President's Report

Greetings Neighbor,

I will start out this month with a reminder, please observe all traffic laws in Deerfield when you are coming and going. Watch your speed and come to a complete stop is not a suggestion, it is the law. With kids going to bus stops in the morning and afternoon, take the extra time in our community to yield, even if you are in a hurry. Earlier this year we did have an incident with a bus of kids. Thank you!

<u>Fence</u>

The big topic of discussion this month is the perimeter fence project. Those of you that are following my reports in the newsletter know that a year ago we created a Fence Committee, which has diligently looked at what it would take to make this happen. These members understand that this has been attempted several times over the past 30 years unsuccessfully, but have the support from the current Deerfield Board to review it again and come up with a different approach and/or solutions. Of course, that will not solve the fact that some residents don't believe the fence should be financed by the HOA. Still there is much to gain by having a uniform fence, maintained by the HOA, and it is the first thing residents and potential residents see when looking at a neighborhood. New subdivisions being built around us require the HOA to maintain the perimeter fence, and all residents contribute and enjoy that fence equally. Unfortunately, that was not done when Deerfield was constructed, and there is little guidance on how these fences are to be constructed in our Deeds Covenants. As a result, it makes for inconsistent fences, aging at different times and in some cases different heights. After much work, the Fence Committee has found a way to make a community fence possible, with no special assessment and divided over 10 years with a minimal increase to the annual assessment. Over the years we have accumulated reserves for projects, and I believe this is good option, and financing the project is an alternative. We are not looking at doing a grandiose brick fence or precast fencing in the 2-million-dollar

range, but the current recommendation presented at the August Board meeting was a max of 600K for a 15year fence. If you think on how much we spend/budget on other amenities, such as Security \$250K per year or Swim Pool and Community Services combined at \$175K per year, it is a worthwhile investment in our community that we all can benefit from.

Bottom line, the Fence Committee will be meeting with the Board on September 11th, at 7PM in the Clubhouse to review the proposal and take the next step(s). While obstacles remain, if the Board approves these next steps, the result(s) could be huge in making this project happen. I encourage you to attend the September 11th meeting, if this is a project you would like to understand more about. It was said that the HOA may not have communicated enough about this project, but frankly it is difficult to have discussions when you don't have the core answers. Now the Fence Committee feels that it has enough information to answer questions and make a recommendation. Look forward to seeing you there.

Don't forget about Trunk or Treat for the kids on Halloween, Oct. 31st, starting at 5PM at the Recreation Center parking lot. Those wanting to participate should to be there and parked by 4:45! Costumes and decorations are nice, but not required.

Keep Deerfield Bright at Night...

Please report Street Lights and Greenbelt Lights that are out to the DVCA Office; phone: 281-463-2624. It is necessary to provide the pole number and the location address of the pole that is being reported. Street Lights that are not on the Greenbelt and not in the Patio Home Section may be reported directly to Center-Point Energy at the following website:

http://www.centerpointenergy.com Click on the "Report a Streetlight Outage" located in the middle of the page. You can then click the "request form" and complete the requested information and submit.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains.

Please make certain that the grass/yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

Security Committee

Deerfield Village remains fairly quiet from a security standpoint. One area of concern is that there have been reports of homeless people wandering around our streets. SEAL has been addressing these situations as they observe them or are made aware of them. Please report any incidents you see and remain vigilant to report any other suspicious activity to SEAL.

The Security Committee has gone through the budget process for 2020 and is requesting less than we did in 2019, as we have been able to maintain control over our costs.

The office continues to receive complaints about illegal parking on the streets in Deerfield and is also getting reports of the Harris County Sherriff Office (HCSO) being called to address issues that exist. Please follow the law and be considerate of others when you park. If you see a violation, it would be nice if you talked to the person who parked the car before you call the Harris County Sherriff Office (HCSO) non-emergency line and report the problem. But that is your choice. HCSO can give a warning, ticket or have the vehicle towed and we have heard of the first two happening in the last month.

We continue to get complaints about people driving too fast on our streets, especially on the main thoroughfares. Remember school is now back in session so watch out for the children. Please slow down and drive courteously!

As a reminder, here is what we suggest you do if a security related situation occurs:

- If you feel threatened or your life or property is in danger, call 911 and get the Harris County Sheriff involved. Then call SEAL if you can.
- If you see something that just looks suspicious, call SEAL and let them come to check things out.

The Security Committee typically meets on 1st Tuesday of the month, but due to the Holiday the September meeting has been moved to September 10. The October meeting will be on October 1st. We meet at 7PM and welcome anyone interested.

MUD 136 Report

At its August meeting, the Board reviewed the District's water and sewer operations during the month of July. Water production for the month was 19,200,000 gallons vs 16,200,000 gallons last year. Year-to-date figures are 90.1 million gal. in 2019 vs 91.5 million gal in 2018. In the Winter and Spring months the District provides between 8 and 10 million gallons of water per month. In the Summer it ranges between 16 and 22 million gallons. Those additional gallons go mainly for watering residential landscape. If all of that watering were to be done between the hours of 10 am and 4 pm, millions of gallons will be lost to evaporation. That is why one of the most important steps in water conservation is to water in the early morning or late evening.

Historically Texas has experienced some level of drought in eight of the past twelve years. Even though we are not currently experiencing the extreme drought conditions of 2011, we have already reached the level of Abnormally Dry. For the most current information, check the U.S. Drought Monitor at https://www.drought.gov/drought/ node/25. Since dry climate will continue to be a problem for us, the need for water conservation will also continue.

Please be water wise. Tips on how to do this can be found on the Texas A&M website (www.aggie-horticulture. tamu.edu). The West Harris County Regional Water Authority website (www.whcrwa.com) also has valuable information.

If you have questions or comments about any of the District's business, plan to attend the next District meeting, which will be held on Thursday, September 12, at the Rec Center beginning at 6PM.

Pet Hotline News

- Wake sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- W If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were microchipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- K If you are going out of town and have a pet sitter, let Marie know your pets name, what it looks like (a picture is also great), and a contact number.

Fitness with Fido

Although it seems late in the season, Houston still has at least 2 ¹/₂ months of summer heat left in 2019.

We love our Greenbelt, but PLEASE note the conditions before you head out with Fido for a bike ride, run or power walk. Here are some safety and health tips you should consider:



- Never run or bike with puppies under a year old.
- Avoid temps hotter than 85°F with high humidity and stay in the shade.
- Allow access to grass along paved paths. •
- Pay attention to your furry friend and stop when s/he pants heavily or looks distressed.
- Limit exercising with them to 30 minutes and bring a water bottle for them.
- Warm up and cool down with a slow walk to reduce stress on their joints and to give them a chance to sniff and relieve themselves where you can clean up after them.

Remember that dogs regulate body heat only by panting and know that their normal temperature is much warmer than ours to begin with at 101°F. Using a harness puts less strain on their neck than a collar and keeps their airways open. Refrain from using a retractable leash which gives the owner less control. Dogs who are left out in the yard also need access to shade and water. As always, check with your Vet. Be kind to your pet!
