PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

Thank you to all that attended the Annual Meeting of the Members on March 8th, I touched on financials, accomplishments and priorities of the Association. I reported that the Association's financial position is strong, both reserves are in check and budgets are being adhered to. We did not need to increase Annual Assessments this year as a result. Our facilities continue to be well maintained, with work on the Clubhouse area, tennis courts, and landscaping. The Board recently hired a part time Office Manager, Pat Trull to help with inspections, extended hours during spring for pool passes, and backing up Tina when needed. We are very excited to have her onboard. We renewed our contract with SEAL Security, as we are pleased with their overall performance. We replaced our outdated security cameras with high resolution cameras, and increased the area we are monitoring. The Deerfield Directory is still being compiled, and we still need residents to fill out the online form for the directory on our website. In the near future, will have digital directory, so people can sign up immediately, and you do not have to wait for the printed version when someone moves into Deerfield. We continue to make enhancements to the website, and now post the Board Agenda for anyone to preview ahead of time. We are working on additional procedures and policies, so we can have better controls and standards. The Association renewed its contract with A-Beautiful pools this year, and they will be looking for lifeguards shortly. We replaced some of our irrigation controllers with smart controllers, which should better manage our water usage in the future. And finally we are looking at new access control options vs. the traditional lock and

key. More on that later this year. Mosquito spraying will begin this month and lasts through September. Also, the last of the exercise equipment has been installed, a big thank you to the MUD #136 for their support on this project.



However, the biggest issue we continue to have is a

need for volunteers. I thank all those that serve on the various committees and the Board, it is because of these individuals that step up and serve their community that Deerfield is such a great place to live. I am truly humbled to work alongside these men and women, we are very fortunate. That being said, we have many committees that have only half of the individuals they need to function, and we really need more people to join us to keep things running smoothly. Please think of serving and just come to your favorite committee or to a Board meeting for more information, or I'm happy to meet with you personally to discuss your interest. Our next meeting is on April 25th.

Please report Street Lights and Greenbelt Lights that are out to the DVCA Office; phone: 281-463-2624. It is necessary to provide the pole number and the location address of the pole that is being reported.

Street Lights that are not on the Greenbelt and not in the Patio Home Section may be reported directly to Center-Point Energy at the following website: http://www.centerpointenergy.com/en-us/residential/customer-service/reporting Click on the "Report a Streetlight Outage" located in the middle of the page. You can then click the "request form" and complete the requested information and submit.

Recycling is Always on Friday

Regular recycling pick-up is done by Residential Recycling of Texas. For bins, please call Stephanie Wolff at 866-516-9805. Recycling is always on Friday for paper, cardboard, plastic, and aluminum containers. For large and hazardous items, special arrangements must be made. Please see the DVCA website www.deerfieldvillageonline.com for complete recycling rules.

Residential Trash Reminders

Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Waste Corporation of America: 281-368-8397. Hours of operation are 7 am to 7 pm, office hours are 7 am to 4 pm. Pick-up days are Tuesday and Friday. Heavy trash day is Friday, limit 1 heavy item per service day per household. Please do not put your trash out until Monday or Thursday evening.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

MUD 136 Report

At its March meeting, the Board reviewed the District's operations during the previous month.

There was no disruption in service, even though one storage tank was taken out of service for inspection.

A note of thanks to those residents who have been sweeping up the leaves in their street gutters. And for those whose lawn service is blowing the leaves down the sewer, please ask them not to. Not only do the leaves inhibit the flow of water, they also create a perfect breeding ground for mosquitoes. Keeping the sewer system in top working condition is a high priority for the District.

