## President's Report...

Dear Neighbors,

Happy 4th of July, I hope everyone is staying cool in this hot summer heat. Please note that a fireworks ban has been issued for all of Harris and surrounding counties in response to extremely dry conditions, posing a high fire risk. Please respect our community and leave this to the professionals this year. We have had two home fires within a year and the ground will be very dry, giving even the smallest sparkler a source of ignition. I also understand that due to the dry area conditions, Pinewood Forest Country Club has cancelled their professional firework display, which has been a treat every year for our family, during the time we have lived in Deerfield.

I finally have an update from Harris County Flood Control on the new storm drain grate. The office of Jeff Garcia has confirmed the completion of the redesigned grate and Harris County Infrastructure plans to start the work before the 2nd week of July. We should be rid of that ugly construction area soon, with a safer and efficient drainage system.

Some residents may have noticed an estate sale in



Deerfield last month. As all of you should know, we do not allow garage or yard sales in Deerfield, and this is enforced by our Deed restrictions. However, if the owner of a property passes away, and the proper proof has been provided to the DVCA office, using a professional Estate sale company to liquidate the belongings of a former resident is an option for the family of the deceased. During these times, it is very tough for the family and this typically helps with bringing closure. If you have any questions on this, please bring them up with the DVCA office or myself. ## Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets. Hurricane season is upon us and we will get heavy rains, so please be advised.

# MUD 136 Board Report...

At the regular June meeting, the directors reviewed the results of May's business. The severe drought in SE Texas continues and water usage is running high. The District's water supply continues to be reliable, but please remember during this severe drought to conserve water and reduce or eliminate unnecessary lawn watering. Unattended and misaligned sprinkler systems sending water down storm drains are wasting a valuable resource, AND WASTING YOUR MONEY. Repairs have been completed on the leak at the corner of Deerfield Village Drive and Heathersage near the Marquee. The affected water line is back in

service with no damage to the large oak tree at that location. Landscaping of excavation areas are typically delayed a couple of weeks to allow for settling of the fill. After settling is complete, additional dirt is brought in to level the area prior to landscaping.

If you have questions about any aspect of the District's operations, you can ask them during the resident comment period at the beginning of our monthly meeting which is held on the second Thursday of the month at 6:00 PM at the Rec Center. The meeting agenda is posted at the Rec Center office several days before the meeting. Information about the District is also available at its website, [www.hcmud136.org](http://www.hcmud136.org). The next regular board meeting is Thursday, July 14 at 6:00 PM in the DVCA Rec Center's large meeting room. These meetings are open to the public, and we welcome your attendance.

## Community Services Committee...



Summer heat is here, and though it has been dry, mosquito fogging has started. Thanks to an alert resident, the Deerfield office was informed that fogging was taking place during the day, when people were outdoors and active in the area. Our policy has always been that fogging takes place at night; the new contractor has been informed of this and we will follow up to make sure this policy is followed. This kind of communication is what keeps Deerfield the neighborhood we want it to be. We appreciate being informed of anything that is not as it should be so that we can take action.

The part of the mosquito control program that most people don't see has also started: putting larvacide periodically in the storm drains and the Greenbelt ditch to prevent hatching of mosquitoes in the standing water. If it ever rains again (I hope it has by the time you are reading this!) this will be done after every rain.

Work continues on planning for interior and exterior repair and renovation for the clubhouse. Look for changes over the next few months!


