President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

I want to wish all the dad's a very Happy Father's Day! Enjoy some BBQ, a round of golf or some family time to make great memories!!

Congratulations to all the graduating Seniors of 2024, well done! It's time to start a new chapter and I wish you the best!

The big topic recently has been the windstorm that came through on May 16th. Overall, we were very lucky, as the damage wasn't too bad, considering there were high winds of over 100 miles an hour that took out some of our nice trees, and many resident trees. We had a large tree at the front entrance that was pulled out of the ground, and the same issue in two other areas, including the patio home. We had a pine tree removed that was leaning hard, and probably days from falling over, which would have likely damaged a home. All this means lots of work for our landscape committee and a lot of unexpected expenses. Over the next two weeks, they will be addressing over 20 trees to be removed, some that are dead, and a large number of limbs that are a potential safety issue. Additionally, we had Perimeter fence damage on 3 sides, with only Clay that had no damage. On Windsong there was a tree that fell on part of the perimeter fence. Keep in mind that the HOA will make repairs to fences that are down, but it may take longer than usual, as we are looking at placing a claim with our insurance. If you have a pool, we have added chain link fencing as a temporary fix. I know many of you have fence damage at your home, please don't forget to turn in an AA form to get approval, so you are protected with a letter of approval. Fortunately, because we are on the same power grid as the Airport, most of Deerfield had power restored within 1 day. However, I was informed there was a section that suffered from transformer and other equipment failures and took a lot longer.

We still have a Board Trustee vacancy left by Hak Dickenson, so if you are interested, please contact Cat

in the office to get an application. Applications must be turned in before June 31, 2024. A Special meeting will be held to select the new Trustee from the applicants, date TBD.

Summer is here and the kids are out of school, so please remember the pool is open and it can be an oasis from the heat. Check the pool schedule on our website for pool hours. If you are <u>new</u> to Deerfield, you will need a pool card to get in. Please contact Catherine in the office (located at the Recreation Center), for a card during office hours, or schedule a time with her after hours. The SAYOR (Swim At Your Own Risk) program has resumed this year, which will allow you to access the pool daily during certain hours only when the pool is closed. If you are interested, please contact the Deerfield Community Office to fill out a 2024 waiver and get all the details. You must sign an updated waiver every year.

The <u>AG Committee</u> is making progress, and you may start seeing a few flyers around the Recreation Center area that you get the latest information from our website. Meetings are the 2nd Wednesday and the 4th Thursday of every month at this time. I am posting the agenda <u>three days before the meeting</u> in the event you see something you want to provide your feedback.

The next Board meeting is on June 24^{th} at 7pm in the Clubhouse.

Nothing but water should go down our storm drains

Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience a problem with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

Landscape Committee

The community has recovered really well from the May storm damage. Good job everyone pitching in to help neighbors! The landscape committee is doing our part with cleaning up downed trees and limbs and chipping away at our backlog of 17 dead trees. The big, downed oak tree at the main entrance will be gone in a week. The County community help program is still helping by coming thru the neighborhood to collect broken branch debris.

Exploration of the garden club idea has been sidetracked by clean-up efforts, but we will get our new club request before the board as soon as we can. The purpose of the club would be to inform and educate the community on lawn and gardening concerns, arrange for speakers, organize outings, provide a social outlet for garden minded residents and to plan and carry out plantings and enhancements around the recreation center and pool area. The committee meets twice a month, on the second Wednesday and fourth Thursday at 7PM in the Deerfield Clubhouse. The meeting agenda will be posted on the website and outside the DVCA Office 3 days prior to the meeting date. Meeting minutes will be posted on the website once the committee has approved them.

Security Committee

We hope everyone made it through the storm safely without much damage. Some of us were lucky to get the power back fairly quickly but others were not as lucky. Neighbors were helping each other with clean up and aid which is always nice to see.

If you would like a Seal Security magnet, please contact the office to get one.

