Nothing but water should go down our storm drains

Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience a problem with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.



Community Services

As the year draws to a close, the Community Services Committee is looking ahead to our work in 2024.

One of the Committee's areas of responsibility is the upkeep of the Recreation Center buildings. Over the years, we've managed siding repairs, roof replacement, caulking and painting, replacement of railings, maintenance of columns and gutters, outside lighting, and many other projects including pest control. Inside the buildings, we have contracted new flooring, furnishings, bathroom and kitchen remodels, and other projects to keep the buildings attractive and useable.

The buildings get a lot of use, from meetings of the Community Association's Committees and the Board, Northwest Aquatic League swim meets (Go Dolphins!), special interest meetings such as Quilting, Bunco, Dominos, Sewing, Scouts, Poker, Book Club and Yoga, private rental parties, the Holiday Bazaar, and other regular activities.

This year we accomplished our 2 goals from last year. The plumbing updates and modifications that have been needed such as painting the Recreation center and replacing the fencing around the AC units for 2023.

If anyone has an interest in helping our committee, please come to the monthly meeting of the Community Services Committee! We meet on the first Monday of each month at 7pm at the Recreation Center. There are currently five members of the committee. Our meetings typically last 30 minutes to an hour. Please note that our next meeting will be Monday, December 4 and there will not be a meeting in January of 2024. We are a very friendly group, so we hope to see you there!

SERVICE PROJECTS: This past month TMG held another successful Food Drive for Mesa Outreach, and we completed some misc. carpentry and electrical jobs. In addition, we repaired a number of the tennis benches, and one light pole. TMG cleared the small meeting room, painted the walls and ceiling, installed shelves and hung paintings. We power washed the Clay Rd. entrance sign and replaced the nets at the basketball court. "It's amazing what a team can accomplish when no individual wants the credit!"

BACK AT IT Each year TMG does not do any work on big outdoor projects during the brutally hot summer months. Now that the temps are more reasonable, we are working on several big projects each month.

COMMUNITY SERVICE TMG members volunteer with Meals on Wheels, at the Special Pals animal shelter, at hospitals, including the VA, CERT (emergency response), and at food pantries including Mesa Outreach. Several members mentor at schools, help with the Boy Scouts, and work with St. Vincent de Paul to aid the needy. Words that guide us, "You can't help everyone, but everyone can help someone."

<u>XMAS STOCKINGS</u> Once again this year TMG will be filling 60 stockings that will be distributed to our needy Meals on Wheels clients. Your donations at the Pancake Breakfasts fund this activity. A big thank you to the ladies of the Sewing Bees of Texas for making the stockings again this year.

<u>XMAS LIGHTS</u> TMG will be putting up the lights for another year. More lights will be added, and we will be installing lights at the north entrance now that the new electrical connections have been installed.

USED EYE GLASSES We collected quite a number of used eye glasses at the paper shredding event. So that we can continue this program, a bin has been installed on the gate by the ice machine where you can drop off your donations.

FOOD DRIVE The monthly Food Drive will be held Dec. 11-16. Please drop off your non-perishable donations in the box outside the office. Please, no glass containers or items past their expiration date.

The Men's Group (TMG) meets weekly on Thursdays at 9:00 AM at the Rec Center. Besides our projects for DFV, and the community at large, we mix in some fun and fellowship which includes a monthly book club. In the coming months we are looking forward to eating out a few times and taking a couple of "road trips." We usually have a monthly Astros watch party. If this sounds like fun, then come and join us.

Note: Financial statements often include certain expense items that had been budgeted but have not yet been expended. As these expenditures are expected to occur later in the year, we make budget timing corrections where/when appropriate to present a more realistic estimate of Net Operating Income.

2023 Assessments and Collections: Yearly Assessments are the source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association to the benefit of Deerfield residents. Assessments Invoices were mailed in November of 2022 and were due January 1, 2023. By now you should have made your payment. If you have not received your invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Cheryl Beisert at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

Collection rate as of the end of the month is 97.4% (vs 98.0% same-month-average for the previous 5 years). If you have not yet paid your assessment, your account has already incurred late fees and interest charges have

been imposed and are accruing. We encourage you to pay your assessment to end delinquency and further accrual of resultant late payment penalties and interest. Year to date, 74 new assessment payment plans have been established and 63 of them have been paid in full. One special payment plan remains from prior years.

2024 Budget and Assessment:

The 2024 DVCA budget, including an assessment increase of \$35 (3.9% increase over last year), was approved at the Oct. 19 special open budget meeting. The 2024 Assessment invoices were mailed in November and are due by January 1, 2024.

Landscape Committee

The Fall plantings around the clubhouse and the main entrances are in and flourishing in the recent rains. Two more rounds of tree trimming are in store for December and January.

The leaves will be falling soon, please remember it is the homeowner's responsibility to clean up and dispose of the leaves on their property responsibly. Nothing should go into the storm sewers except rainwater.

We had another tough summer, which was especially hard on red oaks, loblolly pines and magnolias. Residents are reminded that dead trees on their lots are their responsibility. Deerfield's arborist has offered special group rates on tree removal this December and January provided we can put together a couple of days' work. If you are interested, please contact the office and we will get you a quote and an estimated time frame.

