President's Report...

Dear Neighbors,

Unfortunately, spring did not bring us many spring showers, so it is possible that a drought situation will develop this summer season. In the event it does, please work with our MUD to obey the days and time to water your lawn and plants.

I do not have an update to share with you from Harris County Flood Control on the new storm drain grate. We are calling them frequently to see when they will resume the construction. Although we have safety concerns about the open and exposed storm drain inlet, it is not a concern for flooding; it will drain correctly if we receive a large amount of rain. Soon as I know something, I will let you know by email if you are registered to receive our emails and post an update in the July Newsletter.

Speaking of email updates, if you are not registered, I encourage you to contact us and register. You will get the latest information on Deerfield news and updates on important community events. Although we do our best to plan ahead, sometimes dates and times can change.

It's almost time to update the Deerfield Directory, so please let us know if your information has changed or if you need to be added to our Directory. We have also included a reminder in your water bill and

I had a few parents ask me about the baby pool water looking green, in comparison to the main pool being so blue. I can assure you that the water on both pools are checked frequently and are very safe. It has to do with the plaster surface at the bottom, the depth of the pool and other various factors. The Swimming Pool Committee will be looking into how the baby pool can be made to look more inviting, including getting some shade to help protect against the hot sun.

As school is closed for the summer, graffiti is typically on the rise. If you see graffiti in Deerfield, please report it to the office immediately for us to address. Removing the graffiti right away discourages the vandals and will drive them to do this elsewhere. Your help is appreciated!

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a



heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets. Hurricane season is upon us and we will get heavy rains, so please be advised.

Expenditures: Unfavorable budget variance is caused by budgeting vs payment for pool management. Total yearly expenses are in line with total budget.

Assessments: We have collected \$624,518(95.7%) of the 2011 assessments. Collection rate is inline with the 2010 rate.

Late fees of \$100 plus interest and penalties are now due on unpaid assessments. To avoid additional expenses please remit your payment now. On June 1st if assessment remains unpaid a lien will be filed on the property.

The Committee has two(2) new members. Charlie Keedy and his family have been residents for over 20 years. Thaddeus Shaffer has been a resident for almost a year.

MUD 136 Board Report...

At its May meeting the directors reviewed the results of April's business. The report from the District's tax assessor/collector shows that 97.5% of property taxes due have been collected. We thank all of you who paid your taxes promptly, and for those few of you who have not, a warning that starting June 1 a 20% penalty will be assessed in addition to the monthly interest charge.

A serious water line leak occurred at the corner of Deerfield Village Drive and Heathersage near the marquee. Repairs will involve replacing the water line that runs under the large oak tree at that location. The most economical way to accomplish this would involve removing the tree. However, the board of directors unanimously voted to proceed with an alternative solution, which is to bore under-

neath the tree at an additional cost of \$8000. Once the new line is laid, the construction area will be resodded.

The District's fiscal year ends March 31, and the District's bookkeeper has sent the financial ledgers to the District's auditor. Once the audit is completed, the financial statement will be posted on the District's website. Annual statements for previously years are also posted there.

If you have questions about any aspect of the District's operations, you can ask them during the resident comment period at the beginning of our monthly meeting, which is held on the second Thursday of the month at 6:00 PM at the rec center. The meeting agenda is posted at the rec center office several days before the meeting Information about the District is also available at its website, www.hcmud136.org.

Community Services Committee...

The current focus for the Community Services committee is the Rec Center. A bid is being prepared for external repairs and renovations, including handrails, column and siding repairs and painting. Part of the Committee is looking at some update work inside, including painting and furnishings.

As spring turns to summer, mosquito control will be underway again, and we continue to look at lighting improvements around the neighborhood.

Graffiti is removed and vandalism repaired as soon as we know about it; if you see any please report it to the Deerfield office.

Be part of a committee focused on keeping Deer-field a great place to live - come to the Community Services Committee meetings the first Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m.

