President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

The Architectural Guidelines Committee has posted the new draft Guidelines document on the website, so we can get resident feedback and will hold a meeting on March 6th at 7PM in the clubhouse. Here is the link to the website: www. deerfieldvillageonline.com/guidelines . The purpose of these guidelines is to ensure that decisions made by Deeds would be consistent and fair over time to homeowners, as volunteers come and go. These guidelines would also serve as a reference for any homeowner, as to what is approved or not approved. These guidelines are supported by the existing PC's (Protective Covenants), current state laws (Texas Property Code), and Policies and Guidelines already approved by the Board over time. This document has been a work in progress between the AG Committee and Deeds for over 2 years. Now it is being presented to residents for review, before it is adopted by the Board. Email: AGC@deerfieldvillageonline.com has been established to receive your comments.

Next, I need to address the elephant in the room. The recently adopted fine policy. This has generated a lot of controversy in Deerfield I didn't expect. The purpose of this policy is to help the Association with a situation when a resident refuses to comply with the first and second violation letters, and not communicate with Deeds or the office to tell us they need more time to correct a violation. The 3rd letter would be a \$25 fine, which is better than threatening to get an attorney involved, costing all of us residents. When we send an attorney letter, it costs you and me about \$200, if a resident still refuses to comply, it gets very expensive. and the lawyers are the real winers. We understand from other HOA's that such a policy reduces legal expenses, and it gets their attention. Trust me, we are not making money on a \$25, \$50 or \$100 fine. Other subdivisions' fines start at \$150, but we are not like other subdivisions. Based on the feedback from residents coming to the meetings, our intention was this would be a positive approach to keep Deerfield beautiful, since this only affects those that don't take care of their property and don't want to resolve it. As Board members, it is our commitment to run the association and adopt policies for the good of the neighborhood. We work for the people of Deerfield, and if this approach is not desirable. nothing is irreversible. However, I would like input at the meeting,

which now seems to cover both topics. We still would like to resolve the issue, in a way that the people agree. Another reason we adopted this type of policy is due to the change in resident behavior over time. When our original rules were written in the 70's, most residents receiving a letter were embarrassed. Now some residents wait for the letter before taking care of some basic things, like mowing your grass. I absolutely want to continue to be a friendly HOA, but I also want to live in a place I can be proud of. Let's continue the conversation, and work on a policy that may be less ridged but achieve the end goal.

2024 DVCA Trustee Elections are coming up, and we will post all applications on the elections tab on our website for you to learn about the candidate seeking to run. We will also have a pancake breakfast on Saturday, March 23rd for you to speak with the candidates. The elections will now be held on the second week of April, from April 9th through Saturday, April 13th. See the newsletter for the times during this week, as they vary. Nothing but water should go down our storm drains

Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience a problem with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

Landscape Committee

Spring is here and the Landscape Committee is springing into action. The winter round of tree work is expected to be completed by mid-March. Spring color will be going in at entrances and around the club house soon. Included in the Spring planting is new rose bushes in the round garden in front of the new stockade fence. The sidewalk along the athletic field will get some attention this month to be repair some cracks and improve drainage as part of our ongoing project to reduce areas of standing water and silt deposits. As a reminder residents are responsible for maintenance of their own sidewalks.

The Spring weather brings out the gardener in many of us, but at times some of our residents have ended up extending their garden into the common areas. A reminder — subdivision rules prohibit homeowners planting in common areas unless they request permission in writing from the association and get approval. The association has the right to remove anything placed in the common area. So please keep your gardens within your property lines.

The Landscape Committee meets on the second Monday of each month at 7:00 PM in the small meeting room across from the office. Our next two meetings will be held on March 11th and April 8th. All are welcome!

