Fall Heating Reminders

It is always recommended at this time of the year to have your natural gas heating system inspected and to change the batteries in your battery operated smoke alarms.

Why have your heating system inspected? After all, it worked just fine last year. And, the service people are just going to say something is wrong and try to run up a big bill.

Yes, many of the A/C and heating companies who mail us advertisements or place them at our door, are less than honest. This is why you should use a company you or a neighbor have had a good experience with.

As to why a system that was just fine last year may be dangerous this year, it comes down to two words...heat exchanger. The heat exchanger is a metal box that separates the burning natural gas from the air that will circulate through your home. This prevents carbon monoxide and other dangerous gasses produced by the burning natural gas from going into the air you breathe and instead vents them harmlessly to the outside. Over time, holes will develop in the metal of the heat exchanger because of corrosion, possibly rust or just burn through by the gas burners. When this happens, dangerous gases will enter the air you breathe. These gasses can make you very sick or kill you.

This is why a fall inspection is important. Also, a carbon monoxide detector is beneficial. They can be bought for under \$25.00 at hardware stores.

lowing website:





- * A request for proposals is almost complete on the restroom renovations. We hope to get bids completed and have a contractor approved by the end of the year, so construction could start in January and avoid any inconvenience for holiday activities.
- *The back staircase that goes to the second floor of the Rec Center has been replaced.
- * A leak in the kitchen was repaired and the ceiling has been repainted. We will purchase new ceiling light fixtures as well.
- * We will review bids for a new janitorial service for the Rec Center and office.
- * We are exploring additional lighting for the greenbelt area between Hastingswood and Manor Haven.

This includes, but is not limited to, new roofs, pool installation, house additions and patios and porch additions." Applications for Architectural Approval can be found on our website and can be obtained from the DVCA office.

The Deed Restrictions/Architectural Control Committee meets at 7:00 PM the first Monday of each Month (subject to change) in the Clubhouse of the Recreation Center. Your application may be considered during the meeting. Your presence is not required, but will insure that any questions raised can be answered at that time. Check with office or current newsletter to insure time and date of meeting.

MUD 136 Board Report...

HCMUD 136 REPORT- OCTOBER 2010 By Neil Polansky, President www.hcmud136.org

2010 TAXES: Your HCMUD 136 Board of Directors voted last night to decrease the district's 2010 tax rate from \$.27 / \$100 valuation to \$.215 / \$100, or about a 20% reduction. Coupled with the decline in HCAD appraisals due to the local real estate recession, this will result in a significant decrease in property taxes levied by HCMUD 136 and a lower individual tax bill. This rate adjustment was made possible by the board retiring all outstanding district bonds. We are now completely debt free, primarily due to the efforts of director Harry Price who pushed to make this a reality.

WELL #2: Last night the Board authorized the capping of water well #2, located about 1,200' south of Kieth Harrow on Barker Cypress. Shutting down well #2 was made possible by last year's switch to WHCRWA surface water. We'll continue to maintain our primary water well, as it augments surface water during high demand periods and acts as an emergency resource. The underground pipe connection between wells 1 and 2 will be cut and capped.

REIMBURSEMENT: The Board also signed a "Receipt and Release" with the WHCRWA, facilitating their reimbursement to the District of \$485,000 due for system conversion to surface water. We should be receiving the payment from WHCRWA within the next few weeks, and the money will go into our Operations and Maintenance fund.

PROACTIVE BOARD: Your Board has been regularly attending meetings of the West Harris County Regional Water Authority (WHCRWA) and the Jackrabbit Road PUD (operators of our sewage treatment plant). Attendance at these meetings is critical if we wish our voices and concerns to be heard. Very few MUDs send representatives to these meetings, wherein they spend district money and make decisions impacting all of us. We are a proactive board!


WATER QUALITY: Please let us know if you experience any issues related to water quality or pressure, including smell, taste, and color. With the majority of our water coming from Lake Houston it's critical that we test and provide feedback to WHCRWA when appropriate. During the next few months we'll be performing additional comprehensive water quality tests at district expense in an effort to insure we're receiving the safest water possible.

FACILITY TOUR: Preliminary date for a tour of District facilities is Saturday, November 13 at 9am. This will include a tour of our main water plant, one or both district lift stations, the JRPUD sewage treatment plant (on Pine Forest Dr.) and the WHCRWA water plant off FM 529, east of Eldridge. Tour date and time is subject to change, so keep looking at our website for details. The public is welcome to attend!

Our next meeting is Thursday, November 11 @ 6pm in the DVCA Rec. Center. It is free and open to the public.

December Gardening from...Cornelius Nursery

Working in your garden is an excellent escape during the holidays. It is a perfect time to plant trees and shrubs so they can develop a strong root system for next Spring. Cool weather color such as Pansies, Snapdragons, Cyclamen, Flowering Cabbage and Kale add splashes of color to your landscape. Spring flowering bulbs can be planted now once they have been properly chilled.

Prune summer flowering shrubs and vines now. They will bloom on new growth. Remember-do not top your Crapemyrtles! Simply prune to remove seed heads and shape. Trim evergreens only to reshape.

Prepare for the cold weather before it hits! One of the best things you can do for your landscape plants is to provide a 2-to 3-inch layer of mulch. Mulching is necessary year round but during the colder periods it provides a layer of insulation for the roots. Secondly, water your landscape well before a cold spell. A drought stressed plant is more susceptible to freeze damage. Thirdly, for more tender plants, purchase frost cloth for extra protection. Frost cloth is a fabric which adds 3 to 4 degrees of warmth. Cover the plant completely allowing the edges to come all the way to the ground. We are utilizing the heat which radiates from the ground.
