# President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

Please be aware that we were informed that the mailbox at the Community Center parking lot was broken into, and mail was stolen. It is being investigated by the Postmaster and the mailbox has been removed. It was damaged using a crowbar and not repairable. We have requested a replacement with the newer model, which is more resilient to being broken into, but it is unclear whether the post office will replace it.

I've received several calls asking why the Verdant Tree farm is closing down and is selling their property. That is not true and a rumor. I spoke to the owners of the tree farm, which are Deerfield residents, and assured me that they have no plans to close. The for-sale sign is on the edge of their property and represents a small portion of property on the north side of the tree farm.

The Flood Control has been busy clearing the debris in the ditch, and has large machinery going in and out, and leaving large piles in certain areas. Everything will get cleaned up and the areas with erosion should be addressed. Please let Cat in the office know if you see an area not being addressed, as we will ask them to come back.

#### **Financial Status:**

Note: Financial statements often include certain expense items that had been budgeted but have not yet been expended. As these expenditures are expected to occur later in the year, we make budget timing corrections where/when appropriate to present a more realistic estimate of Net Operating Income.

#### 2024 Assessments and Collections:

Yearly Assessments are the primary source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association for the benefit of Deerfield residents. Invoices for 2024 Assessments plus outstanding balances from prior years were mailed in November of 2023. Payment was due by January 1, 2024 and was considered late after January 31, 2024. Beginning in February, late fees, interest, and other penalties started to accrue. If you have not received your 2024 invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Patti Averitt at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

Collection rate as of the end of the month was again lower than in the past; 96.4% vs 97.6% same-month-average for the previous 5 years. If you are among those who have not yet paid your 2024 or prior year assessment, we encourage you to pay soon to avoid further accrual of late payment penalties, interest, other associated charges and the cost of subsequent legal action.

# **Landscape Committee**

Tree work is finished for this year, assuming we get through the rest of hurricane season without any more serious storms. New Deerfield Greenbelt signs are going up thanks to the hard-working men's group.

The Landscape committee is turning our attention to drainage issues in Deerfield common areas. We are working on making sure storm drains are draining, water is not pooling excessively and silt from run-off is not building up on sidewalks. There are many drains that we have addressed and others we are still working on for the remainder of the year.

We are still actively developing plans to spruce up the landscaping along the main entryway at Clay Road. It is a large area, and funding is limited but we are making progress for next year. We are also planning for our regular fall planting.

Good news... our TMG volunteers helped get our greenbelt signs installed. See pic below. Landscape sends a big thanks to all who were involved.

The exploration of the "garden club idea" is still a goal. The purpose of the club would be to inform and educate the community on lawn and gardening concerns, arrange for speakers, organize outings, provide a social outlet for garden minded residents and to plan and carry out plantings and enhancements around the recreation center and pool area. #### NOTICE OF TAXPAYERS' RIGHT TO ELECTION TO REDUCE TAX RATE

If the district adopts a combined debt service, operation and maintenance, and contract tax rate that would result in the taxes on the average residence homestead increasing by more than eight percent, the qualified voters of the district by petition may require that an election be held to determine whether to reduce the operation and maintenance tax rate to the voter-approval tax rate under Section 49.23603, Water Code.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

# MUD 136 Report

Harris County MUD 136 (the District) monthly meeting was held in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center at 6:00 PM on Thursday, September 12, 2024. HCMUD 136 meetings are

normally scheduled the 2nd Thursday of each month at 6:00 pm. However, the October meeting is scheduled for 6:00 pm on October 24. Meetings are open to the public, with the agenda posted at the Deerfield Recreation Center and on the District's website <a href="https://www.hcmud136.org">www.hcmud136.org</a>. Presentations were made by MUD 136 consultants and issues affecting the District were discussed. Work on sanitary sewer lines, repairing segments identified by recent inspections, should begin this month. The proposed tax rate will be published in the Houston Chronicle and in the Deerfield newsletter. The tax rate hearing will be at the October meeting, scheduled for October 24.

The District is sponsoring a paper shredding and recycling event, scheduled for Saturday October 19 at the recreation center parking lot. The time will be from 9:00 am - 1:00 pm. In addition, there will be a drop off for old eye glasses, so gather up your old eye glasses lying around and bring them for recycling.

Key documents can be found on the District's website, including the final audit report of the District's activities, records and financial statements for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2024 and drinking water quality reports.

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https://deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- 3. **FENCES:** Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.

#### 4. PARKING:

- a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
- b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
- Be considerate! Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in Patio Homes.
- 5. TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.

