The Role of the Deeds Committee

After almost 43 years, Deerfield is aging very well, but there are things that need to be addressed and the Deeds Committee needs your help to keep Deerfield looking great. The vast majority of you take pride in how your house and yard looks and work hard to maintain that and the Deeds Committee wants to thank you for all your efforts.

The Committee is working with the Board to update our processes and communications so it will be easier for our residents to understand what the Protective Covenants require. Below are the two primary responsibilities that the Deeds Committee focuses on:

 To evaluate and respond to deeds violations (things that do not meet the standards set in the Protective Covenants). These are identified by either a resident complaint (your neighbors) or through our normal monitoring. The violations are initially addressed by sending a letter to communicate the issue and asking for it to be resolved. If you do get a letter from Deeds about a violation, please take care of the issue promptly. A very high percentage of you do that and the process ends quickly and Deerfield continues to look good.

But there is a small percentage who seem to not care and ignore the request, so then Deeds has to send additional letters and potentially involve our attorney. This costs DVCA additional time and money. And even then, there are some people who still do not respond.

As a result we are developing a new approach to deal with those perpetual violators that will have financial implications. This is not something we want to do, but it seems that times have changed and it has become necessary. So if you have received multiple letters for violations from Deeds, please get them resolved before we start implementation of our new approach.

2. To maintain the quality of our neighborhood by evaluating any external maintenance, changes or enhancements to your property. This is done via the Architectural Approval (AA) form and process. Many of you already use the AA process and we thank you for that. For the others, it is to your advantage to follow the process, since there have been cases where people have not received prior approval and have had to incur the expense of modifying or completely redoing what they had done. This can be very costly and we don't want it to happen to you!

Keep Deerfield Bright at Night...

Please report Street Lights and Greenbelt Lights that are out to the DVCA Office; phone: 281-463-2624. It is necessary to provide the pole number and the location address of the pole that is being reported. Street Lights that are not on the Greenbelt and not in the Patio Home Section may be reported directly to Center-Point Energy at the following website:

http://www.centerpointenergy.com Click on the "Report a Streetlight Outage" located in the middle of the page. You can then click the "request form" and complete the requested information and submit.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Waste Corporation of America: 281-368-8397. Hours of operation are 7 am to 7 pm, office hours are 7 am to 4 pm. Pick-up days are Tuesday and Friday. Heavy trash day is Friday, limit 1 heavy item per service day per household. Please do not put your trash out until Monday or Thursday evening.

So if you are making changes or improvements (including painting) to your house, please get an Architectural Approval form submitted and approved before you start the work. For many items, this is a pretty simple process and the approval should come quickly. For other more complex items, it may require a review by the committee. We are working to make that faster and easier.

If you will help us by keeping your property maintained and in order (details in the following article) and by using Architectural Approval forms, we will be able to send less of the unwanted and dreaded Deeds letters and all of our lives will be better. Please help us keep Deerfield the neighborhood we all want to live in!

The Deeds Committee meets in the Club house on the first Monday of the month. Our next meeting will be on June 4th and July 2nd.

Things to do to keep the dreaded Deeds letter at bay!

- If you are making changes or improvements (including painting) to your house, please get an Architectural Approval form submitted and approved before you start the work.
- 2. Please get your yards mowed, weeds pulled or trimmed, bushes and shrubs trimmed, and in general get and keep the yard spruced up and neat. This includes the expansion joints and cracks on your driveway and sidewalks.
- Please deal with the mulch bags that are in view from the street. Either get the mulch spread or move the bags out of view from the street.
- 4. Please clean any mold and mildew on the exterior of the house or in other visible places.
- 5. Please repair, repaint or replace any siding, shutters or trim on your home that that has rotted or where the paint is in poor condition.
- 6. Please make sure your gutters are hanging well and not filled up with dirt and growing weeds.
- 7. In general, take a long look at your house and landscape and if you see something that doesn't look good, please get it taken care of. Everyone will appreciate your efforts to keep Deerfield beautiful!
- 8. Please do not put your trash or lawn service bags out on the curb until Monday or Thursday evening. And if you use trash cans and/or recycling bins, please have them put away by Wednesday or Saturday morning.
- 9. No boats, trailers, campers, inoperative vehicles, etc. may be parked permanently or semi-permanently on the street or driveway.
- 10. Please address any cars or vehicles that have been parked in the yard next to your driveway. It is not allowed. Due to Harvey and all the people who were displaced, we were being lenient on this, but after

nine months it's time to follow the covenants again.

- 11. Please keep your pets (cats and dogs) supervised, controlled and restrained as there have been several pet related complaints recently.
- This is not an all extensive list, but covers many of the common issues that we have to deal with.

Deerfield, we have a trash problem

We are having a problem with trash bags being put out (typically by your lawn service) on the curb prior to the Monday or Thursday evening, and with trash cans and recycling bins being left out long after the trash was collected.

It really looks bad, is happening too often and we are getting lots of complaints from our residents (your neighbors). If you have a lawn service that does this or are one who doesn't bring in your bins or cans in a timely fashion, please be a good neighbor and get this addressed. This is an issue that each of you can resolve by acting proactively. It would be greatly appreciated by those who live near you or drive by your house.

