## President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

The Board reviewed and approved the 2024 budget on October 19<sup>th</sup> at the Budget Board meeting. The approved Budget increases the annual community service charge by \$35 per household. The proposed Budget would be \$1,039,810 for operating income, operating expense of \$867,875, and the reserve request of \$112,11. The total budget has a projected surplus of \$15, 259 to partially restore unencumbered reserves. Residents should receive an invoice by mid-November. The Assessment is due January 1st, 2023. Payment plans are available if needed, please contact the office to set up a payment plan contract.

We are resurrecting the <u>Yard of the Month</u>, and for the holiday season it will be focused on decorations, and then recognizing some of the nicest yards in Deerfield throughout the year 2024. There will be two winners each month and several honorable mentions in the Newsletter. Winners can only win once a year, so we don't have the same yards win every month. I'm excited to try this new program and see if it makes an impact on Deerfield attractiveness.

We had a brutally hot summer this year, with little rain, which caused significant damage to shrubs, flower beds, grass, and we lost countless trees. Now that things are cooling off, and returning to normal, we are beginning the process of removing all the dead landscaping. I encourage you to do as much as you can when it comes to removing dead bushes and other landscaping, so we keep Deerfield looking good for the holiday season. You know who you are, and although there is not a "worst yard of the month", you don't want to get that letter from our Deeds Committee.

The 45<sup>th</sup> Annual Bazaar is November 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> at the Recreation Center facility. This is a magnificent event to support your neighbors and friends in the surrounding community, and it should put you in the holiday spirit! More information and times in this newsletter.

Election day reminder - Tuesday November 7th, from

7AM to 7PM. If you did not vote early, you can vote at the Clubhouse. This will be an official voting location, as we have done in the past.

They hauled 2 tons of electronics this year to Compucycle. Great job guys, we are very fortunate.

In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

# **Architectural Guidelines Committee**

The AGC (Architectural Guidelines Committee) was established by the Board as a special committee to create Guidelines for Deeds and Homeowners to use and reference when considering or submitting an AA (Architectural Application). These guidelines would also serve as a reference for any homeowner, as to what is approved or not approved. These guidelines are supported by the existing PC's (Protective Covenants), current state laws (Texas Property Code), and Policies and Guidelines approved by the Board. We have completed our review of the amended document. It is currently undergoing legal review to verify compliance with state laws and our governing documents. Once that edit is completed, it will be presented to Deeds and Homeowners. We anticipate holding a Town Hall to discuss the document, which will be eventually presented to the Board for approval. Our next meeting is currently scheduled for November 8th at 4:30 in the Clubhouse.

expense items that had been budgeted but have not yet been expended. As these expenditures are expected to occur later in the year, we make budget timing corrections where/when appropriate to present a more realistic estimate of Net Operating Income.

#### 2023 Assessments and Collections:

Yearly Assessments are the source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association to the benefit of Deerfield residents. Assessments Invoices were mailed in November of last year and were due January 1 of this year. By now you should have made payment. If you have not received your invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Cheryl Beisert at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

Collection rate as of the end of the month is 97.2% (vs 97.8% same-month-average for the previous 5 years). If you have not yet paid your assessment, your account has already incurred late fees and interest charges have been imposed and are accruing. We encourage

you to pay your assessment to end delinquency and further accrual of resultant late payment penalties and interest.

Year to date, 74 new assessment payment plans have been established and 61 of them have been paid in full. One special payment plan remains from prior years.

#### 2024 Budget:

The Financial Services Committee, working with the other committees, has developed a proposed 2024 DVCA budget and has sent it to the board for review. The board held a special open budget meeting on Oct. 19 to agree the budget for 2024.

## Landscape Committee

Landscape is focusing tree maintenance for the remainder of the year. Of course, we will soon be planting fall color around the Recreation center's clubhouse and the main entrances. We are also upgrading our holiday decorations this year.

The leaves will be falling soon and remember it is the homeowner's responsibility to clean up and dispose of leaves including pine needles on their lawns. Remember-Nothing should go into the storm sewers except rainwater.

The Landscape Committee meets the second Monday of every month at 7:00 PM in the small conference room across from the office. The exception is there is no meeting in December. Help keep our neighborhood beautiful and join our committee. Our next two meetings will be on Monday, November 13<sup>th</sup> and for the new year, January 8<sup>th</sup> 2024. Residents are welcome to come attend.





## **MUD** 136 Report

Harris County Municipal Utility District 136 Board of Director's monthly meeting was held on Thursday September 14th in the DVCA Recreation Center. Directors discussed various issues affecting the District and its customers.