Reminder: Anyone wishing to use the At Your Door hazardous materials recycling program before is ceases on May 1must contact Waste Management Corp (1-800-449-7587 or ATYOURDOOR@WM.COM) before April 15 to arrange a pick up. After that, hazardous items can be recycled at the Harris County facility located at 6900 Hahl Rd (Gessner & 290). For more information log on to http://eng.hctx.net/watershed/hhw_facility.html . The normal Friday recycling continues for paper, plastic containers (no motor oil or antifreeze bottles), and glass or metal food and drink containers. If you still have bags of mulch from the Boy Scouts, check the bags for the recycling emblem. If they have a triangle with the number 4 inside it, they can be recycled after they are turned inside out and dusted to remove mulch residue. To prevent recyclables from being confused with regular trash, put those items a distance away. If the items are not in the green recycling bin, clearly label them as 'recycling'.

If you have questions about any of the District's activities, come to the next District meeting, which will be held on Thursday, April 14, at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.

Manager's Report

The 2016 Swim Season is almost here! The pool will be open on weekends only in May. Beginning June 1st, the pool will be open 7 days a week. For a complete schedule of dates and times, please check inside this newsletter. The Pool Rules are also listed in this newsletter.

The Deerfield Village Swimming Pool is a private community pool. Pool IDs are issued to homeowners / residents who are current on their assessments.

If you are a resident and lease your home, you will need to have a release from the homeowner granting you permission to use the facilities before a pool tag can be issued. For further information regarding release forms, please call the office, 281-463-2624, or email Tina at deerfield4@sbcglobal.net.

If you are new to Deerfield Village, you will need to have your picture taken for the Pool ID tag. Pictures will be taken beginning April 15th, so stop by the office Monday thru Friday, 9:30 am – 1:30pm. If you are unable to stop during these times, please call or email Tina for an appointment.

Pictures will also be taken on Monday, April 25th, at 6 pm at the Clubhouse.

Please note that pool tags remain at the pool at all times.

If you are interested in a Pool Party, you will need prior approval and will need to contact the DVCA office and not the pool management company.

ATTENTION TENNIS PLAYERS

Sign up sheets are posted outside the DVCA office window every week for all four courts. We are asking all players to sign in to reserve your court before playing, even if it is spur of the moment! Not only will signing up for your court eliminate anyone else from pushing you off that court but the Tennis Committee uses these sheets as usage figures to prepare our budget each year. Your participation in this is a **HUGE BENEFIT TO YOU!** After your tennis playing is over for your time slot, please make sure the court gate is closed and locked. We have found it open several mornings and feel fortunate that no vandalism occurred so let's keep it that way by making sure everything is locked down before you walk

Pool Committee

GENERAL RULES

- 1. This is a private community pool. The pool grounds will be restricted to bona fide residents of the Deerfield Village Community Association who have paid their assessments in full. Residents must have a current pool ID.
- 2. Guests are permitted according to the Guest Policy below. A resident must accompany any guest and must remain at the pool while his/her guest is in the pool area.
- 3. Groups or parties of 9 people or more that include nonresidents using the pool during regular schedule hours must have prior approval, and may require a fee to cover additional lifeguards. Groups or parties of 15 or more must book a lifeguard through the pool management company. The group/party may not occupy over half of the pavilion area.
- 4. Dress Code: Only swim suits/swim trunks may be worn in the pool. The guards will ask any person in improper attire to leave the pool. (NO THONGS OR DENIM SHORTS IN THE POOL).
- 5. Lifeguards have the ultimate poolside decision.

