President's Report

Happy New Year, Deerfield Residents!

There is no garbage pickup on January 1st, New Year's Day. Please be sure to wait for the Friday morning, January 4th to put out your trash. Help Deerfield stay looking good by not placing trash at the curb before the day of pickup.

On January 1st, we will have our annual Polar Bear Swim at the community pool. It's a New Year Tradition with some of our residents, so come take a dip in the cold water...if you dare!

Please be sure that you have mailed-in your Annual Assessment, as it is due by January 1st, and becomes delinquent after January 31st, 2019. Late fees is \$100, and interest will accrue after the 31st. New residents, if you have not received an invoice or unsure, please contact the office (281-463-2624) before the January 31st delinquent cut-off.

Please take a minute to read the article from our MUD #136, as they are changing trash and recycling vendors in 2019.

I understand there is interest in having a street sweeper come through Deerfield, perhaps in the fall when the leaves cover the street, and after a holiday where fireworks can litter the streets. I will speak with Harris County and see if they offer that service or if that is on us to pick up the tab with a private firm. If there is a cost and unless it is minimal, this may not be feasible. That being said, we are looking into this as an option to keep our streets clean, and reducing the leaves filling up the storm drains.

A reminder that 2019 DVCA Trustee Elections are coming in March 2019, and if you are interested in running for election, fill out an application. Applications are available on our website or in this newsletter, and 3 spots are available. Deadline is February 11th, 2019.

Keep Deerfield Bright at Night...

Please report Street Lights and Greenbelt Lights that are out to the DVCA Office; phone: 281-463-2624. It is necessary to provide the pole number and the location address of the pole that is being reported. Street Lights that are not on the Greenbelt and not in the Patio Home Section may be reported directly to Center-Point Energy at the following website:

http://www.centerpointenergy.com Click on the "Report a Streetlight Outage" located in the middle of the page. You can then click the "request form" and complete the requested information and submit.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Please know that there is a 15 bag limit in regards to yard debris per service day. Anything over this limit must be negotiated between the home owner and Waste Corporation of America: 281-368-8397. Hours of operation are 7 am to 7 pm, office hours are 7 am to 4 pm. Pick-up days are Tuesday and Friday. Heavy trash day is Friday, limit 1 heavy item per service day per household. Please do not put your trash out until Monday or Thursday evening.

Deeds Committee

The Deeds committee hopes everyone had a wonderful holiday season filled with joy and laughter. Thanks to all of you that put up lights and displays. It really made Deerfield look festive and there were some that were just awesome. Unfortunately we still had grinches who put piles of trash bags at the end of the driveway for the entire long holiday weekend that took away from the attractive environment others had created. Please be a considerate and think about how your actions impact the way Deerfield looks.

We want to thank all of the residents who have worked hard to keep their yard and house looking good and in general makes our neighborhood look very attractive. Your efforts are really appreciated and they make a big difference.

To help things stay attractive, Deeds is doing two things to assist you in your 2019 plans to keep your house and yard spruced up.

- We are canvassing the neighborhood and identifying things that could be addressed that would help improve the curb appeal of your home. Many of you will be getting a letter with items that have been identified as things to take care of such as mold and mildew, falling gutters and downspouts, broken and leaning mail boxes, etc. or general yard upkeep items like weeding and trimming bushes. We would ask you to consider taking care of these issues before they become something Deeds needs to address officially.
- As stated before, our wonderful mature trees are making it very hard to grow grass, and many of us have yards that look pretty ragged because of it. We are providing some pictures of options, other than battling with growing grass, for you to consider. They show rock gardens, monkey grass, jasmine, ivy, and ferns as ways to update the areas under you trees that look great and is so much better than roots, weeds and dirt. Mulch and other ground covers are also options. If you have a yard that is in decline please consider options like these.

One more item. Last month we included in the newsletter a copy of the Deed Restriction Quick Reference to help you better understand what the Deeds Committee works to enforce. Unfortunately it seems to have caused some confusion, so we want to clear that up. That document is a Quick Reference and a general summary of the main covenants. It does not include all the covenants, nor all the details documented in the actual covenants. The actual covenants are what rules – this list is just a help for the residents to generally understand the covenants.

Security Committee

The Security Committee hopes everyone had a great holiday season. From a security standpoint, Deerfield did. Thankfully, it was another pretty quiet month and your efforts in being vigilant to report suspicious activity continues to be strong. SEAL's biggest activity (other than driving around and showing their presence) is following up on your reports of things that look suspicious. Please keep it up!

During the holidays many houses were lit up and festive. This brightened up the neighborhood and made things safer. In the new year you may want to consider brightening up your yard with more lights so we have brighter areas year round.

Just as a reminder: here are some things you can do to keep Deerfield safe:

1. Stay vigilant and report any suspicious activity, especially after dark.

2. Park in your garage or driveway. Vehicles on the street are easier targets.

3. Lock your vehicles especially if they are left on the street or driveway.

4. Keep your overhead garage door and entry doors closed and locked.

5. Add a video security system for your house. It may help if an incident occurs.

6. Add outdoor lights and keep them on at night. Lights fight crime!

7. Report any streetlights that are out.

We're always looking for more volunteers to help keep Deerfield safe. Maybe 2019 is the year for you to join! Our next meetings will be at 7PM on Wednesday January 2nd and Tuesday, February 5th.