Please sign up for MUD 136's text alert system by texting "hcmud136" (without quotation marks) to 74121, creating an account using an email address at <a href="https://mobiletext-alerts.com/hcmud136">https://mobiletext-alerts.com/hcmud136</a>. Registered residents will receive timely alerts about interruptions to water, sewer, and trash service; drought conditions, weather emergencies, and other pertinent information.

Due to this summer's record heat and lack of rain the District remains in Stage 1 of its Drought Contingency Plan. You can access the DCP on our website- <a href="http://www.hcmud136.org">http://www.hcmud136.org</a> This drought stage is voluntary, but we ask all customers to reduce water use by 10% and minimize non-essential water use and lawn watering between the hours of 10am and 6pm. West Harris County Regional Water Authority has invoked Stage 2 of their DCP. Customers will be notified if and when the DCP Stage 1 is terminated.

At its September 13 meeting the WHCRWA (our surface water supplier) announced NO increase in rates charged by the authority on January 1, 2024- for the first time in 18 years. This does not preclude the possibility of future rate hikes for surface water, which are necessarily passed through to our customers. For the time being this is GOOD news.

Our annual free Shredding and E-Cycling Event is Saturday, October 21, 2023, from 9:00am–2:00pm. In addition, there will be a drop off for recycling old eyeglasses. This event is hosted by HCMUD 136, the DVCA, and The Deerfield Mens Group. For Deerfield Village residents only.

At our meeting the Board agreed to a 2023 tax rate of \$0.15000 per \$100 of assessed valuation. This is a decrease from the 2022 rate of \$0.15500, and takes into account the average HCAD property valuation increase of 10.4%. The HCMUD 136 Board determined that due to our aging infrastructure there's an urgent need to rebuild our cash reserve for equipment and line replacement, rehabilitation, diagnostic projects, emergency repairs, and scheduled CIP improvements. Since we have no remaining bond authority and are debt-free, it's critical we rebuild our cash reserves. The notice of tax rate publication will be elsewhere in this newsletter.

Our next regular monthly meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 12, 2023 at 6 P.M. in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center Clubhouse. Agenda will be posted on our website: <a href="https://www.hcmud136.org">www.hcmud136.org</a>

#### **Tennis Committee**

The Tennis committee is always pleased to see many new residents enjoying the tennis courts. All residents are reminded to legibly sign up for court time with a FIRST and LAST NAME on the Sign-up sheets located on the office window at the Recreation center. The player themself must sign up for the courts. Players can now sign up for 2 hours at a time and no more than 3 guests per resident and household when playing.

All players are reminded to be respectful and considerate of other players during and after play on the courts. Once again, we remind everyone that profanity, loud noises, radios, music and/or unsportsmanlike behavior is not allowed on the courts. Please remove <u>any trash</u> from courts immediately after playing.

All players are encouraged to leave any old tennis balls they no longer want in the 2 blue Tennis Ball Recycling baskets located close to the court gates. Please refrain from using these for trash which should go in the trash cans outside the courts.

Reminder: ALL tennis and pickle ball players are respectfully reminded to ensure that the gates are closed after they have finished playing. By doing this it reduces the possibility of the courts being misused. The next Tennis Committee meeting will be at 7pm on Wednesday, November 1st in the clubhouse.

#### **Pet Hotline News**

- Make sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were micro-chipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- Please make sure your fence is secure so so your pets don't escape.
- PLEASE remember your pets, DON'T leave them in your hot car!
- ❖ PLEASE be a responsible pet owner, both cat and dog, and pick up their poop, thank you.

- 6. Add outdoor lights and keep them on at night. Lights fight crime!
- 7. Report any streetlights that are out to Center point.

## Deeds Committee

To those homeowners who submit Architectural Applications for approval of projects and who maintain their property in an attractive condition, the Deeds Committee whole-heartedly appreciates and thanks you!

For quick reference to keep the "dreaded" Deeds letter away, go to: <a href="https://deerfieldvillageonline.com/">https://deerfieldvillageonline.com/</a> wp-content/uploads/2019/09/Deeds-Primer.pdf

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https: deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/ or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- 3. **HAZARDOUS DEAD TREES & PALMS**: Towering dead palm trees are a <u>safety hazard</u>, especially during hurricane season. If dead palm trees are in your yard, they should be removed before they fall on yours or your neighbor's house.
- 4. **BARK MULCH/FERTILIZER BAGS**: Please do not store these bags on your driveway or in your flower beds. They should be stored out of public view.
- 5. FENCES: Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.

#### 6. PARKING:

- a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
- b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
- Be considerate! Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in Patio Homes.
- 7. TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.
