President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

Please note the May Board meeting has been moved from Monday, May 27th (Memorial Day) to Tuesday, May 28th at 7PM. Speaking of Memorial Day on May 27th, come join us at the pool with the family for games and fun.

The Pool is open on weekends in May, but please be sure and check the pool schedule on the website, as we have 2 Saturday mornings in May that our swim team is using the pool for meets. The pool schedule is on our website and in this newsletter.

Community Services has begun spraying for mosquitoes and will continue until October 2019. A reminder that spraying will happen after 10PM, usually on Thursdays.

I want to thank those that attended the Annual Meeting of the Members, and the Annual Board Meeting. I started out with a big thank you to all the volunteers that donate their time to our community. This included the Men's Group, which we are very fortunate to have. Additionally, I thanked Louis Carpenter and Geri Hudson for their service on the Board, they will be missed.

I reported that the health of the Association continues to be strong, and we made many improvements in 2018 that the committees shared with the audience, including great plans for 2019. Here are some important highlights: A) Strategically, the Board will continue to focus on policies guidelines, and better processes. Additionally, we are going to develop a training program for Committees to make sure they are knowledgeable of the policies and procedures, and create a healthy/friendly environment for all. B) We continue to support our SEAL patrol, which has been well received by all. C) In 2019 the County will begin a project on Windsong Trail by rebuilding the road in concreate and install underground storm drains. The MUD #136 and DVCA Directors have requested a town hall, to better understand traffic management during the construction, and so we can provide feedback. The safety of our residents is of the upmost importance. Please look for a invitation to this town hall soon. D) We published the much requested 2019 Directory this year, thanks to the

help of many people, including Steve Gunzelman and Tina Mion. E) I announced that the Board will be delivering a ruling on moving forward with SAYOR/Open swim, to give residents more time at the pool, under certain guidelines. This is a practice at other HOA's, but as usual our situation has its challenges, as we don't have a dedicated lap/ exercise pool, like newer communities have. This will be a pilot program, using the buddy system. Since then the pilot was approved, and a team of equal Board and Swim Pool members will determine how the program will be implemented. F) We have made and will continue to make changes to the Website to give you a better way to locate information, with an emphasis on Deeds rules, how to guides, and application requests to make an improvement to your property. G) We continue to make progress with our 5-person Fence Committee, which has been looking at affordable ways to provide the residents of Deerfield a perimeter fence. More information on a recommendation by this Committee to the Board will come this year. I expect this will be controversial as in past years, but I hope all will come with an open mind. H) We now have guest WiFi for renters at the clubhouse, or organizations that meet with residents. See office for more details.

middle of the page. You can then click the "request form"
and complete the requested information and submit.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

Swimming Pool Committee

The pool season kicks off this month! Those of us on the Swim Pool Committee are just as excited as you are that this time of year has arrived. You will see the Pool Hours in the newsletter.

As many of you know, there was much discussion the last couple of months about the first hour of opening. Historically, that has been an hour devoted to lap swimmers and waterwalkers. Many in the neighborhood have requested access at that hour for open swim. We heard you! In March and April, the SPC proposed a splitting of the pool for the first hour to allow both waterwalkers/lap swimmers and other swimmers access at the same desired hour. That proposal did not pass, so it will not go in to effect for weekends in May. However, if you are interested in further discussion or have ideas regarding this for June/July/August, please attend our committee meeting and/or the Board meeting in May to have your voice be heard.

As always to access the pool, you must have proper valid pool IDs and sign in. If you do not have an ID, please contact Tina in the office to obtain.

Security Committee

At the Deerfield Village Annual Meeting it was reported that we have had another quiet year from a security standpoint. There were about 750 calls to SEAL in the last year and around a third of those came from you, our residents, reporting suspicious activity. Your vigilance in reporting this is a significant contribution to the few security incidents we have in DV. Please keep it up!

