#### President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

We are watching the gulf closely, as September is a month for high tropical activity. In the event there is a section of Deerfield that loses power, we will offer the Clubhouse as an area you can charge your phone, check your email and grab some cool air, provided we have power at the facility.

Pipeline construction update - Tarnbrook is now open but be advised there is still traffic crossing during construction hours most of September. I understand that they will have all the pipes in the ground before the end of September. Then they will begin restoring sidewalks and lighting, staring the first week of October, going from the Wilson side and work their way to Barker Cypress. They are 30 days behind at this point, as sidewalks and lighting should have happened the first week of September. Neil and I continue to speak with the Project management on a weekly basis to keep the pressure on, in hopes to end this project soon.

Fence project update - We will have a Townhall on the fence project on September 8th at 7PM at the Clubhouse. Our fence contractor will be present to answer questions, as well as members of the fence committee and Board. We know we have residents with questions about the project and some of the delays. The Covid situation has caused issues with production on the Trex side, and the association had to absorb some of the price increases as a result. We also have had a few members in opposition of the fence project, and we are providing additional information in this meeting. Because of the delay, I have not sent out any invoices on the special assessment, but now that we have a path moving forward, this will be coming soon. I encourage anyone interested to attend.

If you are interested to participate in the fall garage sale on October 16th, registration has started, please visit our website and email your registration form to the office. See inside this newsletter for more information.

I encourage using the website, as you can register and pay at the same time, and this is Covid friendly.

Due to an increase in Covid-19 cases, we are requiring a mask when visiting the office. We have been informed by our pool company they are still having staffing issues with lifeguards, so it is possible that we have limited capacity on certain days in September. The SAYOR (Swim At Your Own Risk) program is not affected by this.

The next Board meeting is on 9/27 at 7PM in the Clubhouse, and all residents are invited to attend.

#### Nothing but water should go down our storm drains

Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience a problem with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

#### MUD 136 Report

The Harris County Municipal Utility District 136 monthly meeting was held remotely (via video conference using Zoom and tele-conference) for the final time in the foreseeable future. The meeting was held at the usual time of 6:00 P.M. on Thursday August 12, 2021.

The Board reviewed water and sanitary sewer operations from the previous month with presentations from our consultants, received an update from the District's Engineer pertaining to the Capital Improvement Project at the MUD 136 water plant, trash and recycling services, in addition to other agenda items pertinent to our District.

Work on the electrical improvement project at the District Water Plant is substantially complete but a couple of minor issues (including a couple of change order items) continue to delay final completion and release of a final payment to the Contractor (retainage release).

We are currently working to determine ownership of the storm sewer pipes that connect the drainage ditch along the greenbelt to Addicks Reservoir.

Director Worthington is finalizing planning work for the fall electronic recycling and shredding event on the morning of October 23rd. Keep an eye on the website and future newsletter for more information on the event.

As a reminder now that tropical storm activity is picking up in the gulf, residents can sign up to be included in the MUD's text alert system by texting "hcmud136" (without quotation marks) to 74121, creating an account using an email address at https://mobile-text-alerts.com/hcmud136. Registered residents will receive alerts about interruptions to water, sewer, or trash service.

Our next regular monthly meeting is scheduled for Thursday, September 9, 2021 at 6 P.M. We anticipate that this meeting will be in-person based on the State of Texas open meeting rules. Please visit our District website at WWW.HCMUD136.ORG for confirmation of the meeting location

#### SERVICE PROJECTS

We continued to upgrade the Poop Bag Dispensers on the greenbelt to make them tamper proof and held another successful Food Drive. #### **Landscape Committee**

The devastating effects of February's "Big Freeze" on vegetation in the subdivision are still being seen today and making it necessary to stress once again, that the planting of scrubs, flowers and other vegetation in common areas is prohibited, unless permission to do so is granted by the Homeowners Association.

The after effects of the "Big Freeze" have brought attention to this problem, because there are a few locations in the subdivision where such vegetation is obviously dead and homeowners who did the planting are not taking responsibility to remove the dead plants.

The Landscape Committee recognizes that homeowners may be well-meaning in wanting to enhance the exterior visual appeal of their homes by planting vegetation in adjacent common areas. But, such plantings are strictly prohibited.

