President's Report

Deerfield Residents,

The Annual Meeting of the Members went well, and all the Committees did a great job reporting their accomplishments and goals for 2023. If you are interested in more detail, we have posted the minutes which include all the highlights from the Board and the Committees. The results of the election report state that Brent Burris, John Murphy and Hak Dickenson were reelected. Election details are also posted on the Election 2023 tab on our website. Congratulations!

We do have an open vacancy left by Gerry Hillard, so if you are interested, please contact Cat in the office by May 15th. Application must be turned in before then.

The Board will focus on policy review and updates, as this year many new property laws go into effect between June and September 2023. In parallel, the Guidelines Committee continues to review the Deeds Guidelines document, which will be presented to residents later this year in a town hall. The Board will also consider renaming the Deeds Committee to the Architectural Review Committee as it may make more sense to residents and be more consistent with Texas Property Code language. Their function would not change, only the name, but nothing has been decided.

The Board reviewed the current Flag policy at the April 24th Board meeting and has revised the flag policy to allow more types of flags, which are already being flown by many residents. This will allow school, spirit, foreign flags, etc, as long as they are in good taste, in additional to the American and Texas flag. Any flags that have offensive graphics or language are prohibited. We also ask that when flying multiple flags, that other flags are never flown above the American Flag. There is a limit to the number of flags, so it doesn't look like a used car lot residence. The new policy will go into effect after 1) legal review, 2) the recording to the Texas Property code agency and 3) posting on our website.

Our Finance Committee has done a great job providing more detailed information in the newsletter

on our financial health, and in a format that is easy to understand.

Landscape has been busy making sure the common areas and entrances are well kept and look great. They also addressed additional tree concerns and some sprinkler maintenance needs.

Swim pool committee is also gearing up for the summer, so check out the Pool Schedule posted on the website or near the gate entrance.

I understand that the Recreation & YES Committee has a record number of events this year, and the Spring Garage sale was a success. See the calendar on the website or in the newsletter.

Deborah Plattsmier, who works in the office with Catherine, has accepted a position at her church, and we are looking for someone to take on her duties. This is a paid position and experience in Excel and professional writing is a required skill. Nothing but water should go down our storm drains

Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience a problem with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

Swim Pool Committee

Summer swim is here, and we encourage everyone to check the Deerfield Village website for the current DVCA 2023 Summer Pool Schedule. My family and I are avid swimmers, and we look forward to the pool opening each year. I hope to see lots of my friends and neighbors come join us! As every year, just a reminder that A-Beautiful Pools management is hiring lifeguards for the summer. For mor details see the flyer information in this newsletter.

The pool is now open on weekends in MAY on Saturdays from 10am-9pm and on Sundays from 10am-8pm. Please note that our Deerfield Dolphins Swim Team will be having its "time trials" meet on Saturday, May 6, therefore the pool will not open until 2pm.

On Thursday, May 25th, the pool will open at Noon to begin the end of school party. After May 25, the pool will be open DAILY until school starts again in the fall.

Please note these exceptions: The pool will be closed on Mondays all summer, but S.A.Y.O.R. will be available for Monday swims. Monday exceptions include Memorial Day on May 29 and Labor Day in early September. Both days will be marked with a 10am-9pm opening and afternoon pool party. Also, the pool will open at 10:30am for the last week in May and the first two weeks of June to accommodate swim team practices.

New pool safety rule update: We would like to inform our residents of a significant change coming this summer. For the past years, children 10 and older were allowed to come to the pool without parental supervision. However, the state is now requiring the age to be 14. In addition, our pool management company reports Harris County will NOT be approving any waivers to allow any communities to have a different age limit. This news was disappointing to the Swimming Pool Committee members and if a waiver had been allowed, we would have requested it for our community.

Please remember every homeowner must have a Pool ID card registered through the Deerfield office to swim. If you already have one set up, there is no need to redo them yearly. The pool ID cards must remain in the pool office during the swim season. Please do not take cards home. Residents swimming when the pool is open are allowed to bring up to three guests and must remain with their quests during their time at the pool.

The Swim At Your Own Risk (S.A.Y.O.R.) program has begun and residents can sign up to swim during non-life guarded hours from 6am to 9pm. Residents must register through the office by signing a current 2023 Waiver & SAYOR pool rules including bringing a picture ID. Each year an updated waiver is required for this program. No guests are allowed for the SAYOR program. For more information to participate in the program contact the office by phone or email.

Also, a great place to find new friends is on the Deerfield Dolphin's Swim Team. The Dolphin season started with swim practices in April and registration is underway. To register for the Deerfield swim team - see website: https://deerfielddolphins.swimtopia.com/

Finally, our committee is always working to keep the pool area clean and looking great. We recently worked with The Men's Group, who graciously cleaned and repainted our bathroom floors as well as the Landscape Committee, which pulled dead and unsightly bushes from the pool area and replaced it with sod. We hope this will create more spaces for kids and families to lay out a towel and relax while soaking up the summer sun.

