President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

I understand NOAH is predicting a very active hurricane season this year, so please take the time to be prepared. I'm sure many residents are tired of the power situation, but Deerfield does have priority, as we are on the same grid as the airport. While restoring power is a priority, if there is a local transformer or fuse that needs to be addressed, you can find that takes much longer. This is why some sections of Deerfield had power and others were still waiting. We had several residents turn in an AA to the office, letting us know they were installing a generator. For those that have medical issues, it should be something you consider.

We still have a Board Trustee vacancy, so if you are interested, please contact Cat in the office to get an application. Applications must be turned in before August 16, 2024. A Special meeting will be held to select the new Trustee from the applicants, on August 26, 2024.

Please note that Mosquitos have been bad this year and we are spraying aggressively and treating the ditch, as we normally do. We appreciate the Community Service Committee proactively addressing this issue to help our area. I've also heard that West Nile has been spreading through mosquitos more than normal, so please be careful and spray too if you can.

The Board and Committees are looking at new software to help run the association more efficiently and allow for better communication between each other and residents. Today we exchange emails, use spreadsheets and store documents on local folders, so this would centralize everything in one database. It would allow residents to view their account 24/7, submit any AA (Architectural Application) request, or pay their account online. Yes, no more lost checks in the mail due to USPS poor performance, if you want to pay through the portal. There was a meeting scheduled last month for all HOA volunteers to view the software and ask questions. More to come if we decide to move forward.

Our finance team is starting the budget process, so Committees need to know if there are any projects that need to be addressed, so we can plan accordingly. We will have a special meeting in October to approve the budget, so please provide that feedback by early September.

The next big Deerfield event is our Ice Cream Social on August 18th, between 2-4pm. If you are new to Deerfield, come enjoy \$1 ice cream and meet your neighbors. Next will be the Labor Day party at the pool on September 2nd. We will have a slide and plenty of pool games. Check the newsletter for more information. Nothing but water should go down our storm drains

Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Residential Trash Reminders

Our waste collection vendor is Texas Pride and trash pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays, with recycling pick-up on Fridays. Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience a problem with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

Swim Pool Committee

Hi neighbors. We are happy to report that lots of people have been making use of the pool this summer, including hundreds of residents turning out for our annual holiday pool parties on Memorial Day and the Fourth of July. We have one more on Labor Day, Monday, September 2nd, from 2-6pm. We hope to see you there!

As we move into August, remember the pool will be closed on weekdays as of Monday, Aug. 19th, the first day of school for CFISD. After that, it will be open on Saturdays and Sundays only through the second weekend of September 14-15. The hours will be from 10am until 8pm.

Just a reminder that pool ID cards are required for entry to swim. If you don't have one, check with the office and they can set you up. Residents 14 and up are allowed solo entry into the pool; all others under 14 must be accompanied by a parent or adult guardian the entirety of their stay.

We always remind residents to be safe, mindful of the rules (which are posted on the pool house), and courteous to those around you. We also encourage you to clean up after yourselves, especially after the big pool parties. We want swimming to be an enjoyable and fun experience, free from drama and conflicts that can be avoided by following the rules and engaging in clean behavior. The lifeguards have the ultimate authority in all matters during normal pool hours. Failure to abide by these rules will result in having swimming pool privileges revoked, at the discretion of the DVCA management and absolutely no trespassing.

The Swimming Pool Committee meets the second Tuesday of each month at 7pm in the Recreation Center. We are always open to new ideas regarding how to run and maintain the pool, which is one of Deerfield's biggest amenities. Our next meetings are scheduled for August 13th and September 10th in the clubhouse.

Security Committee

We hope everyone made it through the 2nd storm safely without too much tree debris. Some of us were lucky to get the power back fairly quickly but others were not as lucky. Neighbors were helping each other with clean up and aid which is always nice to see.

If you would like a Seal Security magnet, please contact the office to get one.

In general Deerfield continues to be calm from a security standpoint. There is usually more suspicious activity at night, so remember to remove the mail from your mailbox, lock your cars on the driveway and streets and keep your property as well-lit as possible. Some homeowners have added video cameras, and we think it is a good idea.

If an incident does occur or you see suspicious activity, please do the following:

- If you feel in danger personally, call 911 or HCSO first and then SEAL Security.
- If you do not feel in imminent danger, call SEAL Security at **832-408-0200**.

There have been incidents noticed in the past where someone felt in danger and posted on the Nextdoor website before calling 911, HCSO, or Seal Security. Your safety is worth calling.

Also, if you are the victim of a crime, please call HCSO and report it.

<u>Just as a friendly reminder- here are some things you can do to keep Deerfield safe:</u>

- 1. Stay vigilant and report any suspicious activity, especially after dark.
- 2. Park in your garage or driveway. Vehicles on the street are easier targets.
- 3. Lock your vehicles, especially if they are left on the street or driveway.
- 4. Keep your overhead garage door and entry doors closed and locked.
- 5. Add a video security system for your house. It may help if an incident occurs.
- 6. Add outdoor lights and keep them on at night.
- 7. Report any streetlights out to Center Point and any Greenbelt trail lights out to the office.

We welcome any new members who may be interested in joining the security committee.

We meet on the 1st Tuesday of the month in the clubhouse. Our next meeting will be at 7pm on Tuesday, August 6th at the recreation center. We hope you'll join us.

Note: Financial statements often include certain expense items that had been budgeted but have not yet been expended. As these expenditures are expected to occur later in the year, we make budget timing corrections where/when appropriate to present a more realistic estimate of Net Operating Income.

