harris County Regional Water Authority (WHCRWA), which provides us the water we use, has announced that, for 2014, the fee that they charge to the District for water will remain unchanged from their present rate. The WHCRWA charge appears as a separate item on the right side of your bill.