In general Deerfield continues to be calm from a security standpoint. There is usually more suspicious activity at night, so remember to remove the mail from your mailbox, lock your cars on the driveway and streets and keep your property as well-lit as possible. Some homeowners have added video cameras, and we think it is a good idea.

If an incident does occur or you see suspicious activity, please do the following:

- If you feel in danger personally, call 911 or HCSO first and then SEAL Security.
- If you do not feel in imminent danger, call SEAL Security.

There have been incidents noticed in the past where someone felt in danger and posted on the Nextdoor website before calling 911, HCSO, or Seal Security. Your safety is worth calling.

Also, if you are the victim of a crime, please call HCSO and report it.

<u>Just as a friendly reminder- here are some things you</u> <u>can do to keep Deerfield safe</u>:

1. Stay vigilant and report any suspicious activity, especially after dark.

2. Park in your garage or driveway. Vehicles on the street are easier targets.

3. Lock your vehicles, especially if they are left on the street or driveway.

4. Keep your overhead garage door and entry doors closed and locked.

5. Add a video security system for your house. It may help if an incident occurs.

6. Add outdoor lights and keep them on at night.

7. Report any streetlights out to Center Point and any Greenbelt trail lights out to the office.

We welcome any new members who may be interested in joining the security committee.

We meet on the 1st Tuesday of the month in the clubhouse. Our next two meetings will be at 7pm on Tuesday, June 4^{th} and July 2^{nd} at the recreation center. We hope you'll join us.

Note: Financial statements often include certain expense items that had been budgeted but have not yet been expended. As these expenditures are expected to occur later in the year, we make budget timing corrections where/when appropriate to present a more realistic estimate of Net Operating Income.

2024 Assessments and Collections:

YearlyAssessments are the source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association for the benefit of Deerfield residents. Invoices for 2024 Assessments plus outstanding balances from prior years were mailed in November of 2023. Payment was due by January 1, 2024 and was considered late after January 31, 2024. Beginning in February, late fees, interest, and other penalties started to accrue. If you have not received your 2024 invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Patti Averitt at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate. Collection rate as of the end of the month was lower than in the past; 91.9% vs 94.1% same-month-average for the previous 5 years. If you are among those who have not yet paid your 2024 or prior year assessment, we encourage you to pay soon to avoid further accrual of late payment penalties, interest, other associated charges, and subsequent legal action.

MUD 136 Report

Harris County MUD 136 (the District) monthly meeting was held in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center Clubhouse at 6:00 PM on Thursday, May 9, 2024. Presentations where made by MUD 136 consultants and issues affecting the District were discussed. A draft of the annual Drinking Water Quality report was presented and approved. The Drinking Water Quality report is based on requirements from the EPA and TCEQ. MUD 136 water quality meets or exceeds all requirements. A link to MUD 136 annual Drinking Water Quality report should be available in your next bill. The proposal from security consultant Today's Integration was discussed and is scheduled for additional review during a site visit on June 6th.

The District's fiscal year ended March 31, 2024. McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot has been engaged to perform the annual audit of the District's activities, records and financial statements. The audit remains in progress. MUD 136 will post the year ending 2024 audit report on the District's web site when available.

MUD 136 maintains an asset management program which includes video inspection of the sanitary sewer lines. Analysis of the recent inspections is continuing. The District will prioritize the need to repair and maintain reliable service. Due to age of assets and response to the inspection program, the District expects increased expenses for maintenance and repairs to the sanitary sewer lines.

Swim Pool Committee

Hello neighbors, Happy Swimming! We are happy to report that the pool is OPEN for daily swimming with a few exceptions, such as <u>CLOSED on Mondays</u> and opening at 10:30AM for the first two weeks of June to accommodate swim team practices. The pool is open from 10AM until 9PM. The pool schedule is located on our website.

The Deerfield Dolphins are still in the pool practicing during the week for a couple more weeks in June. Also, swim team practices will shift to the morning times of 7AM-10:30AM during June.