Our lawn maintenance company has started removing dead shrubs in the common area killed by the freeze and committee members are discussing whether those shrubs should be replaced. Most of these shrubs are located along the fence line of Clay Road and Deerfield Village Drive.

Turning to the subject of trees in the common areas, we are still not out of the woods yet in responding to all the damage the "Big Freeze" did to our trees. In August, tree trimmers removed 11 trees killed by the February freeze. Since those trees were removed, additional trees have been identified that need to be removed – and there could be yet more.

These unplanned tree removals have blown a hole in our tree trimming budget and it will be early next year before we can resume to our annual tree trimming work.

This week we were notified by the playground equipment company that there has been a delay in the manufacturing of the playground equipment for the Vanbury Playground. The new projection indicates that installation will most likely occur in October.

The Landscape Committee meets the second Monday of every month. Our next meeting will be on September 13, 2021 at 7 p.m. in the small conference room at the Rec Center.

#### Financial Services Committee

The YTD assessment collection rate is 97.7%. This collection rate is 1.0% better than the comparable rate a year ago, and is 0.1% better than the same-date average for 2017 thru 2019.

Please prepare and plan for our 2022 assessment invoices coming soon!

The 2022 HOA invoices will be mailed out by November 1st of this year, and you should have already cleared up any previous 2021 outstanding balances. If not, please contact the office to get current or make a payment.

If you don't receive your invoice, please contact Cheryl Beisert at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a copy. **2022 Payment will be due by 1/01/2022. Payments received after 1/31/2022 are subject to a \$100.00 late fee!** 

Payment plans are available if you anticipate difficulty paying your assessment all in one lump sum. Contact Catherine at the Deerfield office, 281-463-2624, for details and to set up an appointment and contract. Payment plans can be set up to cover any remaining balances due for 2021 or prior years in addition to the 2022 assessment. If you have an outstanding balance, please make arrangements to pay it off as soon as possible!

Reminder: HOA fees (assessment invoices) are NEVER a component of a mortgage escrow. Payment will not be made by your mortgage company and therefore is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay.



#### **Deeds Committee**

As we are moving into September the humidity is still with us therefore, please take the time to remove any mold and mildew growth to be removed from the exterior of the home. Please evaluate the trees in your yard for pruning or removal and remember when having a tree removed, have the stump ground and removed as well. We have noticed many Palms that at this point have not come back to bloom, therefore they need to be removed. Remember that a homeowner is liable if the dead palm or tree falls on a neighbor's property and causes damage.

Deeds reminds homeowners to submit an Architectural Approval form (AA) to the office PRIOR to starting any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. The form can be found on the Deerfield Village website under Documents/Deeds Documents at <a href="https://deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/">https://deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/</a> or contact the office for information. Deeds works hard to get your request forms approved as quick as possible but always allow 3-10 days for processing in some cases up to 30 days. An AA is required to be submitted to the office if you would like to a dumpster, POD, or temporary storage unit in the driveway on your property.

Also, NO contractor signs are allowed in resident yards per the Protective Covenants.

The Protective Covenants also state... "all lots shall be kept in attractive condition...". therefore just a reminder to keep yards mowed, plant beds weeded, curbs edged and clean any debris in yards. No A/C window units are allowed in plain view from the street or common areas. This also applies to ensuring that all garbage cans and recycle bins to be removed the same day after trash service has picked up. Trash pickup is on Tuesdays and Fridays therefore, please remember -DO NOT PLACE TRASH OUT PRIOR to the NIGHT BEFORE. No one enjoys seeing trash sit for long.

Any homeowner who has a sidewalk on their property's yard is responsible for the maintenance or replacement of that sidewalk.

As usual no boats, trailers, campers, inoperative vehicles, etc. may be parked on a homeowner's property for over 72 hours. If you have friends or family with an RV visiting for more than 72 hours, the RV should be located to a nearby RV resort. Please note: DVCA does not control the county streets but any person can call sheriff's office to have an inoperable vehicle on the streets removed/towed especially if it is parked in wrong direction or blocking traffic.

- Make sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were micro-chipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- If you are going out of town and have a pet sitter, let Marie know your pets name, what it looks like (a picture is also great), and a contact number.
