President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

School is out for the summer and the pool is open every day from 11AM to 9PM, so come cool off and hang out with neighbors. Be sure to check the pool schedule on our website for pool hours, as we have some remaining Swim Team activity in June. If you're new to Deerfield, you will need a pool tag to get in. Please see Tina in at the Recreation Center Office during office hours to obtain a tag or schedule a time with her after hours.

We are still working on details for the SAYOR pool program, which will allow those enrolled to swim from 6AM to pool close, during guarded and unguarded times. We are hoping this pilot program will begin before the end of June, and still needs final Board approval, based on the recommendation of the SAYOR Committee.

Mosquitoes are also out for the summer, so Community Services has begun spraying for mosquitoes and will continue until October 2019. A reminder that spraying will happen after 10PM, usually on Thursdays.

Windsong Trail Road project update – As you know, I have been in touch with the County to schedule a town hall with all effected parties to get us more information on the schedule and traffic control. As of 5/27/2019, the project is on hold until further notice. Based on all the work the flood

control still needs to complete on the Clay Road drainage and reservoir, it will be delayed for some time, likely several years (my opinion). The project is not dead, just postponed. That being said, the county has committed to help improve the drainage ditch in the short term, to elevate any issues caused by erosion. I will post here more information, as that plan is communicated to the DVCA.

If you're interested in helping your community, we are always in need of volunteers, and there are several committees your help can make an impact. The next Board meeting is on 6/24, and all residents are invited to attend.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

Community Service Committee

This is a busy time for the Community Services Committee. Over the past weeks, we have been corresponding with our friends at the US Postal Service regarding repair/replacement of some Cluster Box Units in the Patio Homes section. We hope to have those units replaced in June. We are getting quotes from contractors on exterior repairs to the Rec Center buildings and have been shopping for some new furniture for the clubhouse.

Security Committee

PARKING LAWS IN DEERFIELD VILLAGE

Listed below are the parking laws that apply for Deerfield Village. If not followed, law enforcement (HCSO) can ticket you. Please abide by them.

You are not allowed to park or stand your vehicle:

- In front of a public or private driveway
- Within 30 feet of a stop sign, yield sign or other traffic signal
- Within 20 feet of a crosswalk or intersection
- Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant
- If your vehicle obstructs another's driveway
- In a driveway if the vehicle extends into the street
- Double parked on the road side of another legally parked vehicle

Parallel parking is required on the streets of Deerfield Village. This means you must:

- Park WITH the direction of the traffic
- With both right-hand wheels parallel to and within 18 inches from the right hand curb

Straight in or angled parking in the cul-de-sacs is not allowed

You are not allowed to park on the street for over 72 hours on the street. If you do:

- A violation sticker may be placed on your vehicle
- Your vehicle may be towed at your expense for the tow and storage

Commercial Vehicles and Trailers are not allowed to be parked for long periods during the day or overnight.

Your neighbors have the right to call HCSO if they see these not being followed. Please don't give them reason to do so.

These are for all of our safety. Children can be hit and killed by a car driving 25 miles per hour because the parked cars have blocked off the line of sight for the driver. Emergency equipment may not be able to get to the houses they need to get to, and lives and property could be lost.

Please be a courteous and considerate neighbor. Be safety conscious for both yourself and your neighbors.

Financial Services Committee

Meetings are the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 7:00pm to review the financial status of our community. The next meeting will be **JUNE 18, 2019**

Financial status as of April 30, 2018

YTD Expenses \$209,627 Ann.Op. Budget \$739,687 YTD Budget \$248,618 Ann.Res. Budget \$66,701

Under/ (Over)/budget \$ 38,991

Favorable budget variance is caused by the timing of budget vs when the expense is incurred.

There does not appear to be any major expenses issues. The YTD assessment collection rate is 95.4%. The collection rate is .4% below the comparable 2018 rate.

Residents who had unpaid assessments and late fees at the end of February were sent a Certified letter, which is required by law in order for the HOA to protect their interest. If the amount is not paid or a payment plan is not executed by June 1, 2019 a lien will placed on the property. By state law only an attorney can file the lien at a total cost of around \$242.00 which will be added to the outstanding balance. The DVCA is not interested in being in the collection business or adding to the amount owned so please resolve the unpaid balance.

Recreation Committee

May was great with the outdoors Star Wars movie, Music on the Green, and then the Memorial Day Pool Party. The Music on the Green had questionable weather, but once again the weather held and it was a pleasant evening. Because of concerns about weather, we are planning summer events carefully to minimize weather concerns. One example is the new event of the Patio Party on June 15th. It will be held on the patio at the Recreation Center, under the upstairs meeting room. Residents are invited to bring their lawn chairs and beverage of choice. We will have a DJ playing tunes, and the food offering will be pizza by the slice. There are no tickets required – just come and enjoy the evening. And to make it even better, the swimming pool will be open an extra hour, until 10:00PM. So, the whole family can swim, hear the music, and enjoy the evening.

Later in the summer we have the July 4th and Labor Day pool parties, and we will have a teen party on June 22nd. The Youth Events Sub-committee is looking at more kid events through the summer. We also are looking at an August Dog event, as well as the annual ice cream social.

We continue to review events to enhance them. The Recreation Committee meets on the first Friday of the month at about 9:45, at the end of coffee and donuts. All residents are welcome to join us in planning activities. In addition, there are sub-groups meetings which specialize on some of the events – for instance we have a subgroup for socials, and another for youth events (YES – meeting at 7PM on June 4.) All residents are welcome to attend any meeting.