We normally meet on the 1st Tuesday of the month, but in January needed to move the meeting due to the New Year holiday.

We hope to see you at one of our meetings.

She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.

NAM' program underwent a major expansion in 2016 when four additional zip codes in the Bear Creek area were added. Since then, NAM serves over 150 seniors out of the satellite site at LifePath Church on West Little York. Volunteers, an essential part of the program, pick up meals each morning for 7 routes. Volunteers choose how often they can serve-whether that's once a week, once a month, or anywhere in between. Congregations, clubs, businesses, and other groups can also adopt a route, sharing the schedule between their members or employees.

A few months ago the Thursday Morning Men's Group erected



MUD 136 Report

We'd like to wish our friends and neighbors a happy, productive, and healthy holiday season, and New Year. For those of us fortunate to be affiliated with Harris County MUD 136, 2018 was a very good year filled with important accomplishments and a recovery from the disastrous Hurricane Harvey that affected the lives of so many. Although Deerfield Village escaped major dislocation and damage, we are nevertheless diligent in making sure we can withstand nature's assault should it happen again.

To this end, in 2018 we started the process of designing substantial improvements to our operations and controls at the water plant off Spellbrook Dr. Although HCMUD 136 receives the bulk of its water from the WHCRWA, we're tasked with delivering it to our customers and maintaining our primary water well as an emergency source. The plant is over 40 years old and needs substantial rehabilitation which will give us the opportunity to raise controls several feet to avoid the possibility of future flooding.

2019 will unfortunately bring another fee increase by the West Harris County Regional Water Authority (www.whcrwa.com), from \$3.10 per 1000 gallons to \$3.35 per 1000 gallons. MUD 136 has no choice but to pass on these fees to its customers. This increase was effective January 1, 2019. A typical residential water customer with 10,000 gallons a month use will see a fee increase of \$ 2.50 per month or \$30 / year. This is in addition to fees we charge for distribution of water, operating the wastewater collection system, and recycling and trash service.

NEW!! Beginning February 1, 2019 we'll have a new solid waste and recycling contractor- Texas Pride Disposal (www. texaspridedisposal.com). Texas Pride Disposal will handle both our solid waste and trash collection, AND recycling. TPD's contract fees for the next 3 years (locked in) are \$14.65 per month per household for twice weekly curbside garbage collection and once weekly curbside clean recycling collection.

Deerfield Village's collection days will not change under the new contract - still Tuesday and Friday - and TPD will distribute its new 18 gallon recycling containers during January. Customers will maintain the option of using their own recycling containers as long as they're marked sufficiently. They will continue to collect basically the same materials as our previous contractor. Details can be found on TPD's website as well as the HCMUD 136 website. Customers will still use their own trash cans.

Finally, WHCRWA has issued preliminary plans for the 84" diameter water line to be laid in the east-west easement currently containing their 36" water line. We are requesting that WHCRWA provide an in-depth public presentation regarding the timing and construction of this water line segment (probably in 2020 or 2021) to our community during the next few months. Once we set a meeting date, time and place we'll announce it here, on social media, and elsewhere. This is a huge, potentially disruptive project and you deserve to have serious input.

If you have questions or comments about any District business, plan to attend our next public meeting, which will be held on Thursday, January 10, 2019 at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.

Financial Services Committee

Meetings are normally on the 3rd Tuesday of the month to review the financial status of our community. However, we will not hold a meeting in December due to the exigencies of that very busy time of year. Therefore, the next meeting date is Tuesday January 15, 2019 at 7:00 PM.

The YTD assessment collection rate is 98.1%. This is 0.3% less than the 2017 comparable rate. Over the past few months we have also collected \$123,417 in 2019 assessment prepayments. On October 15 meeting the Deerfield Board approved 2010 assessment rates of \$750 for patie between

2019 assessment rates of \$750 for patio homes and \$670 for all others, an increase of \$20 per residence over the 2018 rate. Please note that:

- Assessments are due December 31, 2018. - Assessment invoices were mailed in October. If you have not received yours, please contact Cheryl at CMS (our management company) directly at 281-296-9775, x207 and identify yourself as a Deerfield resident.

- The initial invoices mailed to patio homeowners were incorrect, but corrected invoices have been mailed. If you own a patio home and your invoice is not for \$750, you are looking at the earlier, incorrect invoice. The assessment for patio homes is \$750 regardless of what your invoice might say.

- New residents, please be aware that your Deerfield HOA assessment is not included in your escrow account, and must be paid separately.

- Payment plans are available, but must be set up before the due date to avoid the late penalty.

2019 Assessments

If you have not received your 2019 statement, please call 281-296-9775, Ext. 207 and speak with Cheryl.

Assessments are due by December 31, 2018. A late fee of \$ 100.00 will be charged to any accounts remaining unpaid on February 1, 2019.