Architectural Guidelines Committee

The AGC (Architectural Guidelines Committee) was established by the Board as a special committee to create Guidelines for Deeds and Homeowners to use and reference when considering or submitting an AA (Architectural Application). This would ensure that decisions made my Deeds would be consistent and fair over time, as volunteers come and go. These guidelines would also serve as a reference for any homeowner, as to what is approved or not approved. These guidelines are supported by the existing PC's (Protective Covenants), current state laws (Texas Property Code), and Policies and Guidelines approved by the Board. We have completed our review of the amended document, including legal review to verify compliance with state laws and our governing documents. It was presented to Deeds, the Board and Homeowners. It was posted on our website for all to review on February 1st, 2024. We will hold a Town hall on March 6th at 7PM in the Clubhouse to allow a thorough discussion of the Guidelines, including comments and questions. The Guidelines committee will conduct one final review reflecting comments and suggestions made by residents. After completion, the revised document will be submitted to the Board for discussion and approval. It will hopefully provide a sound foundation for the future of Deerfield Village and its residents.

Swim Pool Committee

During the off season the Swimming Pool Committee works independently and with our pool management company, A-Beautiful Pools, to identify repairs we need to make to get the pool, pump house equipment, and pool deck in great shape for the summer season.

As every year, our pool will open in May on weekends once school is out.

In addition, our pool management company focuses on this time of year is recruiting and training lifeguards. For those who don't know this information, teens ages 15 and up can apply for this job. They will have an interview and, if hired, they will sign up for a two-day lifeguard certification course, which runs anywhere from \$100-\$200 depending on how early in the year they take the class. Once the class is completed, the trainees take a test at the end of day two and, if they pass, they will be good to go and ready to start lifeguarding. Many of our SPC parents have teens who have worked at the Deerfield pool and other neighboring pools, and we think it's a great summer job! If any of your teens, or even college students, are looking for summer work consider talking to them about becoming a lifeguard.

Please remember that every homeowner must have a Pool ID card registered through the Deerfield office to swim. If you already have one set up, there is no need to redo them yearly. The pool ID cards must remain in the pool office during the swim season. Please do not take the cards home. Children over the age of 14 can register for their own Pool ID card and attend the pool without a parent. Residents swimming when the pool is open are allowed up to three guests and must remain with their guests during their time at the pool.

Note: Financial statements often include certain expense items that had been budgeted but have not yet been expended. As these expenditures are expected to occur later in the year, we make budget timing corrections where/when appropriate to present a more realistic estimate of Net Operating Income.

2024 Assessments and Collections:

Yearly Assessments are the source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association for the benefit of Deerfield residents. Invoices for 2024 Assessments (and outstanding balances from prior years) were mailed in November of 2023. Payment was due by January 1, 2024 and was considered late after January 31, 2024. Beginning in February, late fees, interest, and other penalties started to accrue. If you have not received your 2024 invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Cheryl Beisert at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

Collection rate as of the end of January was a low 71.6% (vs 81.0% same-month-average for the previous 5 years). If you are among those who have yet not paid your 2024 assessment, we encourage you to pay soon

to avoid accrual of late payment penalties, interest, and other associated charges.

Payment Plans for 2024

2024 payment plans can still be arranged via the DVCA office. Amounts owed at the end of 2023 must be cleared before a payment plan for 2024 assessments can be considered. 2024 late fees and interest already accrued in 2024 will be included in the amount to be paid by any payment plan started at this time. Pay plans for 2024 are intended to be completed by the end of May.

Tennis Committee

The Tennis Committee is pleased to see many residents enjoying the tennis courts. All residents are reminded to <u>legibly</u> sign up for court time with a FIRST and LAST NAME on the Sign-up sheets located on the office window at the Recreation center. The player <u>themself</u> must sign up for the courts. Players can sign up for 2 hours at a time and no more than 3 guests per resident and household when playing.

All players are reminded to be respectful and considerate of other players during and after play on the courts. We also remind everyone that profanity, loud noises, radios, music and/or unsportsmanlike behavior is not allowed on the courts.

