# Welcome to Deerfield Village



Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Texas Trash Service 281-888-3688 Hours of Operation 7am-7pm Office hours 7am-4pm

Pick-up days are Tuesday and Friday. **Please** do not put your trash out until Monday evening or Thursday evening. Recycling will NOT be picked up on days with bad weather.

# Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along

curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

### FOR ALL NEW RESIDENTS WITH PETS:

Please call me for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. If your pet gets lost and has the tag the finder can call me and I will call you and arrange to return your pet. Tags from another city or state make it hard to get your pet back as quickly asap. The Pet Hotline tag has my home and cell #. I keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep

your pet several days.

### "ATTENTION!!! ALL PET OWNERS

Keep your dog safe by making sure the gates are locked during garbage day pick-up. Pets will bark and jump at the gate, and if it is not latched properly, they will get out. Tuesdays and Fridays are the days I get the most calls for missing pets!"

# Mud 136 Report...

At the April 2014 meeting of the Harris County MUD 136 Board of Directors we discussed many long term and new issues, heard reports from our consultants including engineering, operations, bookkeeping, tax assessor, and legal.

Due to the influx of new homeowners and neighbors in Deerfield Village (Harris County MUD 136) I thought it time to reacquaint many of you with what a MUD is and how we operate. ### What is a MUD?

A Municipal Utility District (MUD) is a political subdivision of the State of Texas authorized by the Texas Commission of Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to provide water, sewage, drainage and other services within the MUD boundaries. MUD Board members are elected officials that serve 4 year terms. The publically elected Board of Directors manages and controls all of the affairs of the MUD subject to the supervision of the TCEQ. The Board establishes policies in the interest of its residents, utility customers, and ratepayers. A MUD may adopt and enforce all necessary charges, fees and taxes in order to provide district facilities and service.

#### How are MUDs created?

Property owners in a proposed district petition the TCEQ to create a MUD. The TCEQ evaluates the petition, holds a public hearing, and grants or denies the petition. After approval, the TCEQ appoints five temporary members to the MUD's Board of Directors, until an election is called to elect permanent Board members, to confirm the MUD's creation, and to authorize bonds and taxing authority for bond repayment. HCMUD 136 currently has no outstanding bond authority and has retired all district debt.

Will my taxes be higher or lower in a MUD? MUD tax rates, like all property tax rates, vary according to property values and debt requirements. MUD tax rates generally decline over time as the MUD is built out and operating and debt service costs are shared by more homeowners, or in the case of HCMUD 136, debt is retired and taxes pay for maintenance and operations of district facilities.

Can MUDs provide for parks and recreation facilities? In addition to common functions of water and wastewater service, some MUDs are legally empowered to engage in conservation, irrigation, electrical generation, firefighting, solid waste collection and disposal, and recreational activities. A MUD can provide for itself the recreational amenities that are approved by the Board of Directors and funded by the District.

This is the season where climate conditions change almost daily, but Texas remains in a precarious position regarding the availability of fresh water. The Houston area is no different, and we ask all District customers to use water wisely, and calibrate their lawn watering and sprinkler systems to maximize this limited resource and save money in the process. Please, no more watering the sidewalks and driveways.

Also, we ask that you not place solid waste at curbside for collection prior to the night before pickup. It is the resident's responsibility to tell landscapers and lawn people to place garden refuse bags behind enclosures or up driveways prior to the night before collection. I constantly see bags at curbside on Saturdays and Tuesdays, and they sit there for 2-3 days. Please make sure to bundle and tie all tree and plant cuttings, and to keep the bundles no more than 5'-6' in length.

In the coming months we will begin offering hazardous waste collection (hazmat) via a contract with Waste Management. This program will be free of charge to residents of HCMUD 136 during the first year of operation, at which time we'll evaluate the program and make any necessary changes. Watch this newsletter and your monthly water/sewer bill for details on how to participate.

Our next Board meeting is Thursday, May 8, 2014 at 6:00pm at the DVCA Recreation Center. Meetings are free and open to the public. See you there!

# Financial Services Committee...

It has come to our attention that residents of homes along the Greenbelt are intentionally and increasingly placing leftover food items outside near or on the Greenbelt. Whether they are intended for the birds, squirrels, loose cats, or stray dogs, it is not healthy for the animals, could cause choking, and is considered littering. This food is also creating havoc for the owners of leashed dogs as the dogs are enticed toward the food and it is not known whether the food has been poisoned.

# Folks, we have a PET POOP problem

OUR Community needs your help! If you are able to take your dog for a walk on the Greenbelt, you are also able to take a plastic bag that weighs less than an ounce in order to pick up the poop.

For those of you that let your pet run along with you, do so, AFTER your pet has pooped and you have scooped. Letting your pet walk behind you does not let you see when the pet poops.

Let's be more mindful of others. Please be a responsible pet owner and CLEAN UP THE POOP when walking

your pet outdoors! When your pet poops on the Deer-field Village Common Areas/Greenbelt, it stinks, it's easy to step on, but somehow you just can't make your-self pick it up! Poop also pollutes your environment and contains bacteria that pose a health risk to people. When it rains or storms, the poop get washed into the streets and flows down the storm drain into area bayous and waterways where people may come into contact with it. Consider buying a handy pooper scooper, bring along a grocery bag or newspaper bag, tie it off to seal it and throw it in the trash. This will make the task easier!