2011 DVCA Swimming Pool Rules & Policies

General Rules

This is a private community pool. The pool grounds will be restricted to bona fide residents of the Deerfield Village Community Association who have paid their assessments in full. Residents must have a current pool ID.

Guests are permitted according to the Guest Policy below. A resident must accompany any guest and must remain at the pool while his/her guest is in the pool area.

Groups or parties of 9 people or more that include nonresidents using the pool during regular schedule hours must have prior approval, and may require a fee to cover additional lifeguards. Groups or parties of 15 or more must book a lifeguard through the pool management company. The group/party may not occupy over half of the pavilion area.

Dress Code: Only swim suits/swim trunks may be worn in the pool. The guards will ask any person in improper attire to leave the pool. (NO THONGS OR DENIM SHORTS IN THE POOL).

Lifeguards have the ultimate poolside decision.

Safety Rules

No person will be admitted to the pool that has sores, open abrasions, a cold or other physical conditions, which might contaminate the pool or jeopardize another person's health. Extra clothing over bathing suits will not be allowed in the pool except in cases of severe sunburn or for the protection of persons highly susceptible to sunburn. The decision of the management will be final.

The pool will be closed at any time it is deemed necessary by the management in order to safeguard the health, safety, and well-being of all persons using the pool.

In the event of lightening or thunder, the pool will be evacuated immediately and closed for 20 minutes, resetting at each occurrence.

No running or rough playing will be permitted within the pool grounds or restrooms.

Undue loud noises or loud music will not be permitted.

Diving from the sides of the pool will only be permitted in the deep end. No flips or back dives will be allowed off the side of the pool in the deep end.

Excessive bouncing on the diving board will not be permitted. Diving off either side of the board will not be permitted.

No children under the age of 10 will be allowed in the pool area unless they are accompanied by a parent, guardian, or a person 18 years of age or older who accepts responsibility for their safety. All children 10 and older who are unattended must be prepared to demonstrate to the lifeguard their ability to swim one length of the pool, or they will be asked to leave the pool grounds.

Children over 6 are not allowed in the baby pool. A parent or guardian must supervise all children in the baby pool at all times.

The lap lane is set aside for lap swimming primarily by adults. If there are no lap swimmers, it may be used for other purposes. Sharing of the lap lane by two swimmers is encouraged and expected.

There will be a ten-minute break each hour. At this time, only those persons 18 years of age or older will be allowed in the pool. All others must leave the pool. The guards will whistle when the break time is over.

Pool Rules Continued...

No glass containers of any kind will be permitted within the pool grounds.

No smoking, chewing tobacco, or use of any other tobacco products in the pool area.

No dogs or pets of any kind will be permitted within the pool grounds or restrooms .

No firearms or weapons permitted within the pool grounds.

No rollerblading, skating, skateboarding or bicycling is permitted within the pool grounds.

The lifeguards have the ultimate poolside decision.

Guest Policy

Bringing guests to the DVCA pool is a privilege and they will only be allowed to enter the pool if the conditions allow for it. If the pool is too busy for the number of guards available, your guests may not be allowed to use the pool, or if while your guests are at the pool, the pool becomes too busy, your guests may not be allowed to use the pool.

A guest is a non-resident, or a family member who is not residing in Deerfield. At no time may a Deerfield resident be a guest of another Deerfield resident.

Deerfield residents with a valid pool ID card may bring up to 3 guests to the pool. If the resident is under 14, a parent must also be present in order to bring in guests. For 14 – 18 year olds, without a parent present, only 2 guests may be allowed.

The maximum number of guests per household that will be allowed entry without prior approval from DVCA is 6.

The resident must accompany any guest and must remain at the pool while his/her guest is in the pool area.

RECREATION CENTER FACILITIES USAGE:

A group or organization using any Recreation Center Facility without charge must be made up of 50% or more of Deerfield Residents. Names and addresses of participants will be required by the office Manager. The group must provide a service to the Community (as defined in the Articles of Incorporation). The proposed activity must be within the scope of activities covered by the DVCA insurance policy and meet Board and Underwriter approval.