2024 Assessments and Collections:

Yearly Assessments are the source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association for the benefit of Deerfield residents. Invoices for 2024 Assessments plus outstanding balances from prior years were mailed in November of 2023. Payment was due by January 1, 2024 and was considered late after January 31, 2024. Beginning in February, late fees, interest, and other penalties started to accrue. If you have not received your 2024 invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Patti Averitt at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

Collection rate as of the end of the month was again lower than in the past; 95.4% vs 96.6% same-month-average for the previous 5 years. If you are among those who have not yet paid your 2024 or prior year assessment, we encourage you to pay soon to avoid further accrual of late payment penalties, interest, other associated charges, and subsequent legal action.

Landscape Committee

We have had plenty of rain leading into the summer season. Let's hope it stays just wet enough to keep everyhing green. The rainy Spring allowed the landscape committee to identify some drainage issues throughout the community. We are working on a plan to prioritize and remediate these issues in Deerfield's green space.

We are mostly up to date on tree work related to previous frost, drought and recent storm damage. We are grateful for Precinct 4 community services prompt effort to remove storm debris and clear hazardous limbs over roadways. We are now working on a watch list to identify trees for the next round of removals this fall.

Exploration of the garden club idea has been sidetracked by clean up efforts, but we will get our new club request before the board as soon as we can. The purpose of the club would be to inform and educate the community on lawn and gardening concerns, arrange for speakers, organize outings, provide a social outlet for garden minded residents and to plan and carry out plantings and enhancements around the recreation center and pool area. MUD 136 Report

Harris County MUD 136 (the District) monthly meeting was held in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center at 6:00 PM on Thursday, July 11, 2024. Presentations where made by MUD 136 consultants and issues affecting the District were discussed. Today's Integration has been selected for the HCMUD 136 water plant security system. The system will include security and surveillance features. Installation of the system is pending.

The District's fiscal year ended March 31, 2024. McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot presented the final annual audit report of the District's activities, records and financial statements. Texas law requires the completed audit report to be filed with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. The audit was approved and MUD 136 will post the audit report on the District's web site when the final pdf is available.

The Annual Drinking Water Quality Report for calendar year 2023 is complete. The US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) require water systems to test for more than 90 contaminants in the water supply. The testing is conducted by the TCEQ. MUD 136 water meets or exceeds all the Water requirements. A link to the 2023 Drinking Water Quality Report follows www.municipalops.com/HCMUD136.pdf.

We all experienced our first significant hurricane of the season. Beryl passed right over Deerfield Village leaving us with no power and significant storm damage. Much of the electric power was restored in 12-14 hours, but many of our neighbors had much longer outages. The water districts standby power generators performed well. There was no disruption to MUD 136 water service.

Hurricane Beryl did disrupt our trash and recycling services. Trash service did not include yard waste for several days, and recycling service was missed for 2 weeks. It has been a slow recovery from the storm, but service is returning to normal. We thank you for your patience and understanding.

https://mobile-text-alerts.com/hcmud136. Registered residents will receive alerts about hurricane threat, drought conditions and water, sewer, trash and recycling services.

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https://deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- 3. **FENCES:** Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.

4. PARKING:

- a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
- b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
- c. **Be considerate!** Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in Patio Homes.
- 5. TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.

SERVICE PROJECTS: This past month TMG held another successful Food Drive for Mesa Outreach and completed some carpentry and electrical jobs including repair of the sandbox at the north end playground after the storm. Before Beryl we helped clear the grate at the south end of the ditch and post storm, we did some tree cutting/clearing/removal and assisted several residents. We are monitoring the greenbelt exercise equipment monthly, and making repairs as needed. TMG is fabricating replacements for all the warning signs on the greenbelt. In addition, we built a new seat for the bench at the VB court and did a major patch job on the picnic table. It will be replaced next year. "It's amazing what a team can accomplish when no individual wants the credit!"

With all the rain we have had, mosquitoes have become a real nuisance. We have sprayed for them and will continue to do so regularly as long as the rain keeps up. Remember, mosquitoes only need a tablespoon of standing water to breed, so keep your gutters cleaned out and eliminate other places on your property where water can accumulate.



NEWS FROM THE DEERFIELD WOMEN'S DAY-TRIPPERS

Our Wednesday August 28, trip will be to the Lone Star Flight Museum (LSFM), 11551 Aerospace Ave., Houston, TX. LSFM is home to the Texas Aviation Hall of Fame, a large collection of rare and historic aircraft, a NASA Display and STEM based education programs.

The original museum opened in 1990 in Galveston at Scholes Field and relocated to Houston Ellington Airport in 2017. The Texas Aviation Hall of Fame honors famous Texas aviators and commemorates the rich history of Texas aviation. The 130,000 square foot museum is also home to a flying collection of rare and historic commercial, general aviation and military aircraft. The exhibit includes airworthy aircraft such as the DC3, Howard 250 and B-25. The NASA Display includes three artifacts from NASA, 1) SHUTTLE MISSION SIMULATOR MOTION BASE, the original simulator that trained every Space Shuttle crew. 2) SMALL PRESSURIZED ROVER that was part of a 2010 weeklong field test in Arizona and 3) CENTAUR HUMANOID ROBOT. The design allows for robotic use of human tools and interfaces while in remote locations such as rough terrain and varied environments. The STEM learning center has a mission to educate and engage youth through science, technology, engineering and math.

After the museum visit we will have lunch at Abe's Cajun Market and Café in the Clear Lake Area. This Lake Charles based café has been in the Houston area since 2001. It is family owned and operated and serves authentic Cajun cuisine. A peek at the menu is available on the website listed below.