Be aware that we are looking into an approach to deal with items left on the street when they are not supposed to be that will be charged back to you on a per item basis. From what we have found, this will not be inexpensive. We don't want to go down this route, but we are required to help keep Deerfield safe, clean and looking good, and this is a way to do it if some of our residents won't comply.

Security Committee

We have a few security related items with which we need your help on.

- 1. Driving too fast in Deerfield. We are having more reports of people driving poorly or too fast on our streets, especially on the main streets like Oak Hampton, Deerfield Village Drive, Heathersage, Bradstone, Tarnbrook and Farnsfield. There was one report of a car speeding by a bus that was picking up students for school. That is unacceptable! Also our own SEAL patrol, doing their normal slow patrol of Deerfield, was hit by one of our residents that who was subsequently ticketed by HCSO. Due to the above, we are asking the Sheriff to come in randomly to patrol our streets and ticket the violators. Please don't be one of them!
- 2. Illegal ATV on the Greenbelt. We continue to have someone (and we are pretty sure it is one of our residents and know who it is) speeding down the Greenbelt and common areas on an ATV in the evenings and at night. On April 29 the Cy-Fair ISD Police was involved chasing this individual. If you know who this person is or if you see another occurrence, please take a picture or video of it and report it to SEAL and the DVCA office. We need one more piece of evidence before the Board can prosecute to the highest level legally allowed.
- 3. Loose pet issues (cats and dogs). These have increased in recent months, so please keep your pets supervised, controlled and restrained.

Pickleball, are you interested?

OK, what the heck is pickleball?



Glad you asked! It's a fun new game that is quickly growing in popularity. Pickleball is a paddle sport that combines elements of badminton, tennis, and table tennis. Two or four players use solid paddles made of wood

or composite materials to hit a perforated polymer ball, similar to a Wiffle Ball, over a net. This is one of the fastest growing sport, 40% growth year to year since 2014. The rules are simple and the game is easy for all ages, since it is half the size of a regular tennis court. You can place two Pickleball courts on a single tennis court, and the ball is light weight, so it does not move as fast as a regular tennis ball. There is now a US Open for Pickleball, and believe it or not, it has its own Channel.

So why am I talking to you about Pickleball?

I am interested to see if anyone would like to play Pickleball in Deerfield. To play we would need to add Pickleball lines to 1 of the 4 tennis courts. Residents could still use all 4 tennis courts, but you would also have 2 Pickleball courts. There are many subdivisions around us



that have added this game to their tennis courts, and others are in the process of evaluating it. Currently the tennis committee is evaluating the request for 2 Pickleball courts, but they really need input from residents. I've proposed having a Pickleball day or weekend, where residents can come and find out if they are interested. Proposed date is June 24th, after 4 pm.

What can I do, I'm interested?

You can let us know your interest by doing on of the following, 1. Coming to play with us on June 24th, we will have paddles and balls for you to use; 2. Complete a brief survey online http://deerfieldvillageonline.com/pickleball/3. Come to the next tennis committee meeting and let us know your thoughts, Wednesday, June 6th at 8PM. There is no cost to the association for Pickleball day, and it would be a new amenity for all residents if approved. In fact, even if you can't play, let us if know you think this would be a great addition for all current or future residents in Deerfield!

Pet Hotline News

- Make sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were microchipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- If you are going out of town and have a pet sitter, let Marie know your pets name, what it looks like (a picture is also great), and a contact number.
- And if you are thinking about owning a pet Ask yourself IF:
 - You have time to get its shots and check for heartworms
 - You have time to get a collar with ID and a phone number on the tag
 - You have time to walk it on a leash and PICK UP THE POOP.
 - You have the money, time and commitment to care for a pet.

IF you answer NO to any of these questions, maybe you should NOT get a pet.

Financial Services Committee

The overage shown above continues to be due mostly to timing: some expenses were incurred earlier than the year than they were budgeted.

The YTD assessment collection rate is 95.8%. This is 0.1% less than the 2017 comparable rate.



MUD 136 Report

At its May meeting, the Board reviewed the District's operations. During the previous month, more than 12 million gallons of water were provided to customers. Normally, 100% of the water would come from the West Harris County Regional Water Authority (WHCRWA), who purchase the water from the City of Houston. However, due to water pipeline repairs, the City stopped delivery for almost two weeks. WHCRWA in turn stopped delivery to us. We switched to our own well and used it to provide ten of the 12 million gallons produced during the month. But, no matter which is the source, the water you receive meets or exceeds all quality standards for potable water. The City treats the water it produces. WHCRWA monitors the quality of that water when received at their Jersey Village distribution facility. Lastly, It is analyzed at our water plant . If further treatment is needed, it is done using our injection facilities.

REMINDER: Since chloromines are used in water treatment, the water cannot be used in dialysis machines or fish tanks. Annually we publish the Drinking Water Quality Report for our District. A link to the electronic version of the report will be posted in your June water bill. Also, the report will be posted on the District's website (www.hcmud136.org). Please take the time to read it, as it contains very important information about the water we provide. The report confirms that "our drinking water meets or exceeds all federal drinking water requirements".

If you have questions about water quality or any other District matter, plan to attend the next monthly meeting on Thursday, June 14, 6pm, at the Rec Center.