Please remember every homeowner must have a Pool ID card registered through the Deerfield office to swim. If you already have one set up, there is no need to redo them yearly. The pool ID cards must remain in the pool office during the swim season. Please do not take pool cards home. Residents swimming when the pool is open are allowed to bring up to three guests and must remain with their guests during their time at the pool. Residents 14 and up are allowed solo entry to swim but those under 14 must be accompanied by an adult or guardian the entire time of their stay in the pool area.

The Swim At Your Own Risk (S.A.Y.O.R.) program is available and residents can sign up to swim during nonlife guarded hours from 6am to 9pm. Residents must register through the office by signing a current 2024 Waiver & SAYOR pool rules including bringing a picture ID. Each year an updated waiver is required for this program. No guests are allowed for the SAYOR program. The water temperature must be above 72 degrees to swim during SAYOR hours. For more information to participate in the program contact the office by phone or email.

Everyone is welcome to bring any concerns directly to the Swimming Pool Committee, which meets at 7PM on the second Tuesday of each month. We work closely with our pool management company all year, and especially during the summer months, so now is a great time to hear from you.

As we move forward into the summer, I'd like to remind everyone to follow the rules of the pool, which are there for your safety and are listed on the pool house for your review. Remember the lifeguards have the final say on what's happening at the pool, particularly if rules are not being followed. If there are any questions or concerns about something happening at the pool, please report it to the lifeguards or the Deerfield office manager.

The Swimming Pool Committee meets the second Tuesday of each month at 7pm in the Clubhouse. The next meeting will be on June 11th. We would love to welcome you as a new member. We look forward to a fun-filled summer with lots of swimming and big splashes!

Deeds Committee

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https: deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/ or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- 2. LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- 3. **FENCES:** Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.
- 4. PARKING:
 - a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
 - b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
 - c. **Be considerate!** Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in Patio Homes.
- TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.

Deeds meets on the 2^{nd} Monday of the month at 7PM at the Clubhouse. The next two meetings will be on June 10^{th} and July 8^{th} .



<u>Men's Group</u>

The Men's Group (TMG) meets weekly on Thursdays at 9:00 AM at the Rec Center. Besides our projects for DFV, and the community at large, we mix in some fun and fellowship which includes a monthly book club. In May TMG toured the Transtar facility and we are planning a few more "road trips." We usually have a monthly Astros watch party. If this sounds like fun, then come and join us.

COMMUNITY SERVICE TMG members volunteer with Meals on Wheels, at the Special Pals animal shelter, at hospitals, including the VA, CERT (emergency response), and at food pantries including Mesa Outreach. Several members mentor at schools, help with the Boy Scouts, and work with St. Vincent de Paul to aid the needy. It is tax time again and several TMG members are doing free tax prep for low-income families. Words that guide us, "You can't help everyone, but everyone can help someone."

PANCAKE BREAKFAST-Sat. June 15 0830-10 am. Your donations go towards the Mens Group charity efforts. Donations at last year's breakfasts allowed us to make 60 Christmas stockings for needy Meals on Wheels clients and make cash donations to the Special Pals animal shelter and the local Mesa Outreach food pantry. These get togethers are an excellent chance to meet other DV residents.

ONGOING ACTIVITIES-Each week we sort the thin films that we collect. The grocery bags go to local Food Pantries—Mesa, KCM, and Meals on Wheels, and the rest go to TREX. We collect used tennis balls and take them to Special Pals or the dog park. Additionally, we continue to collect used eyeglasses and suitcases.

SERVICE PROJECTS: This past month TMG held another successful Food Drive for Mesa Outreach. We completed some carpentry and electrical jobs, washed the clubhouse windows and "fluffed and redistributed" the mulch in the playground. TMG continues to work on trenching at the north end to prevent water collecting on the sidewalks. We monitor the greenbelt exercise equipment on a monthly basis and making repairs as needed. In addition, we removed 21 dead trees/bushes along the ditch. We saved the tree trunks, and they will be used as firewood for the Family Campfire in November. "It's amazing what a team can accomplish when no individual wants the credit!"


