### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### Greetings Neighbor,

We have some fun events in October, starting with a Chili Cook-off competition and Music on the Green on Oct. 3rd, last one for 2015. We also have a Mexican Fiesta event Oct. 17th, and for Halloween, Trunk or Treat for the kids.

I'm happy to report that after reviewing and approving the 2016 budget, the Board voted with the Finance Committee's recommendation to keep the Yearly Assessments flat, so there is no increase this year. Keep in mind that our expenses are still up, as utilities like water and electricity are not going down. But we are always making improvements to remain conservation minded. For example, we are installing smart irrigation controllers, which would adjust water usage based on weather conditions (past, current and forecasted) temperature and rain. We are planting heartier plants and shrubs that requires less watering. We are also installing LED fixtures and/or bulbs as a long term plan to reduce electric consumption.

The Board has also approved a 1 year extension of the SEAL patrol contract, recommended by our Security Committee. The Committee has also been working on several enhancements to the website, so you can find block captains and section leaders. We recently added a link to the Harris County crime map, where you can see criminal activities in our area, including Deerfield. This site will also let you see if a sex offender lives close by, and some public information. Last month there was a rash of robberies at gunpoint between Clay and West Little York, with two incidents in the Randall's parking lot. This is a reminder to be aware of your surroundings when walking to and from your car, and don't stare at your phone. Walk out with a crowd at night or ask for a bagger to walk the cart to your car. Park in welllit areas of the parking lot. This also goes for coming home, so keep the outside well-lit, as this deters criminals from targeting these areas. If you see something wrong, don't get out of your car, call SEAL from you cell phone, they are in the neighborhood and can arrive quickly. Obviously if a

crime is in progress, call 911 first. If you have an alarm system, use it when you're gone or place it in STAY mode at night. Deerfield is a very safe neighborhood in comparison to others in our zip code. However, crime will happen. I understand a few bikes have been stolen from people's garages, and a couple have been recovered. If you have been victim to



this and have not recovered your bike, please give us a call, I think we are still holding 2 bikes. My guess is these are kids being mischievous, as the bikes are being thrown into the Greenbelt ditch.

As requested by a resident, I am posting future monthly Board Agendas on our website, similar to how we post all our meeting minutes. I wish I had thought of it earlier, but it is easier than coming by the Information Board at the Recreation Center.

Finally, I want to thank all the Committees, our resident volunteers, and the other groups we interact with that attended the Big Event. This was a very successful event and committees recruited several new volunteers, as well as educating new residents about all the programs and activities we have in Deerfield. In attendance was the Deerfield Committees and Board, Scout Troop 120, Deerfield Dolphins Swim Team, MUD 136, WCA, HCSO, Precinct 5 Constable, CERT, and SEAL. Special thanks to Peter Howell.

## **MUD 136 Report**

At its September meeting, the Board reviewed the District's water and sewer operations during the previous month. The Texas Commission On Environmental Quality has also done an on-site assessment of the District's operations and found everything to be in compliance with all state requirements. To quote the report, "your public water supply continues to merit recognition as a Superior system".

The Board also reviewed the Tax Assessor-Collector's report, which included the certified appraisal value from The Harris County Appraisal District (HCAD) for the tax year 2014-2015. That value is \$ 203,588,000 versus \$183,966,000 for the previous year. The Directors voted unanimously to approve an offsetting reduction in the 2015-2016 tax rate from \$0.196 to \$0.176 per \$100 of assessed valuation.

The document shredding event last month was a great success. If you missed the event, there will be

another one sometime next year. Meanwhile, there are two options available. For seniors, the Glazier has periodic shredding events. For information, call 713-274-3250. The Office Depot store at Hwy 6 & FM 529 shred documents at any time for \$1.99/lb. Unlike previous time, our event did not include the recycling of electronics and hazardous chemicals. That is now done by appointment under a separate program known as At Your Door. Below is a summary of the guidelines handed out that cover the recycling of hazardous household materials.

If you have any questions about the recycling program or any other District business, plan to attend the next District meeting, which will be held on Thursday, Oct 8, at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.


## Oct. 3rd Chili Cook Off and Music on the Green

#### INTERVIEW WITH A BURGLAR

**OPEN GARAGE DOOR** For a quick steal, especially a car, burglars will target homes with an open garage door. Don't keep so much of your property in plain view for easy access to the criminal. Don't keep keys in the ignition of your vehicles. It is not safe. These guys are in and out in a matter of seconds.

**PORCH LIGHTS** The suspects drive around the neighborhoods and look for homes that have porch lights on during the middle of the day. This indicates that no one is home. Install motion sensors if you routinely arrive home at night. This saves money on electricity, creates a deterrent when someone is peeking into your home, and removes your house from being "flagged" by the burglars.

MAIL AND PAPERS A paper in the driveway in the mid-afternoon signals to these guys that the home owner leaves early and isn't home yet. When burglars see the paper or the porch light, they also check the mail box to see if the mail was still there. Another indication that no one is home.

ANSWER THE DOOR KNOCK It is very important to answer the door knock in the middle of the day and speak to anyone knocking through the locked door. Do not open your door to speak to strangers. These guys know that if no one answers the door when they knock, chances are no one is home, and it is ok to make entry into the home.

**GARAGE SIDE DOORS** When the burglars decide which home to target and perform the "knock test", they will jump the fence to the home and check the side door to the garage. The suspects stated, "no one locks their side garage door". Once inside the garage, they typically have access to the car and entrance into the home.

ALARMS Remember, the alarms are not a deterrent to the "bad" guys. They know they can be in and out of the house long before anyone could respond to the alarm. If they know the home has an alarm, they just cut the power to the home via the breaker box. Even if this set off the alarm, it does not matter to them.

**DOGS** Dogs are the best deterrent. Burglars are more mindful of homes with loud barking dogs.

**ROUTINE** The most troubling fact learned, was how much time these guys spend conducting surveillance on the neighborhoods, and how well they pay attention to our daily living patterns and routines. We never give a thought to how our comfortable and convenient existence is an open book to the predators walking amongst us. Do the unexpected. Indulge in the unplanned. **Only through changes in our routine lifestyles will we break the cycle of predictability that allows us to be preyed upon.** 

### **Deeds Committee**

If you are considering any work outside of your home, please be sure to complete and return an Application for Architectural Control to the DVCA Office. Your Application will then be forwarded to the Deeds Committee for their review and approval. As soon as approval has been received, you will be notified.

Applications can be found on the website: **www.deerfieldvillageonline.com** then click on DVCA Forms.

The Deeds Committee is in need of more members to help with the review of the Architectural Applications and monthly inspections for Deed Restriction Violations. The neighborhood is divided into smaller, workable Sections (no one does their own.) Deerfield Village Residents are very responsible and protective of their neighborhood and keeping the Protective Covenants enforced. However, there are those few that need reminders occasionally, and then some that need a little more pressure applied before deciding to comply with the Deed Restrictions.

The next meeting for the Deeds Committee will be on Monday, October 5, 2015 at 7 pm at the Clubhouse.

Please call me for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. If your pet gets lost and has the tag the finder can call me and I will call you and arrange to return your pet. Tags from another city or state make it hard to get your pet back as quickly asap. The Pet Hotline tag has my home and cell #. I keep a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, your name, address and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep your pet several days.

### **DVCA NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH**



#### Are you aware that Deerfield Village has a "Neighborhood Watch Program"?
