President's Report

Greetings Deerfield Residents,

Election day reminder - Tuesday November 5th, from 7AM to 7PM. If you did not vote early, you can vote at the Clubhouse. This will be an official voting location, as we have done in the past. I expect this year's election to have an interesting outcome, please go vote!!

The Board approved the 2025 budget on October 17th at the Budget Board meeting. The approved Budget increases the annual community service charge by \$20 per household. The approved Budget is \$1,078,185 for a 2.1% increase over last year. Our operating expense is \$910,082, and reserve expenditures of \$111,185. The total budget has a projected surplus of \$526.00. Residents should receive an invoice by mid-November. The Assessment is due January 1st, 2025. Payment plans are available if needed, please contact the office to set up a payment plan contract.

I hope everyone will notice an insert with this year's annual assessment letter. We thought it may be a good place to remind everyone to 1) Submit your AA (architectural application) for approval by the Association whenever doing exterior modifications/ improvements to your home. This protects you from having to have anything redone, in the event it does not meet the requirements of the Deed's restrictions we all agreed to when moving in to our new home, 2) Making everyone aware that the AGC is working to merge the 10 (ten) different Protective Covenants into 1 (one) unified Protective covenant that is consistent for all and single point of reference. Ultimately, provides the needed improvements to allow DVCA to remain a desirable neighborhood for the next 25+ years. 3) A call for Committee Volunteers, as we have a need for volunteers in different capacities to support different activities and events that we provide for our community. In addition to doing something rewarding for you and the community, it helps keep our dues lower than they could be or have activities others can't afford to do. Even groups like the Men's group save us thousands of dollars each month on average.

The Flood Control is finishing up the work on the drainage ditch and leaving large piles of dirt in certain areas. Everything will get cleaned up and the areas with erosion should be addressed with the spray grass. Please let Cat in the office know if you see an area not being addressed, as we will ask them to come back.

The 46th Annual Bazaar is November 8th and 9th at the Recreation Center facility. This is a magnificent event to support your neighbors and friends in the surrounding community, and it should put you in the holiday spirit! More information and times in this newsletter.

The Deerfield Family Campfire event will be on November 16th. The campfire will start when it gets dark...around 7PM. Like we have done in the past, we will gather around the fire ring and bake some cobbler in the dutch ovens with the help of our Scout Troop 120 for anyone to enjoy, with some ice cream and smores.

The next HOA Board meeting will be on November 25th at 7pm in the Clubhouse. There is no Board meeting in December, unless there is an emergency.

The AGC (Architectural Guidelines Committee) meets twice a month in the Deerfield Clubhouse. Meetings are at 7pm on the first Thursday and the fourth Tuesday of each month. The AGC has made great strides and continues to update the new Unified Protective Covenants (PC) document with modernized language from the original Protective Covenants, and pertinent language from existing policies. At this time, the AGC is focused on the existing provisions, and whether they should be kept, modified, or deleted. However, based on the current process, we will likely go into 2025 before completing the document. All document changes will be discussed and approved at a later date, and subject to community vote. All residents are welcome to attend the AGC meetings. The next two meetings will be **Nov. 14**th and **Nov. 26**th.

Financial Status:

Note: Financial statements often include certain expense items that had been budgeted but have not yet been expended. As these expenditures are expected to occur later in the year, we make budget timing corrections

where/when appropriate to present a more realistic estimate of Net Operating Income.

2025 Budget:

The proposed 2025 budget was presented, discussed, amended, and approved by the DVCA board on October 17, 2024.

2024 Assessments and Collections:

Yearly Assessments are the primary source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association for the benefit of Deerfield residents. Invoices for 2024 Assessments plus outstanding balances from prior years were mailed in November of 2023. Payment was due by January 1, 2024 and was considered late after January 31, 2024. Beginning in February, late fees, interest, and other penalties started to accrue. If you have not received your 2024 invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Patti Averitt at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

Collection rate as of the end of the month was again lower than in the past; 96.7% vs 97.8% same-month-average for the previous 5 years. If you are among those who have not yet paid your 2024 or prior year assessment, you will have received a letter reminding you of your payment status. We encourage you to pay soon to avoid further accrual of late payment penalties, interest, and other associated charges and the cost and consequences of subsequent legal action.

Landscape Committee

Annual rainfall this year is still well above normal, but we are now in the midst of a mini-drought. Hopefully we will see some rain soon so everyone can keep their grass and landscaping looking great.


We have finally caught up on the tree work from the drought, freeze and storm events of the past few years. There is still a bit more tree and stump work to do but it is assessed as low risk and will be addressed in the new budget year. Homeowners are reminded that they are responsible for maintenance of trees on their property. Please keep in mind, property damage from dead or poorly maintained trees is generally not covered by homeowners' insurance.

The Men's Group kindly power washed the first section of wall along the east side of Deerfield Village Drive at Clay Road. Who knew there were bricks under all that dirt and grime? Looks great! Thank you to TMG! We have been assured that the Flood Control people will restore the bare banks left after they cleared out the cement pan at the bottom of the flow channel. We have two pounds of wildflower seeds to scatter along the banks of the ditch once it cools off a bit.

