This option is recommended as the Third Choice for most affordable option that achieves a consistent-looking and maintained fence around the perimeter compared to the "hodge-podge" that presently exists. The achievement of a consistent-looking and maintained fence is a core reason for any new perimeter fence, and the basic wood option accomplishes this with the least capital cost. However, due to looks and durability considerations, it is not designated as either the First or the Second Choice.