# Men's Group

The Men's Group (TMG) meets weekly on Thursdays at 9:00 AM at the Rec Center. Besides our projects for DFV, and the community at large, we mix in some fun and fellowship which includes a monthly book club. In May TMG toured the Transtar facility and we are planning a few more "road trips." We usually have a monthly Astros watch party. If this sounds like fun, then come and join us.

**COMMUNITY SERVICE-** TMG members volunteer with Meals on Wheels, at the Special Pals animal shelter, at hospitals, including the VA, CERT (emergency response), and at food pantries including Mesa Outreach. Several members mentor at schools, help with the Boy Scouts, and work with St. Vincent de Paul to aid the needy. It is tax time again and several TMG members are doing free tax prep for low-income families. Words that guide us, "You can't help everyone, but everyone can help someone."

PANCAKE BREAKFASTS- Your donations go towards the Men's Group charity efforts. Donations at last year's breakfasts allowed us to make 60 Christmas stockings for needy Meals on Wheels clients and make cash donations to the Special Pals animal shelter and the local Mesa Outreach food pantry. These get togethers are an excellent chance to meet other DV residents.

**FOOD DRIVE-** The monthly Food Drive will be held Oct.14-19. Drop off your non-perishable donations in the box outside the office. A reminder, no glass containers or items long past their expiration date.

**ONGOING ACTIVITIES-** Each week we sort the thin films that we collect. The grocery bags go to local Food Pantries—Mesa, KCM, and Meals on Wheels, and the rest go to TREX. We collect used tennis balls and take them to Special Pals or the dog park. Additionally, we continue to collect used eyeglasses and suitcases.

**BACK AT IT-** TMG members take a break from doing large outdoor projects during the very hot months of July and August. We were back at it in September replacing the matting in the clubhouse breezeway.

**PAPER SHRED/ELECTRONICS RECYCLE** Sat. Oct. 19 from 9 am-noon. The Men's Group supplies the manpower for this once-a-year event.

SERVICE PROJECTS: This past month TMG held another successful Food Drive for Mesa Outreach and completed some carpentry and electrical jobs. We continued to work on trees damaged in recent storms. TMG fabricated and installed replacements for all the warning signs on the greenbelt-big job in the hot weather. We removed the existing matting in the Rec Center breezeway and replaced it with 530 sq. ft. of sports tiles. In addition, we improved the drainage from the sidewalks along the pipeline ROW and installed 4 new catchment covers that prevent clogging-it's an experiment. "It's amazing what a team can accomplish when no individual wants the credit!"

#### NEWS FROM THE DEERFIELD WOMEN'S DAY-TRIPPERS

Ladies would you like to shop for plants and beautifully crafted gifts while at the same time helping adults with disabilities (referred to as Citizens) live a life with purpose and dignity? If so, join us on Wednesday October 23, as we travel to The Brookwood Community located about an hour west of Houston. The campus is almost 500 acres where over 100 Residential Citizens live and work and over another 100 commute and work in a day program.

The concept started in the 1980s when Yvonne Streit's Young daughter, Vicki, suffered brain trauma as the result of complications from mumps. Back then she found nowhere to turn for help. Programs to aid those with physical and intellectual disabilities in finding a way to contribute meaningfully to society were scarce at best. So Yvonne created one. While it began as a tiny project to aid special needs kids like her own, it eventually grew into The Brookwood Community, a world-class residential campus serving adults with disabilities by providing meaningful work. Helping those with cognitive or physical disabilities begins with small but vital steps. In Vicki's case, those steps involved Yvonne teaching her daughter over months to grasp, then grasp and release, then grasp. move, and release. Today Vicki has employed that skill to place plastic flowerpots on a palette as part of the horticultural team at Brookwood. Vicki has placed over 11,000 pots and takes pride in her work.

Everyone experiences the dignity of contributing. Each Citizen gets his or her paycheck every Friday. Their work provides a sense of purpose and contributes to the funding of the community.

Our trip will include a guided tour beginning with a video of the facility followed by a brief question and answer period. Next we will tour the campus with the guide pointing out different buildings and giving information regarding each. When we arrive at the Streit Building, the guide will take us inside and we will be able to observe the Citizens working. Next we will continue to the north part of the campus where we will see the Horticultural enterprise and greenhouses. Our tour will end at the Gift & Garden Center and Café. There we will have lunch and shop. Each person will receive a 10% discount off ONE item in either the gift shop or the garden center.