The 2025 budget has been approved and in addition our usual responsibilities of lawn care, sprinkler maintenance, sidewalk repair and tree trimming we will be addressing common area drainage issues, refurbishing the plantings along Deerfield Village Drive at the Clay Road entrance and generally sprucing up around the Recreation Center. The new green belt usage signs are in place. Some finishing touches will be added to improve the appearance and survivability of the signs. We upped our Christmas decorations last year and are planning another step up in 2024.

Fall annuals will be planted this month to brighten up the entrances and various common area gardens. We will be organizing a planting party to plant annual color in the various gardens around the around recreation center, therefore this is a call for volunteers. We hope this will become an annual community outing. It gets the job done the way we want it and saves DVCA money.

The Landscape Committee meets the second Monday of every month (except December) at 7:00 PM in the small conference room across from the office. Help keep our neighborhood beautiful and join our committee. Our last meeting for this year will be November 11th. Everyone is welcome to attend.

MUD 136 Report

Harris County MUD 136 (the District) monthly meeting was held in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center Annex, 6:00 PM on Thursday, October 24, 2024. Meetings are open to the public, with the agenda posted at the Deerfield Recreation Center and on the District's website www.hcmud136.org. At this meeting, the tax rate hearing was held and the property tax rate set for \$0.152 / \$100 of valuation. The average valued Deerfield home of \$328,009 will have a tax of \$498.57, which is an increase of \$36.46 or 7.88% compared to last year. Thanks to several residents who attended the hearing and participated in the discussion of the tax rate for HCMUD 136.

Presentations were made by MUD 136 consultants and issues affecting the District were discussed. Repairs on sanitary sewer line segments, with damage identified by recent inspections has begun. Two locations have been completed and additional locations are planned during the next month.

Deerfield landscaping committee presented a plan for new trees near the Vanbury Drive Playground. The committee is proposing a reliable means to water the trees and asking the District to assist with the water supply.

The District sponsored the paper shredding and electronics recycling event, Saturday October 19 at the recreation center parking lot. The weather was great, and there was steady traffic dropping material off all morning. Thanks again to all the volunteers who helped with unloading recycling material keeping all the cars moving through.

Key documents can be found on the District's website, including meeting information, District's activities, records, financial statements and drinking water quality reports.

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https://deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- 3. **FENCES:** Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.

4. PARKING:

- a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
- b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
- c. **Be considerate!** Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in Patio Homes.
- 5. TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.

Besides our projects for DFV, and the community at large, we mix in some fun and fellowship which includes a monthly book club. In May TMG toured the Transtar facility and we are planning a few more "road trips." We usually have a monthly Astros watch party. If this sounds like fun, then come and join us.

COMMUNITY SERVICE TMG members volunteer with Meals on Wheels, at the Special Pals animal shelter, at hospitals, including the VA, CERT (emergency response), and at food pantries including Mesa Outreach. Several members mentor at schools, help with the Boy Scouts, and work with St. Vincent de Paul to aid the needy. It is tax time again and several TMG members are doing free tax prep for low-income families. Words that guide us, "You can't help everyone, but everyone can help someone."

BACK AT IT TMG members take a break from doing large outdoor projects during the very hot months of July and August. We were back at it in September replacing the matting in the clubhouse breezeway.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS As in previous years, TMG will be installing Christmas lights, and other decorations, at both the Clay Rd. and north entrances, and around the clubhouse.

.SERVICE PROJECTS: This past month TMG held another successful Food Drive for Mesa Outreach and completed some carpentry jobs including repairing two electrical enclosures and some of the street ID signs in the Patio Homes. We completed the final phase of the greenbelt warning sign replacement project. TMG trimmed a number of trees around the subdivision and power washed the brick walls at the Clay Rd. entrance. We repaired one of the fence poles at the tennis courts and installed a replacement "no parking" pole. TMG removed the existing matting in the Rec Center breezeway and replaced it with 530 sq. ft. of sports

tiles. In addition, we improved the drainage from the sidewalks along the pipeline ROW and installed 4 new catchment covers(atriums) that prevent clogging-it's an experiment. "It's amazing what a team can accomplish when no individual wants the credit!"

Happy November to everyone as we approach the holiday season!

In the October newsletter, I wrote "In September, the aged plastic tiles in the walkway were replaced..." In an egregious oversight, I neglected to say "...were replaced thanks to the work of the Men's Group!!" The volunteers in the Men's Group do a huge amount of work for the neighborhood, and the Community Services Committee thanks them for the contributions they make to keeping Deerfield a great place to live! My apologies for not recognizing them last month.

The positive feedback we have received on the new floor tiles in the Recreation Center walkway has us looking at expanding the area covered by the tiles. We are proposing to extend the tile to the walkway in front of the ice machine leading to the parking lot, as well as by the Office Manager's office. Both walkways tend to get wet and slippery, and the tiles will help solve that problem.

Please ensure that the court gates are <u>closed properly</u> after you have finished playing. We do not want to find courts being misused because a resident did not close the gate properly.

All players are encouraged to leave any old <u>used tennis</u> <u>balls</u> they no longer want in the two (2) <u>Blue Tennis Ball</u> <u>Recycling baskets</u> located close to the court gates.