We continue to have reports of cars driving too fast, especially on our main crossroads. Some of this is due to people cutting through DV, but a lot of our residents are doing this as well. Please drive safely!

And there still are a lot of parking violations occurring on our streets. The parking rules that apply to all of us have been published in a couple of the last few newsletters. Please park legally!

We are expecting that the Sheriff will be giving Deerfield some extra attention soon (and periodically thereafter) to help address the issues above. Please be careful so you don't end up with a ticket, tow or fine.

The Security Committee meets on the first Tuesday of the month. Our next meetings will be at 7PM on May 7th and June 4th. Please join us and become involved.

Financial Services Committee

Favorable budget variance is caused by the timing of budget vs when the expense is incurred.

AT the end of the 1st quarter there does not appear to be any major expenses issues. The YTD assessment collection rate is 94.2%. The collection rate is the same as the comparable 2018 rate.

Residents who had unpaid assessments and late fees at the end of February were sent a Certified letter, which is required by law in order for the HOA to protect their interest. If the amount is not paid or a payment plan is not executed by June 1, 2019 a lien will placed on the property. By state law only an attorney can file the lien at a total cost of around \$242.00 which will be added to the outstanding balance. The DVCA is not interested in being in the collection business or adding to the amount owned so please resolve the unpaid balance.

Recreation Committee

April was a fun month with the Garage Sale (96 participants), Music on the Green the night of the Garage Sale, the Easter Egg Hunt, the Deerfield Social, and other ongoing activities. May is going to be very busy too – on May 4th we have the outdoor Star Wars movie. (Consider coming in costume in keeping with the theme of Star Wars. Prizes awarded for the best costume.) On the 18th is our next Music on the Green with the very popular CC Rider band. And on Memorial Day we have the Pool Party.

In tweaking our event schedule, we have moved the Music on the Green out of the summer months to cooler months. At the same time the Youth Events Subcommittee is adding events during the summer for the youth. We can't move the 4th of July Pool party of course. We are also looking at a new event in early August; with a Dog Parade for residents and their dogs. See the calendar in next month's newsletter for event timing.

We continue to review events to enhance them. The Recreation Committee meeting is trying one more time to see if we have interest in evening meetings. The next one will be held on Sunday, May 5th at 7PM. In addition, there are sub-groups meetings which specialize on some of the events – for instance we have a subgroup for socials, and another for youth events (YES – meeting at 7PM on May 7.) All residents are welcome to attend any meeting.

MUD 136 Report

At its April meeting the directors reviewed the results of March's business including the report from the District's tax assessor/collector, which shows that 98.2% of property taxes due have been collected. We thank all of you who paid your taxes promptly, and for those few of you who have not, a warning that, as of July 1, a 20% penalty is assessed in addition to the monthly interest charge. Your taxes go toward the District's maintenance and operation. MUD 136 serves 1059 single family residences in Deerfield Village. It also provides, under commercial contracts, water and/or sewer services to Wilson Elementary, Randall's, Chevron, Walgreens, Pine Forest Country Club, Deerfield Park, Clay's Restaurant, and Stacey Plaza. The District is managed by a board of five directors. Administrative and operational functions are contracted to outside consultants and contractors. Those functions include bookkeeping, engineering, legal counsel, tax assessor/collector, and facility operator.

Again, this year, in October (actual date yet to be determined), we will conduct a paper shredding and electronics recycling event. In the meantime, there are some options in our area for shredding. The Office Depot store at Hwy 6 & FM 529 will shred 5 lbs free. Vanish Document Shredding Co shreds at no charge. See www.vanishdocuments.com for days and times. West Houston Document Destruction, 21811 Katy Fwy at Mason sheds onsite on Saturdays. Electronics can be recycled at CompuCycle, 8019 Kempwood Dr. See www.compucycle.com for details.

