Greetings Neighbor,

Exciting news, Deerfield will have its own Electronic Messaging Board installed in the Recreation Center Marquee, which was in very poor shape and outdated. The Message Board will be available to communicate valuable community information, and also be available to members rent-

ing the facilities around mid-November.

Due to the holiday, we have rescheduled the November Board meeting from November 24th to November 17th, at 7PM in the Clubhouse. The December 22nd Board meeting is cancelled.

It was time to replace the Recreation Center roofing, which was completed by Craddock Roofing in October. The job was completed in 3 days, which kept the rental and usage of these facilities to a minimum and they came in budget. I can't say enough, job well done.

DVCA budgets were presented and approved by the Board at the Budget meeting on October 15th. A small increase to the yearly Assessment was needed to keep the budget in check, and were set at \$630 per household and \$710 for Patio homes. This is the first increase in 3 years, and we all know costs of utilities have gone up. Your family should

have received notice by Oct. 30th. It is due before January 1st, 2015, so please don't wait or put it off until late January. They are subject to a late fee after January 31st.

As we approach the holidays, crime increases and everyone needs to be extra cautious and alert. Be sure to keep lights on at night, and arm those alarms when you are away. Dogs are also great deterrents. If there is a crime in progress or it is an emergency, call 911 right away. For all non-emergencies or suspicious activity call S.E.A.L. Security at (832) 408-0200, which is a dedicated hotline for Deerfield residents only. Please make sure your alarm company also has the information to SEAL, as they will likely respond first.

We are still looking for volunteers, so pick a committee you would like to serve on and please sign up. Donating 1 hour a month can make a huge difference. Keep in mind that Board elections will be here sooner than you think, so if you are interested in running, please send your application to the Deerfield office in person or by email deerfield4@sbcglobal.net. Applications will be in the December and January Newsletter, and also posted online under DVCA forms. The deadline for receiving an application is January 10th, 2015, as it must be posted in the newsletter & website.

I hope everyone had a great Halloween, and I wish you and your family a great Thanksgiving!

Residential Trash Reminders...

Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Texas Trash Service 281-888-3688 Hours of Operation 7am-7pm Office hours 7am-4pm. Pick-up

days are Tuesday and Friday. **Please** do not put your trash out until Monday evening or Thursday evening.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Pet Hotline...

Along with a Rabies tag for ID, the most important is a tag with owner's phone #...since vets are closed on Sat. afternoon and all day Sundays. A tag with a cell # is the best because the cell phone is usually with the owner when he is not home..

Tips That Help

- On windy days put any paper or light weight items that might blow away in a trash bag (clear, white or blue – no black please) just set next to bin
- No need to separate items everything can go in the bin together
- Please leave lids off plastic containers (helps them compress better in the truck) the lid can still go in the
- Please breakdown any larger size cardboard boxes and just set it under or beside the bin
- Please rinse out all containers the residue from product can contaminate the load
- All plastics that are recyclable will have a triangle on the bottom with a number in the middle we take #1 - #7 (only exception is Styrofoam)
- Excess items can be put in a trash bag (clear, white or blue no black please) or in any type container just mark them as "recycling"
- We can send Recycling Emblem Stickers to you if you have larger containers (even trash cans) you want to make into a recycling container
- Trash and recycling pickup on the same day? it really helps if trash is on one side of the driveway and recycling on the other side of the driveway
- So Sorry but we don't take any type of Styrofoam products (peanuts, blocks, sheets, etc)

Mud 136 Report...

At its October meeting, the Board reviewed the District's water and sewer operations during the previous month, as well as the garbage and recycling operations. The results of the first three months of the At Your Door recycling program are in and they are impressive. Over 2000 lbs of electronics and hazardous materials were picked up. The weekly recycling program has also done very well. Through August, over 251,000 lbs paper, cardboard, plastic and metal containers have been recycled. Each program has its own set of rules, which can be found in previous editions of the newsletter on DVCA's website. They have also been posted on the District's website:www.hcmud136.org.

Preliminary numbers from the Harris County Appraisal District indicate that the assessed value of Deerfield homes has risen, on average, a little over 9%. To mitigate the effect of this on your property taxes, the Directors voted to reduce the tax rate by 9%. The tax rate for

2015 will be 19.6 cents per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation. Tax bills will be mailed out soon.

Sink holes are a never ending problem around Deerfield. The question is who is responsible for repairing them. The answer is "It depends on the location". If a hole appears at the north end of the greenbelt along the pipeline easement, West Harris County Regional Water Authority repairs it. If it appears anywhere else on in the common areas, DVCA repairs it. Holes in the ditch are repaired by the Harris County Flood Control District. If the hole is caused by a broken storm drain, Harris County repairs it, unless it is in the Patio Homes. In that case MUD 136 repairs it. The simple answer is to report a sink hole to the DVCA office manager. We will work with her to figure out the responsible party.

If you have questions or comments about any District business, plan to attend the next District meeting, which will be held on Thursday, Nov. 13, at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.

Please call me for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. If your pet gets lost and has the tag the finder can call me and I will call you and arrange to return your pet. Tags from another city or state make it hard to get your pet back as quickly asap. The Pet Hotline tag has my home and cell #. I keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep your pet several days.