Please remove <u>any trash</u> from courts immediately after playing which should go in the trash outside the courts. Please <u>refrain</u> from using the Blue Tennis Ball Recycling baskets on the courts for trash cans.

All players are encouraged to leave any old<u>used tennis</u> balls they no longer want in the two (2) **Blue Tennis Ball Recycling baskets** located close to the court gates.

Please ensure that the court gates are closed properly after you have finished playing. We do not want to find courts being misused because a resident did not close the gate properly.

MUD 136 Report

Harris County MUD 136 (the District) monthly meeting was held in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center Clubhouse at 6:00 PM on Thursday, February 8, 2024. Presentations where made by MUD 136 consultants and issues affecting the District were discussed.

The Districts fiscal year ends March 31, 2024. McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot has been engaged to perform the annual audit of the Districts activities, records and financial statements. Texas law requires the completed audit report to be filed with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. MUD 136 will post the audit report on the Districts web site when available.

A draft of the annual budget for next year was reviewed. MUD 136 continues to experience an increase in the cost of services. The rising cost of labor and inflation are contributing to these increased costs and are compounded by the aging infrastructure of the District. MUD 136 maintains an asset management program which includes video inspection of the sanitary sewer lines. Results of these inspections identify areas with tree roots, broken or collapsed pipes, settling and other issues. The District prioritizes the need to repair and maintain reliable service. Due to age of assets and response to the inspection program, the District expects increased expenses for maintenance and replacement of sanitary sewer lines.

At the February 8th meeting, the Districts trash service provider, Texas Pride, discussed increased labor and fuel costs they have experienced and proposed increased trash service rates. These increased costs will be in effect soon. District residents are going to see increases in their MUD 136 bills in about two months.

There has been no update from Amesbury's MUD on the proposed emergency interconnect with the Amesbury Park subdivision. MUD 136 has provisionally agreed to this interconnect. It would be constructed at no cost to MUD 136 and provide Amesbury Park an alternate water source during an emergency.

There was no update available on the previously mentioned rehabilitation work at the regional waste water treatment plant. As stated, MUD 136 will pay its share of those rehab costs as they occur.

Seasonal/Holiday lighting and decorations must be removed NO later than one month after the date of the holiday, which means the end of January, in order to be compliant.

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https://deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- 3. HAZARDOUS DEAD TREES & PALMS: Towering dead palm trees are a <u>safety hazard</u>, especially during hurricane season. If dead palm trees are in your yard, they should be removed before they fall on yours or your neighbor's house.
- 4. BARK MULCH/FERTILIZER BAGS: Please do not store these bags on your driveway or in your flower beds. They should be stored out of public view.
- 5. **FENCES:** Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.
- 6. PARKING:
 - a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
 - b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
 - c. **Be considerate!** Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in Patio Homes.
- 7. TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.

Bike safety and etiquette on the greenbelt.

The Deerfield Village greenbelt is a wonderful attribute of our neighborhood where runners, walkers, and casual bike riders alike can take advantage of. To ensure you and others have a safe and enjoyable experience, please observe the following when using the greenbelt on your bike.

Safety Guidelines

- Pedestrians have the right of way at all times. Cyclists must be aware of pedestrians.
- All greenbelt users should stay to the right and use caution at intersections and at blind corners where vision could be impaired.
- Pedestrians should not walk more than two abreast to allow for easy passage of other pedestrians or cyclists.
- Cyclists and in-line skaters should maintain speeds safe for conditions, slowing down when passing pedestrians
- A person passing other users must notify the users that they are passing—example: "On your left." The use of a bell is
 another option. The person has the responsibility to pass freely and clearly. It is also the responsibility of the passer not
 to hinder the approaching user.
- Cyclists should have a white front and red rear light displayed and illuminated when riding at night, in addition to the
 reflectors on your tires, so that pedestrians can clearly see them.
- Pedestrians and cyclists should wear light colored or reflective clothing when using the greenbelt after dark.
- When cycling, always remember to wear a helmet!



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