As always, the SPC loves to hear any suggestions from the community, and we welcome new members to our group. SPC meets the second Tuesday of each month at 7pm in the Clubhouse. Our next meeting is scheduled for May 9th.

Community Services

Happy Spring, everyone! It is about time for spring cleaning and getting ready before the hot summer. Warmer weather means the return of mosquitoes and other pests. Spring is the perfect time to survey your property and eliminate breeding grounds. The most common breeding grounds for mosquitoes are standing water, yard debris, clogged gutters and drains, and water for animals and birds.

- 1. Standing Water While you may know that stagnant water is the best place for mosquitoes to breed, you may not be aware of just how little of this water they actually need to do so. Mosquitoes don't need a wheelbarrow full of water or whole pond to reproduce; they can lay their eggs in as little as a bottle cap of water! It can be very difficult to get rid of every single source of standing water around your yard, so it's important to know some of the most common sources you may not be already aware of, including trashcan lids, buckets, flowerpots, grill covers, discarded cups, and tires. The easiest fix to these sources is to get rid of them. If you can't, drill holes in the bottoms so that water is able to drain when it rains and can't collect to make a perfect nest for mosquitoes.
- 2. Yard Debris To stay out of the wind, mosquitoes will often take refuge in debris that may be lying around your lawn. When bushes and grass go unchecked and overgrow, they become a perfect shelter from wind for mosquitoes. Grass clippings, raked leaves, piles of downed branches, and compost piles are all attractive hiding places for mosquitoes. If you've got yard debris around your home, do yourself a favor and get rid of it. Not only will it help minimize the number of mosquitoes in your yard, but your lawn will look even more beautiful than it already does!
- 3. Clogged Gutters and Drains A very common mistake many homeowners make is not to keep gutters and drains properly cleared. When leaves, pine needles and twigs are allowed to gather and clog drains, gutters, and drainage pipes, mosquitoes get an ideal home that's a combination of tips 1 and 2: standing water and a place to hide. With standing water trapped from debris in drains, mosquitoes are given everything they need to reproduce and invade your yard. One of the best ways to keep mosquitoes from your home is proper drain and gutter maintenance and cleaning!
- 4. Animal Bowls and Bird Baths When your pets get too hot, they need to cool off with a big bowl of water. However, you should never leave your pet's water bowl outside for extended periods of time. The undisturbed, fresh water will attract mosquitoes straight to your home. The same goes for bird baths--these provide a source of shallow, stagnant water for mosquitoes to lay

their eggs. The birds may be pretty, but mosquito bites certainly aren't!

As we did last year, Deerfield has contracted for a pest control company to treat sewers with larvicides regularly so that inaccessible standing water in the storm drainpipes won't provide breeding grounds. Spraying will be done same as last year on an as-needed basis.

Community Services meets the 1st Monday of the month. Our next meeting is scheduled for May 1st at 7pm in the Clubhouse.

Architectural Guidelines Committee

The AGC (Architectural Guidelines Committee) was established by the Board as a special committee to create Guidelines for Deeds and Homeowners to use and reference when considering or submitting an AA (Architectural Application). This would ensure that decisions made my Deeds would be consistent and fair over time, as volunteers come and go. These guidelines would also serve as a reference for any homeowner, as to what is approved or not approved. These guidelines are supported by the existing PC's (Protective Covenants), current state laws (Texas Property Code), and Policies and Guidelines approved by the Board. We are currently completing review of the amended document compilation. Once the draft is reviewed, it will go to legal to verify compliance with state laws and our governing documents. Once that edit is completed, it will be presented to Deeds and Homeowners for final review. We anticipate holding a Town Hall to discuss the document, which will be eventually presented to the Board for approval in 2023. Our next meeting is currently scheduled for May 10th at 4:30 in the Clubhouse.

2023 Assessments: Yearly Assessments are the source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association to the benefit of Deerfield residents. Assessments Invoices were mailed in November of last year and were due January 1 of this year. By now, you will have received yours and should have made payment. If you haven't received your invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Cheryl Beisert at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

2023 Collections: 2023 Assessment: collection rate as of March 31, 2023 is 89.8%. If you have not yet paid your assessment, your account has already incurred a Late Fee and interest charges are accruing. We encourage you to pay your assessment, either directly or contact the office to set up a payment plan, to end delinquency and further accrual of late payment penalties and interest.

As of the end of March, 63 new Assessment payment plans have been established and 9 of them have been paid in full. Five active payment plans remain from prior years; three of them from 2022.

MUD 136 Report

Harris County Municipal Utility District 136 Board of Director's monthly meeting was held in person on Thursday April 13th in the DVCA Recreation Center. Directors discussed various issues affecting the District and its customers.

We encourage everyone to sign up for MUD 136's text alert system by texting "hcmud136" (without quotation marks) to 74121, creating an account using an email address at https://mobiletext-alerts.com/hcmud136. Registered residents will receive timely alerts about interruptions to water, sewer, and trash service; drought conditions, weather emergencies, and other pertinent information.