This Spring we will be upgrading the greenery around the rec center. Anyone interested in helping to develop the plantings palette please let us know. Your knowledge and ideas are very welcome.

The Landscape Committee meets the second Monday of every month at 7:00 PM in the small meeting room across from the office. The exception is there is no meeting in December. Help keep our neighborhood beautiful and join our committee. Our next two meetings will be on Monday, January 8th and February 12th 2024. Everyone is welcome to attend.



MUD 136 Report

Harris County Municipal Utility District 136 Board of Director's monthly meeting was held on Thursday on November 9th in the DVCA Recreation Center. Directors discussed various issues affecting the District and its customers.

Please sign up for MUD 136's text alert system by texting "hcmud136" (without quotation marks) to 74121, creating an account using an email address at <u>mobiletext-alerts.com/hcmud136</u>. Registered residents will receive timely alerts about interruptions to water, sewer, and trash service, drought conditions, weather emergencies, and other pertinent information.

The West Harris County Regional Water Authority has rescinded the Stage 1 Drought status at their November meeting. Requested restrictions have been lifted.

Our annual free Shredding and E-Cycling Event is Saturday, October 21, 2023, from 9:00am–2:00pm. The event went smoothly and there were approximate 7,500lbs of paper products recycled and we almost filled up a 10' box truck with e-waste.

For Deerfield Village residents only. At our meeting the Board voted to approve a 2023 tax rate of \$0.15000 per \$100 of assessed valuation. This is a decrease from the 2022 rate of \$0.15500, and takes into account the average HCAD property valuation increase of 10.4%. The HCMUD 136 Board determined that due to our aging infrastructure there's an urgent need to rebuild our cash reserve for equipment and line replacement, rehabilitation, diagnostic projects, emergency repairs, and scheduled CIP improvements. Since we have no remaining bond authority and are debt-free, it's critical we rebuild our cash reserves.

All residents are reminded to legibly sign up for court time with a FIRST and LAST NAME on the Sign-up sheets located on the office window at the Recreation center. The player themself must sign up for the courts. Players can now sign up for 2 hours at a time and no more than 3 guests per resident and household when playing.

All players are reminded to be respectful and considerate of other players during and after play on the courts. Once again, we remind everyone that profanity, loud noises, radios, music and/or unsportsmanlike behavior is not allowed on the courts. Please remove any trash from courts immediately after playing.

All players are encouraged to leave any old tennis balls they no longer want in the 2 blue Tennis Ball Recycling baskets located close to the court gates. Please refrain from using these for trash which should go in the trash cans outside the courts.

Reminder: ALL tennis and pickle ball players are respectfully reminded to ensure that the gates are closed after they have finished playing. By doing this it reduces the possibility of the courts being misused.

Pet Hotline News

- Make sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were micro-chipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- Please make sure your fence is secure so so your pets don't escape.
- PLEASE remember your pets, DON'T leave them in your hot car!
- PLEASE be a responsible pet owner, both cat and dog, and pick up their poop, thank you.

Security Committee Holiday Safety Checklist

The holidays are upon us and along with the festivities we need to remember to be alert for criminal activity and overall personal safety.

- When out shopping always be alert. Before leaving a store, always have your keys in your hand. Keep your cell phone close by, using only if and when necessary. Remember, if you are distracted by talking or texting on your phone, it is an open invitation to criminals.
- 2. If you see something that makes you uncomfortable when walking to your vehicle, go back to the store and request an employee or security guard to watch or walk you to your vehicle.
- 3. Do not leave packages or other valuables in plain view inside your vehicle as this is an invitation for criminals.
- 4. When shopping, watch your purse and bags, thieves watch for any opportunity to catch you unaware. Do not leave your child, purse or other purchases in your basket and walk away to look at something further down the aisle.
- 5. When at home, lock your doors and use your alarm systems. Keep your garage door closed.
- 6. If you are traveling, put your home on Vacation Watch with SEAL. Put a vacation hold on your mail and newspaper or have a neighbor collect them for you. If possible, set up timers to go on and off at various times so that it appears that someone is home.
- 7. During extremely cold weather, remember the 3 P's: Pets, Plants, and Pipes. Bring pets inside or

provide a warm safe place for them to go, cover tender vegetation, and wrap pipes if needed. These precautions can save a lot of heartache and money!

8. Call and report any suspicious activity, persons, or vehicles you see right away! And in an emergency, Call 9-1-1!

Deeds Committee

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https: deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/ or contact the office at
 - 281-463-2624.
- LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- HAZARDOUS DEAD TREES & PALMS: Towering dead palm trees are a <u>safety hazard</u>, especially during hurricane season. If dead palm trees are in your yard, they should be removed before they fall on yours or your neighbor's house.
- 4. **BARK MULCH/FERTILIZER BAGS**: Please do not store these bags on your driveway or in your flower beds. They should be stored out of public view.
- 5. FENCES: Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.

6. PARKING:

- a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
- b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
- c. **Be considerate!** Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in Patio Homes.
- TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.
