Nothing but water should go down our storm drains

Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience a problem with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

Landscape Committee

The Landscape Committee kicked off this 2024 leap year with the re-election of our officers for one more year. Tom Gerrity continues as chairman supported by Steven Shelley as vice chair and Debra Fredette as secretary. The Committee welcomes our new officers as we always welcome new members to help make decisions that affect Deerfield Village's grounds maintenance, including lawn mowing, seasonal planting, tree trimming, sidewalk repair, playground maintenance and more. So, if you are thinking of becoming more active in your community, please join us on the second Monday of the month at 7PM.

The drought and freeze cycle continue and many of our trees are severely stressed. The first item on our maintenance itinerary this month is dead tree removal. If you need tree work on your property our arborist has offered good pricing if the work can be scheduled along with his regular Deerfield work. If you are interested, please contact the office and we will get you a quote.

This Spring we will be working on updating the shrub and perennial plantings around the club house and main entrance. The drought and freeze cycle took a big toll there as well. We go for sustainable and native plants. If you have ideas or comments about what to consider we would love to hear them. Please consider attending our next meeting.

The Landscape Committee meets the second Monday of each month in the small meeting room across from the office at 7PM. Our next two meetings are February 12th and March 11th. We hope to see you there.

Architectural <u>Guidelines Committee</u>

The AGC (Architectural Guidelines Committee) was established by the Board as a special committee to create Guidelines for Deeds and Homeowners to use and reference when considering or submitting an AA (Architectural Application). This would ensure that decisions made my Deeds would be consistent and fair over time, as volunteers come and go. These guidelines would also serve as a reference for any homeowner, as to what is approved or not approved. These guidelines are supported by the existing PC's (Protective Covenants), current state laws (Texas Property Code), and Policies and Guidelines approved by the Board. We have completed our review of the amended document. It is currently undergoing legal review to verify compliance with state laws and our governing documents. Once that document is completed, it will be presented to Deeds and Homeowners. We anticipate the document to be posted on our website for all to review by February 1st, 2024. We will hold our next meeting/Town hall on March 6th at 7PM in the Clubhouse. After considering residents and the Deeds Committee input from that meeting, it will be presented to the Board for approval on March 25th. We are looking forward to bringing this very important document across the finish line.

We reorganized the storage areas and assembled two table carts. TMG also reset sections of the greenbelt lights several times and changed the batteries on the timers. Swim Pool Committee

During the off season the Swimming Pool Committee works independently and with our pool management company, A-Beautiful Pools, to identify repairs we need to make to get the pool, pump house equipment, and pool deck in great shape for the summer season. Currently we are fixing a water leak in the men's restroom and having contact joints replaced around the perimeter of the pool as well as a couple of other routine fixes and needed maintenance. Our pool does not open until May.

In addition, our pool management company focuses on this time of year is recruiting and training lifeguards. For those who don't know this information, teens ages 15 and up can apply for this job. They will have an interview and, if hired, they will sign up for a two-day lifeguard certification course, which runs anywhere from \$100-\$200 depending on how early in the year they take the class. Once the class is completed, the trainees take a test at the end of day two and, if they pass, they will be good to go and ready to start lifeguarding. Many of our SPC parents have teens who have worked at the Deerfield pool and other neighboring pools, and we think it's a great summer job! If any of your teens, or even college students, are looking for summer work consider talking to them about becoming a lifeguard.

Community Services

After taking the month off in January, Community Services will resume meetings on the first Monday of each month on February 5th, followed by March 4th. Meetings are held at 7:00 pm at the Recreation Center, and usually last about 30 minutes.

The Community Services Committee handles a variety of issues related to maintenance and upkeep of Recreation Center facilities. In past years, we have contracted for repair and painting of building exteriors, replaced flooring, handled painting of interiors, refurbished and updated bathrooms and kitchens, supervised electrical and plumbing repairs, replaced worn-out rugs and furniture, updated lighting, and replaced roofing, among other activities needed as our facilities age. We are involved in pest control contracts, assist the Deerfield office with area lighting and electrical issues, and prepare annual budgets for all these areas. In short, we help to "maintain" Deerfield Village in attractive shape, as we are all long-time residents who have roots in the neighborhood and want it to continue to be a nice place to live. If you would like to help with this effort, please come to our meeting! We are a friendly and welcoming group.

In February, we expect to work on improving the walkways around the Rec Center, improving the surface to reduce the chance of slips and falls. We are also working to improve the lighting at the west end of the upstairs annex. Keep an eye open for these changes.

If you have other ideas for improvements to our facilities, come to the meeting and share them with us.

Note: Financial statements often include certain expense items that had been budgeted but have not yet been expended. As these expenditures are expected to occur later in the year, we make budget timing corrections where/when appropriate to present a more realistic estimate of Net Operating Income.