MUD 136 Report

At its May meeting, the Board reviewed the District's operations. During the previous month, over 10.9 million gallons of water were provided to customers. 100% of the water came from the West Harris County Regional Water Authority (WHCRWA) who purchase treated water from the City of Houston. The City's treated water meets or exceeds all quality standards for potable water. WHCRWA monitors the quality of the water received at its Jersey Village distribution facility. Lastly, It is analyzed at our water plant. If further treatment is needed, it is done using our injection facilities. REMINDER: Since chloromines are used in water treatment, the water cannot be used in dialysis machines or fish tanks.

Annually we publish the Drinking Water Quality Report for our District. A link to the electronic version of the report will be posted in your June water bill. Also, the report will be posted on the District's website (www.hcmud136.org), as well as our Operator's website (www.municipalops.com/districts/2018ccr/HCMUD136.pdf). Please take the time to read it, as it contains very important information about the water we provide. The report confirms that "our drinking water meets or exceeds all federal drinking water requirements". Note: MUD 136 was in no way associated with the distribution of the Community Water Test flyer that was distributed in Deerfield last month.

If you have questions about water quality or any other District matter, plan to attend the next monthly meeting Thursday, June 20, 6pm in the Annex (upstairs room).

- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- If you are going out of town and have a pet sitter, let Marie know your pets name, what it looks like (a picture is also great), and a contact number.

Landscape Committee

All the spring rains that have showered the subdivision have turned everything a vivid green. Here are a few tips from the Take Care of Texas organization (TakeCareofTexas.org) to maintain your lawn.

Aerate your lawn once a year – it will improve your lawn's drainage and reduce soil compaction.

Irrigate efficiently-- water in the morning before 10 a.m and allow the soil to dry out between watering

Don't "scalp" your lawn—Mow one third of the height of the grass with each mowing.

Mow over leaves-- they will decompose along with the grass clippings.

Keep your mower blades sharp and clean--mow when grass is dry.

Don't over fertilize--it can weaken your turf.

Maintaining the playground area together with the equipment is the Landscape Committee's responsibility. One of the issues we grapple with is maintaining the sandbox located at the Vanbury playground. Cats often treat it as one big litter box. The Thursday Morning Men's Group together with a couple of residents have come up with a novel and hopefully permanent solution, place a cover over it that when opened converts into seats for the children. Landscape will pay for the materials and the TMG will be build the cover. Below is a picture of the proposed cover. Thanks to who made this suggestion and to Bob Mertz and the Men's group who will build and install it. To all people-- please close the cover when you are finished. All of us working together will keep the sand clean and our children safe. Additionally, the TMG added mulch to the Vanbury playground. Thanks to Vik Bath for coordinating this effort.

We have mentioned before the problem with water

pooling on some sidewalk areas. We are in the process of seeking bids for a contractor to raise sidewalks. these The areas include some patio home sidewalks. sidewalks around center and the sidewalk near the Vanbury playground.



Deeds Committee

Continued thanks to those of you who are fixing up your homes and keeping your yards looking good! For those who are not, letters are going out requesting that you do so. They start out as a friendly reminder and then if there is no response escalate from there. We actually don't like to send letters, so please keep your yard and house up so we don't have to.

Lawns and weeds are now growing quickly so we suggest weekly mowing, edging and weeding. This year we will be moving quicker to resolve yards that are not kept up. After a couple of reminders to the resident, we will be contracting a landscaper to do a "force mow and edge", and DVCA will charge the homeowner for the cost of the service. This is much more expensive than if you handle it yourself, so please keep your lawns maintained!

And now for our other regular reminder. If you are making exterior changes to your property - please follow the AA process and protect yourself! It is to your advantage to follow the AA process to ensure you do not have the risk of additional cost and frustration.

A question that often comes up is "why should I maintain my house when there are some houses in DV that look terrible and don't seem to ever be dealt with?" That is a fair question. We do have some problem houses that look terrible, but not because DVCA has not focused to get them fixed. Unfortunately there are situations that are outside of DVCA's ability to address due to State and Federal laws, military exemptions and other legal issues. Be assured that the DVCA Board is aware of all of these houses and is taking the legal actions allowed, and that those houses are highlighted for the Board on a list provided by Deeds each month

The next Deeds meetings will be on June 10th and July 8th in the Clubhouse at 7pm.

As mentioned in last month's newsletter, much discussion has happened regarding the first hour (typically 10am) splitting the pool for lap swimmers/water walkers and for open swim. At last month's Board meeting, once again this proposal did not pass. So, first hour lap swim remains same as it's been set in years past.

Just a few general reminders in the pool area:

- Pool parties are to be requested in advance through the Deerfield Office. Residents may need to hire additional lifeguards. Party Policy is available in the Deerfield office, as well.
- Only appropriate swimwear will be allowed in the pool.
 A picture list is available from lifeguards.
- · No sports balls can be brought in the pool area.
- No pets allowed in the pool area.
- Residents of all ages are reminded that we are a family-friendly environment. Please keep this in mind and ensure all actions/behaviors are appropriate, including refraining from excessive PDA.
- Parents are still responsible for supervising children and helping guards enforce the rules.
- Guards have final say on enforcement of these and all pool rules. We encourage everyone to go over the rules with your family so that all are informed.

As always, we welcome all to come and join the Swim Pool Committee. We meet on the Second Tuesday of each month in the clubhouse. Our next meeting is Tuesday, June 11th at 7pm.