We do not have a program for recycling household chemicals and hazardous materials. Those can be taken to the Harris Co. recycling center at 6900 Hahl Road (near 290 & Gessner), every Wednesday and on the second Saturday of each month. See www.hchhw. org for a list of the items that are accepted. For some further ideas about how to do your part and recycling other items around the house log on to https://www.tceq. texas.gov/publications/gi/gi-288.html.

If you have questions about any aspect of the District's operations, you can ask them during the resident comment period at the beginning of our monthly meeting. The next meeting will be held on May 9th, beginning at 6:00 PM at the rec center. The meeting agenda will be posted at the rec center bulletin board several days before the meeting.

Landscape Committee

It's spring again and everything is beginning to look beautiful. Thanks to Mother Nature, the rain has been a great help in giving all our new plants a good start.

Our landscape contractor completed our spring planting and also replaced shrubs that had died during the past year. Needless to say, when you live in a subdivision that is almost 50 years old, there's always something to fix or freshen up.

The Thursday Morning Men's Groups has done it again. They did work at the playgrounds, turned the mulch at the Vanbury Playground and made repairs to the back seat of the red jeep at the Recreation Center Playground. And if that wasn't enough, they have been diligently working on the exercise equipment along the walking trail. Additionally, they installed more "poop" bags receptacles along the walking trail. Thank you, thank you, guys.

For all the homeowners that have homes next to a green space--if you have contractors doing work at your home, please ask them to not drive on our green space. We have had sprinkler heads damaged and ruts in our green space that require money out of the Homeowners Association to repair.

For bicycle riders and walkers, please stay on the sidewalk or street. Incidents have been reported of bicycle riders running into sink holes. There's a lot of uneven terrain in our subdivision, so for your safety, stay on the sidewalk designated for walkers and bicycle riders.

Another reminder, please don't blow grass clippings down the storm drains. Storm drains are designated to route rain runoff into large pipes that lead directly to major ditches, bayous and other waterways, which ultimately empty into Galveston Bay. There is no treatment or filtering of this water between your yard and the bay . Lawn clippings, leaves and other debris often clump, contributing to flooding in the neighborhood and also create a perfect place for mosquitos to breed. It is the responsibility of the homeowner to share this information with their yard crew.

Our committee meets the second Monday of every month in the second floor of our activity center. Our next meeting is scheduled for May 13.



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Tennis Committee

The project to replace 3 old lighting poles on Courts 3 and 4 was completed in April. It was decided to close the two courts until the work was finished which took about 2 weeks. The power to the court lights was turned off, the old poles were taken down and new anchor bolts were set in the existing concrete foundations before installation of the new poles. The existing light fixtures were reinstalled on the new poles with new wiring and light bulbs.

The Tennis Committee would like to thank the resident tennis players for their understanding and cooperation during this project which had to be undertaken as one of the poles was partially rusted through and becoming a safety issue.

The work was done by Classic Sports of Spring who have worked on various projects at the Deerfield Tennis Courts for many years.

The Tennis Committee meets on the first Wednesday of every month at 8:00 pm. Our next two meeting dates are May 1st, and June 5th.

Pickleball Now in Deerfield Village!

Just a reminder that we have two great pickleball courts co-existing with DFV tennis court #4. 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

Thanks to the many of you who have been working on fixing up your homes and cleaning up your yards. It's looking good! For those who have not done this, please get started, as we'd rather not have to send you a letter.

While we appreciate all the improvements being done, we are noticing a lot of projects on the house that have not had an Architectural Approval (AA) completed. In most cases the work being done is fine and the AA would have been approved very quickly (typically in less than a week and often only a few days). But there are cases where what has been done does not meet our Protective Covenants and the homeowner gets the unfortunate opportunity to fix what they have done and incur the additional cost to do so. It is to your advantage to follow the AA process to ensure you do not have the risk of additional cost and frustration. Please follow the AA process and protect yourself!

Lawns and weeds are starting to grow quickly, and regular mowing, edging and weeding is now required. Please keep up with your lawns!