2023 Assessments and Collections:

Collection rate as of the end of December 2023 was 97.6% (vs 98.4% same-month-average for the previous 5 years). Outstanding assessment and fee charges from 2023 and previous years were included in the invoices sent for 2024.

2024 Assessment:

Yearly Assessments are the source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association to the benefit of Deerfield residents. Invoices for 2024 Assessments (and prior years) were mailed in November. They were due by January 1, 2024 and will be considered late after January 31, 2024. After that, late fees, interest, and other penalties will start to accrue. We encourage you to pay your assessment,

either directly or contact the office to set up a payment plan, to avoid delinquency and accrual of late payment penalties and interest. Amounts owed prior to the end of 2023 must be cleared before a payment plan for 2024 assessments can be considered.

If you have not received your 2024 invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Cheryl Beisert at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

<u>Tennis Committee</u>

The Tennis Committee is pleased to see many new residents enjoying the tennis courts. All residents are reminded to legibly sign up for court time with a FIRST and LAST NAME on the Sign-up sheets located on the office window at the Recreation center. The player themself must sign up for the courts. Players can sign up for 2 hours at a time and no more than 3 guests per resident and household when playing.

All players are reminded to be respectful and considerate of other players during and after play on the courts. We also remind everyone that profanity, loud noises, radios, music and/or unsportsmanlike behavior is not allowed on the courts.

Please remove <u>any trash</u> from courts immediately after playing which should go in the trash outside the courts. Please <u>refrain</u> from using the Blue Tennis Ball Recycling baskets on the courts for trash cans.

All players are encouraged to leave any old <u>used tennis</u> <u>balls</u> they no longer want in the two (2) <u>Blue Tennis Ball</u> <u>Recycling baskets</u> located close to the court gates.

Please ensure that the court gates are closed properly after you have finished playing. We do not want to find courts being misused because a resident did not close the gate properly.

A new HTA Ladies League playing out of Deerfield has started. They will be playing on certain Monday nights during January, February, and March. During league they will require all 4 courts from 7pm. Another HTA Mixed Doubles League is starting in April which will require 3 courts on certain Wednesdays. These Leagues have been approved by the DVCA Board.

The next Tennis Committee meeting will be at 7pm on Wednesday, March 6th in the small conference room.

MUD 136 Report

The Harris County MUD 136 monthly meeting was held on Thursday, January 11, 2024 @ 6pm in the DVCA Recreation Center. Directors discussed issues affecting the district and heard presentations from HCMUD 136 consultants.

There has been no progress towards the proposed emergency interconnect with Rolling Creek MUD (specifically Amesbury Park subdivision). RCM will need to negotiate the placement of the preferred vault site with the DVCA as it's on their property. We have provisionally agreed to the interconnect which would be constructed at no cost to HCMUD 136.

The Board heard short presentations by Directors Worthington and Polansky regarding meetings they attended at Jackrabbit Road PUD and the WHCRWA respectively. While the WHCRWA meeting was typically brief, the JRPUD meeting provided a status report on the rehabilitation of one of their waste clarifiers (estimated at \$1.75 million). HCMUD 136 will pay its share of the rehab cost, or +/- \$175,000. These costs are not final and could escalate further if the project is delayed.

Also, the Directors heard an engineering presentation regarding the rehabilitation of sewer lines within the Deerfield Village patio homes section. Due to the aging below-ground infrastructure, pipe composition, general line deterioration over time, and environmental stresses, a prioritized rehabilitation of sewer lines throughout HCMUD 136/Deerfield is about to commence. This will be a multi-year and expensive undertaking that's required to maintain the structural integrity of the entire sewer system. Updates will follow at our monthly meetings, here in the newsletter, and on our website.

REMINDER: Please sign up for HCMUD 136's text alert system by texting "hcmud136" (without quotation marks) to 74121, creating an account using an email address at mobiletext-alerts.com/hcmud136. Registered residents will receive timely alerts about water, sewer, trash and recycling services, drought conditions, and weather emergencies.

Deeds Committee

Seasonal/Holiday lighting and decorations must be removed NO later than one month after the date of the holiday, which means the end of January, in order to be

compliant.

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https: deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/ or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- 2. LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- 3. **HAZARDOUS DEAD TREES & PALMS**: Towering dead palm trees are a <u>safety hazard</u>, especially during hurricane season. If dead palm trees are in your yard, they should be removed before they fall on yours or your neighbor's house.
- 4. **BARK MULCH/FERTILIZER BAGS**: Please do not store these bags on your driveway or in your flower beds. They should be stored out of public view.
- 5. FENCES: Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.
- 6. PARKING:
 - a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
 - b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
