I am pleased to announce Trustees Larry Burkham and Louis Carpenter have been re-elected to another term; and, I welcome new Trustee Sigmund R Potocki to the Board. We had a good number of members come out and vote this year.

At the meetings this month I touched on financials, accomplishments and priorities of the Association, with some conversation with residents on the security concerns. This is an important issue to the Association and our Members, so we are being creative in our approach and solutions. Assessment collections were down by a couple percent, compared to this time last year, but overall financially healthy. We are in the process of redesigning our website, to make it simpler to use and find information. The need for volunteers continues to be an ongoing issue. A special thanks to the Swim Team and those that stepped in for the Children's Easter Egg Hunt.

An important topic that could affect our residents is the recent proposal to increase the sales tax and renewal of the Fire Chief contract. The voting is set to be May 11th at 7:30PM, at 9630 Telge Rd., Houston 77095, if you're interested in providing your opinion. I would ask that you read up on the issue, as I have to remain neutral. I understand our volunteer firefighters are not happy with opinions/actions of the ESD Board. The CyFair Volunteer Fire Department are made up of volunteers, including Deerfield residents, risking their well being every time they go out to the scene of an accident, or a burning home, so they can protect you and your property.

Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Texas Trash Service 281-888-3688 Hours of Operation 7am-7pm Office hours 8am-5pm

Pick-up days are Tuesday and Friday. **Please** do not put your trash out until Monday evening or Thursday evening.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a



heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

MUD 136 Board Report...

At its March meeting, the Board reviewed the District's operations during the previous month. In addition, the directors approved the operating budget for fiscal year 2013-2014, which starts on April 1. The total of \$1.3 million has been set for the budget. \$600,000 of this is for the purchase of garbage and recycling service and for the purchase of water from West Harris County Regional Water Authority (WHCRWA). These costs are rebilled to residents. The balance of the expenses is absorbed by the District. Note: WHCRWA will increase its price it charges us by 15 cents to \$2.30 per 1000 gallons effective July 1.

Our current fiscal year ended March 31. The past year saw many significant events, the most important of which was the conversion to a new operator, a new garbage/recycling service, and a new e-recycling day. Phase 3 of our sewer repair program was initiated. Significant financial contributions were made for the Wilson Elementary School playground improvement and for the DVCA greenbelt exercise stations.

Special Recycling Day. Saturday, April 27, will be the next special recycling day for electronics as well as secure shredding of documents. More information is contained elsewhere in the newsletter. Among the documents that can be shredded are old tax returns. The IRS requires maintaining personal tax files for the preceding three tax years. However, if an audit reveals mistakes, the IRS can audit an additional three years returns. To be on the safe side, it is advisable to keep returns for the previous six years, plus one. Any files older than that can be shredded.

If you wish to question or to comment on any of the District's activities, come to the next District meeting, which will be held on Thursday, April 11, at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.

Important information for Residents with new pets and New Residents with pets!!!

A very important thing you as a responsible pet owner can do is to have a collar with ID tags on your pet. A rabies tag is great for ID but if you pet gets lost on the weekend no one who finds the pet can get it back to you until the vet office opens on Monday. The finder may not be able to keep your pet over the weekend. It is essential to have another tag or tags on your pet with YOUR PHONE NUMBER on it.

For all new Deerfield residents, I now have a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. When a pet is in a new location it will not know how to find his new home if it gets out. 