Requests for service outside the District have been made by several entities, and the Board is evaluating whether or not providing service is in the best interests of HCMUD 136's customers. One request of note is by Harmony Public Schools which wants to develop a high school at the NW corner of Queenston and Clay Rd. The high school would have 850-870 students and staff. Harmony has requested water and sewer utilities from both Barker Cypress MUD and Jackrabbit Road PUD, and have been turned down by both for capacity and other reasons. They have now approached HCMUD 136 requesting only a sewer connection. MUD 136 directors are evaluating whether this makes financial and operational sense and will make a decision in the coming months.

Because of the WHCRWA rate increase January 1 we are all paying a lot more for water. Please take advantage of recent rains to temporarily turn off automatic sprinklers when appropriate. This saves money and the limited resource we all share.

Our next regular monthly meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 11, 2023 at 6 P.M. in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center Clubhouse. Agenda will be posted on our website: www.hcmud136.org

SERVICE PROJECTS:

This past month TMG held another successful Food Drive to benefit our local food pantry, Mesa Outreach, and we completed some misc. carpentry and electrical jobs. TMG did some trenching at the north end to relieve/ prevent the sidewalk flooding created by the new water line along the ROW. In addition, we did some touch up painting, cleaned out the Purple Martin houses and filled a number of sinkholes along the greenbelt. Other projects include power washing and repainting the Clay Rd. entrance sign, and repairing the sandbox at the playground.. We have begun repairing or replacing rusted parts on the greenbelt exercise equipment. TMG members painted the bathrooms in the pool area, pulled out dead bushes at the west end of the pool bldg. and sodded the area, and spread another truckload of much at the playground.(see below) " It's amazing what a team can accomplish when no individual wants the credit!"

COMMUNITY SERVICE TMG members volunteer with Meals on Wheels, at the Special Pals animal shelter, at hospitals, including the VA, CERT (emergency response), and at food pantries including Mesa Outreach. Several members mentor at schools, help with the Boy Scouts, and work with St. Vincent de Paul to aid the needy. Words that guide us, "You can't help everyone, but everyone can help someone."

MULCH MADNESS Each March we (the "old guys") haul and spread a huge truck load of mulch at the playground. We did the job on 3/16. Follow up chiropractic appointments are ongoing.

SURVEYS We recently completed a survey of the lights on the greenbelt and drew a map indicating the numbers that the electricians can use to locate them for maintenance.. We also surveyed the storm sewer drains to look for the info tags that were installed about 15 years ago. About 50 of the 160 tags are missing and the Boy Scouts have a project to replace them.

WEST SIDE STORY When the rose bushes were removed from the area on the west side of the clubhouse it exposed some really decrepit fence. We are in the process of replacing the damaged sections.

The Men's Group (TMG) meets weekly on Thursdays at 9:00 AM at the Rec Center. Besides our projects for DFV, and the community at large, we mix in some fun and fellowship which includes a monthly book club. In the coming months we are looking forward to eating out a few times and taking a couple of "road trips." We usually have a monthly Astros watch party. If this sounds like fun, then come and join us.

- BARK MULCH BAGS: Please do not store bark mulch, fertilizer and/or top soil bags in public view. If you are unable to spread the contents of the bags in the next week or two, move them to an area of your property that is not visible from the street or common area.
- 4. TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: Deeds continues to remind Homeowners because this continues to be an issue...Trash cans and recycling bins (including plastic trash bags with grass clippings) should be placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick up and removed from view the same day after pick up.
- DUMPSTERS AND/OR PODS: If your home project will require a dumpster and/or POD on your driveway for more than 72 hours, please submit an AA for approval. Any project requiring a dumpster or POD for less than 72 hours, does not require an AA.
- 6. LANDSCAPE: As we move into the growing season, your yard and flower beds should begin to be maintained on a weekly basis. Please mow and edge your lawn; remove weeds from flower beds; remove dead shrubs, trees or tree branches. Dead palm tree fronds should be removed.
- 7. FENCES: Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is seen from ANY common area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or common area. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under Deeds tab. If you wish to stain or paint your fence, submit an AA with a sample color for approval.

Deeds meets the 2nd Monday of the month at 7:00 PM at the Clubhouse. The next meeting will be held on May 8, 2023.

Security Committee

Securing Deerfield Village involves taking measures to deter and prevent crime, as well as ensuring the safety of its residents. Here are some suggestions that all residents can implement:

- 1. Install a security system: Consider installing a security system with cameras, motion sensors, and alarms. This will alert you and the authorities of any potential intruders, and can help deter criminals from targeting your neighborhood.
- 2. Install outdoor lighting: Install motion-activated outdoor lighting around your property to deter criminals and make it easier for neighbors to see any potential intruders.

- Make sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were micro-chipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- Please make sure your fence is secure so so your pets don't escape.
- PLEASE remember your pets, DON'T leave them in your hot car!
- PLEASE be a responsible pet owner, both cat and dog, and pick up their poop, thank you.