SAFETY RULES

- 1. No person will be admitted to the pool that has sores, open abrasions, a cold or other physical conditions, which might contaminate the pool or jeopardize another person's health. Extra clothing over bathing suits will not be allowed in the pool except in cases of severe sunburn or for the protection of persons highly susceptible to sunburn. The decision of the management will be final.
- 2. The pool will be closed at any time it is deemed necessary by the management in order to safeguard the health, safety, and well-being of all persons using the pool.
- 3. In the event of lightening or thunder, the pool will be evacuated immediately and closed for 20 minutes, resetting at each occurrence.
- 4. No running or rough playing will be permitted within the pool grounds or restrooms.
- 5. Undue loud noises or loud music will not be permitted.
- 6. Diving from the sides of the pool will only be permitted in the deep end. No flips or back dives will be allowed off the side of the pool in the deep end.
- 7. Excessive bouncing on the diving board will not be permitted. Diving off either side of the board will not be permitted.
- 8. No children under the age of 10 will be allowed in the pool area unless they are accompanied by a parent, guardian, or a person 18 years of age or older who accepts responsibility for their safety. All children 10 and older who are unattended must be prepared to demonstrate to the lifeguard their ability to swim one length of the pool, or they will be asked to leave the pool grounds.
- 9. Children over 6 are not allowed in the baby pool. A parent or guardian must supervise all children in the baby pool at all times
- 10. The lap lane is set aside for lap swimming primarily by adults. If there are no lap swimmers, it may be used for other purposes. Sharing of the lap lane by two swimmers is encouraged and expected.
- 11. There will be a ten-minute break each hour. At this time, only those persons 18 years of age or older will be allowed in the pool. All others must leave the pool. The guards will whistle when the break time is over.
- 12. No glass containers of any kind will be permitted within the pool grounds.
- 13. No smoking, chewing tobacco, or use of any other tobacco products in the pool area.
- 14. No dogs or pets of any kind will be permitted within the pool grounds or restrooms.
- 15. No firearms or weapons permitted within the pool grounds.
- 16. No rollerblading, skating, skateboarding or bicycling is permitted within the pool grounds.
- 17. The lifeguards have the ultimate poolside decision.

GUEST POLICY

Bringing guests to the DVCA pool is a privilege and they will only be allowed to enter the pool if the conditions allow for it. If the pool is too busy for the number of guards available, your guests may not be allowed to use the pool, or if while your guests are at the pool, the pool becomes too busy, your guests may not be allowed to use the pool.

A guest is a non-resident, or a family member who is not residing in Deerfield. At no time may a Deerfield resident be a guest of another Deerfield resident.

Deerfield residents with a valid pool ID card may bring up to 3 guests to the pool. If the resident is under 14, a parent must also be present in order to bring in guests. For 14 – 18 year olds, without a parent present, only 2 guests may be allowed.

The maximum number of guests per household that will be allowed entry without prior approval from DVCA is 6. The resident must accompany any guest and must remain at the pool while his/her guest is in the pool area.

Landscape Committee

March has been up and down, either no rain or, deluges, pretty warm or cold. Can't really say hot because we all know what hot is. Fortunately, so far no freezes, knock on wood. Guess it's not too late for us to get one.

Signs have been placed at points on greenbelt and in the patio homes regarding cleaning up your dog poop. It's the neighborly and sanitary action for all of you with wonderful dogs.

The committee is excited and making progress toward getting new playground equipment at the recreation center.

Landscape Committee meets the second Monday of the month at 7:00pm at the recreation center. Our meetings have an agenda and are short. Please consider being included in making decisions regarding your neighborhood landscape.

- 1. Trim and shape shrubs and hedges to a desired size before the growing season starts. Consider the possibility of giving your plants a new shape. Possible shapes are pyramids, cylinders, mushrooms, poodles, multi-tiered tabletops, spirals (junipers), bonsai (mature junipers), slanted (long hedges), and undulating waves. Whee! You can have a lot of fun here! If your plants are out of shape, the substance is amenable to trimming into a different shape. Look carefully, and do not be afraid to cut, using hand clippers to remove targeted limbs or foliage, and then fine-tuning the shape with shears.
- 2. Clean out leaves and pull weeds from flower beds.
- **3. Prune roses** to a third of their height, to remove spindly growth and fortify structure. Remove deadwood as well as the deadwood draws energy from the plants. A desired, uniform shape can be established at this time for all the roses. The roses can be fertilized at this time with Color Star blooming fertilizer, which contains bone meal and blood meal. In addition, fish meal fertilizer is also available as a natural supplement.

The next Landscape Committee meeting will be held on April 11th, 7 pm in the Clubhouse.

A rabies tag is great for ID, but, many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and, the finder may not be able to keep your pet several days.
