Presidents Report...

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

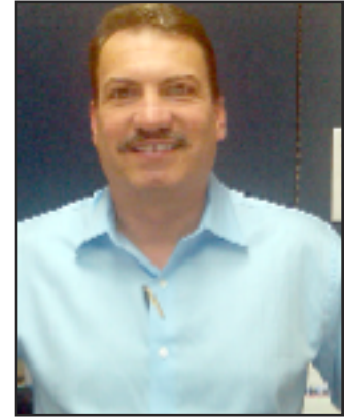
I am happy to announce the Annual Meeting of the Members election results, Trustees Arthur McDanel and I have been re-elected to another term by the residents of Deerfield. Welcome Brian Harris, as our new elected Board Trustee.

Voting of officers was held at the Annual Board meeting, and elected as Secretary was Arthur McDanel, as Treasurer was Stuart Cory, as Vice President was Larry Burkham and as President was Eric Toureilles.

In the Annual Meeting of the Members, I touched on financials, accomplishments and priorities of the Association. I reported that the Association's financial position is strong, both reserves are in check and budgets are being adhered to. Our facilities are well maintained, and the new EMB (Electronic Messaging Board) is working great. Our contract with SEAL Security was renewed for another year, and we are pleased with their overall performance. In addition, we have increased our security budget in 2015, so that committee can use for other programs or issues. We continue to focus on community communication, including website enhancements and text messaging. We currently have about 265 residents registered online to receive communications, and 100 residents are using the text option. Any feedback on the site is appreciated. Also, we still need volunteers in our committees, but I want to thank those that have joined us in 2015.

As an update to the Low Income housing projects being

proposed, 2 of them were withdrawn by the time I attended the Town Hall on 3/12. The third property on Clay Rd ran into other hurdles with the MUD not having the needed infrastructure to support that project, which is good news. So currently, the only property being considered is located at W. Little York and Greenhouse Rd. A huge thank you to Colleen Vera, Kathy Smith, Lori Gernand, and those that volunteer at "The West Houston Communities Coalition", which put the Town Hall together, it was a very informative meeting. I saw a large group of concerned Deerfield residents at this Town Hall, so thank you for coming out. Keep in mind that this will be a constant battle, as long as there is still land around us to develop. Save this site on your favorites to get year round information www.twhcc.org.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

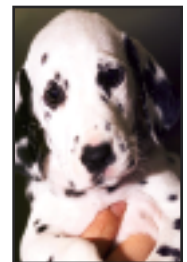

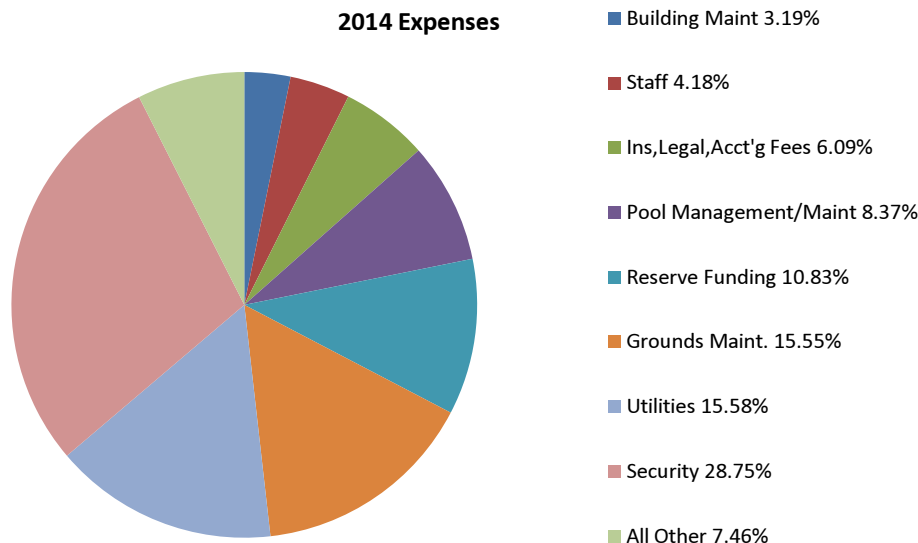

Mud 136 Report...

At its March meeting, the Board reviewed the District's operations and the recycling results for the previous month. During February residents recycled 2000 lbs more of non-hazardous materials than for the same month last year. The complete report can be found on the District's website, www.hcmud136.org. If you are in doubt about whether an item can be recycled, review the list of acceptable/unacceptable items which is also on the website.

A note of thanks to those residents who have been sweeping up the leaves in their street gutters. And for those whose lawn service is blowing the leaves down the sewer, please ask them not to. Not only do the leaves inhibit the flow of water, they also create a perfect breeding ground for mosquitoes. Keeping the sewer system in top working condition is a high priority for the District. The sewer pipes on your street connect to one of two lift stations, one located at Wal-

nut Cove in the north end of Deerfield and the other at Clay and Windsong Trail. Sewage from the northeast, southeast, and southwest sections of Deerfield flows directly into the Clay Rd station. Sewage from the northwest section flows to Walnut Cove and then is pumped into the lines that flow to Clay Road. At that point the sewage is pumped to the regional sewage treatment plant on Pine Forest Drive. MUD 136 has a 10% ownership in that plant, which allows us to use 10% of the plant's capacity. It also means we pay 10% of the operating costs, as well as 10% of the plant's capital improvements. If you have recently driven down Pine Forest Drive, you have seen the plant's new block wall. Behind it is the treatment plant that has just received a \$4.5 million upgrade. Our portion of the construction cost was \$450,000.

If you have questions about this or any of the District's activities, come to the next District meeting, which will be held on Thursday, April 9 at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.

Pool Committee...

The swimming pool is a private community pool. The pool area will be restricted to bona fide resident of the Deerfield Village Community Association (DCVA) who have their assessment paid in full and have a valid Deerfield picture ID card on file. Listed below is a condensed version of the rules for the swimming pool. The detailed set of rules are posted at the pool and on our website www.deerfieldvillageonline.com, click on Life in the Village, then Pool Rules.



- The lifeguards have the ultimate poolside authority. They are authorized to close the pool at any time in order to safeguard the health, safety, and well-being of all persons using the pool.
- Each resident may bring and sign in up to 3 guests. Any resident or guest 10 years old or younger must be accompanied by an adult at least 18 years old.
- No person will be admitted to the pool with any physical conditions that might contaminate the pool or jeopardize another's health.
- Proper swimming attire must be worn at all times when using the pool.
- The following items are unacceptable and not allowed in and around the pool; running, rough play, loud noise or music, glass containers, smoking or other tobacco products, pets, firearms or other weapons, excessive bouncing on the diving board, diving from the sides of the pool except in the deep end.
- The lap lane is set aside for lap swimmers.

Each resident must have a valid picture ID card on file. If you are new to Deerfield and have yet to get a picture ID, please stop by the office to get that taken care of.

Please call me for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. If your pet gets lost and has the tag the finder can call me and I will call you and arrange to return your pet. Tags from another city or state make it hard to get your pet back as quickly asap. The Pet Hotline tag has my home and cell #. I keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep your pet several days.

You may not consider owning a pet IF:

You don't have time to get it's shots and check for heartworms.

You don't have time to get a collar with ID and a phone # on a tag.

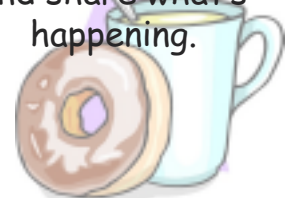
