

For large and hazardous items, special arrangements must be made. Please see the DVCA website www.deerfieldvillageonline.com for complete recycling rules.

### **Residential Trash Reminders**

Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Waste Corporation of America: **281-368-8397**. Hours of operation are 7 am to 7 pm, office hours are 7 am to 4 pm. **Pick-up days are Tuesday and Friday. Heavy trash day is Friday, limit 1 heavy item per service day per household.** Please do not put your trash out until Monday or Thursday evening.

## Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

## MUD 136 Report

At its July meeting, the Board reviewed the District's water and sewer operations during the month of June. The Board received the formal audit for the previous fiscal year that runs from April 1, 2015 through March 31, 2016. The audit found all of the District's operations and financial transactions to be in order. Eventually the audit will be posted on the District's website. However, for the next few weeks, the website will be down for reconstruction.

Our recycling program does not include electronics, nor does it include document shredding. Therefore, we are having a special event to cover these. It will be held in the Rec Center parking lot from 10am until 2pm on September 10, rain or shine. Details can be found elsewhere in the newsletter. Signs will be posted around Deerfield a few days before the event.

In the Winter months the District provides, on average, 8 million gallons of water per month. The summer average is close to 25 million gallons. That additional 17 million gallons per month of consumption goes mainly for watering residential landscape. If all of that watering were to be done between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm, over 8.5 million gallons will be lost to evaporation. That is why one of the most important steps in water conservation is to water in the early morning or late evening. Even though we are not currently experiencing the extreme drought conditions of 2011, historically Texas has experienced some level of drought in eight of the past twelve years. Since dry climate will continue to be a problem for us, the need for water conservation will also continue. Please be water wise. Tips on how to do this can be found on the Texas A&M website (www.aggie-horticulture.tamu.edu). The WHCRWA website (www.whcrwa.com) also has valuable information.

If you have questions or comments about any of the District business, plan to attend the next District meeting, which will be held on Thursday, August 11, at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.

#### TRASH CANS

If you have noticed a trash can missing along the greenbelts or common areas, please contact Tina Mion at the recreation center office regarding a replacement. There are trash cans available and she will arrange to provide one for you to pick up and place in the location you have identified as needing a new one.

#### ANTS

While the rain has created many issues that none of us wish to deal with such as damage to some of our homes and vehicles it has been a boon for the grass and most of the plantings. So sorry to those who did experience damage. The rain impacted the effectiveness of the ant treatment that was done in May on our greenbelts and commons. We have a one-year warranty with the company that did the treatment so they are scheduling follow up applications as needed. An additional treatment was done July 14, 2016. Small marker flags will be provided thru the office for you to mark any new beds that you see. This will provide assistance in effectively treating the source of active ants. Please advise the office if you see two or more flags in the common areas so treatment can be done.

#### SIDEWALKS

Some of our residents have commented and questioned the orange markings on sidewalks around the neighborhood. Work to repair the areas marked should be complete by the end of July. The sidewalk at Cadbury Dr and Timsbury Dr is included in the repairs.

## **Deeds Committee**

It is summer time once again and the Deeds Committee is seeing an increase in the number of Deed Restriction violations. Some of the things we look on our monthly inspections are:

#### All lots shall be kept at all times in a sanitary, healthful, safe, and attractive condition. This means:

Maintain yards **weekly**. Yards and sidewalks must be mowed, edged, remove weeds from the plant beds and tree wells, all clippings must be collected and placed out for trash pick-up no earlier than the night before collection day. Shrubs and trees needed to be trimmed and kept in an attractive manner. Slow, even watering is essential to keep a healthy looking landscape.

Please remove all dead tree stumps from the front yards.

Gutters must also be kept clean and clear of debris, weeds and other growth that occurs from leaves, pine needles and twigs.

Driveways, front entrances, the sides of houses must be kept clear of items and debris of any kind.

ALL trash cans and recycle bins must be stored out of public view.

If you have mold on your brick or siding, please power wash to help keep homes neat and attractive.

Summer is a good time to make those home repairs that are needed such as replacing rotten wood, siding, fences, gates, and securing backyard pools.

\*\*\*Remember, if you are making **ANY type of exterior modification**, you are required by our Protective Covenants to submit an Application for Architectural Approval and obtain approval prior to beginning any the project. This can be found at www. deerfieldvillageonline.com, click on Documents and then Application for Architectural Approval. (This is also where you find the Deed Restrictions for your section.)\*\*\*

Tags from another city or state make it hard to get your pet back as quickly asap. The Pet Hotline tag has my home and cell #. I keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep your pet several days.
