Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. If you experience a problem with your trash service, please call Texas Pride first, and then the office if you are unable to get results.

2025 Budget:

The 2025 budget, was approved by the DVCA board on October 17, 2024. A \$20 per residence assessment increase was adopted.

2024 Assessments and Collections:

Yearly Assessments are the primary source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association for the benefit of Deerfield residents. 2024 Collection rate as of the end of the month was again lower than in the past: 96.8% vs 97.9% same-monthaverage for the previous 5 years.

2025 Assessments and Collections:

Invoices for 2025 Assessments plus outstanding balances from 2024 and prior years have been mailed. Payment is due by January 1, 2025 and will be considered late after January 31, 2025. Beginning in February, late fees, interest, and other penalties start to accrue. If you have not received your 2025 invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact Patti Averitt at Consolidated Management Services, 281-296-9775, to request a duplicate.

Landscape Committee

Happy Holidays from the Landscape committee!

The 2025 budget has been approved and in addition our usual responsibilities of lawn care, sprinkler maintenance, sidewalk repair and tree trimming we will be addressing common area drainage issues, refurbishing the plantings along Deerfield Village Drive at the Clay Road entrance and generally sprucing up around the Recreation Center. The new green belt usage signs are in place. We upped our Christmas decorations from last year. We hope you enjoy the lights for the season.

Fall annuals will be planted in December to brighten up the entrances and various common area gardens. We will be organizing a planting party to plant annual color in the various gardens around the around recreation center, therefore this is a call for volunteers. We hope this will become an annual community outing.

The Men's Group kindly power washed the first section of wall along the east side of Deerfield Village Drive at Clay Road. Thank you to TMG!!

The Landscape Committee meets the second Monday of every month at 7PM in the small conference room across from the office. We plan to meet on December 9th. Help keep our neighborhood beautiful and join our committee! Everyone is welcome to attend.

Architectural <u>Guidelines Committee</u>

The AGC (Architectural Guidelines Committee) meets twice a month in the Deerfield Clubhouse. Meetings are at 7pm on the first Thursday and the fourth Tuesday of each month. The meeting agenda will be posted on the website and outside the DVCA Office three days prior to the meeting date. Meeting minutes will be posted on the website once the committee has approved them.

The AGC has made great strides and continues to update the new Unified Protective Covenants (PC) document with modernized language from the original Protective Covenants, and pertinent language from existing policies. At this time, the AGC is focused on the existing provisions, and whether they should be kept, modified, or deleted. However, based on the current process, we will likely go into 2025 before completing the document. All document changes will be discussed and approved at a later date, and subject to community vote. All residents are welcome to attend the AGC meetings. The next meeting will be on Thursday, Dec. 5th at 7pm in the Clubhouse

MUD 136 Report

Harris County MUD 136 (the District) monthly meeting was held in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center Annex, 6:00 PM on Thursday, November 14, 2024. Meetings are open to the public, with the agenda posted at the Deerfield Recreation Center and on the District's website <u>www.hcmud136.org</u>. Presentations were made by MUD 136 consultants and issues affecting the District were discussed. Additional repairs on sanitary sewer line segments are planned with two more locations during the next month.

At this meeting our trash service provider, Texas Pride, informed the District of a price increase to be expected in early 2025. The trash service is part of the Sewer Charges line item on your Monthly Water Bill Statement. Expect your water bill to go up, with this line item increasing as the new rates take effect.

Deerfield landscaping committee presented their plan for new trees near the Vanbury Drive Playground. The committee proposed a drip watering system for new trees which are to be planted soon. The trees will be placed, so in the future they will provide shade for the playground. MUD 136 was requested and agreed to assist with the cost of the watering system.

Key documents can be found on the District's website, including meeting information, District's activities, records, financial statements and drinking water quality reports.

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https: deerfieldvillageonline.com/deeds/ or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- 2. LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS!
- 3. FENCES: Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. If you wish to stain your fence, the only acceptable stains are natural or cedar. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.
- 4. PARKING:
 - a. No boats, trailers, campers, vehicles, etc. may be parked or stored on your driveway or public or patio home street for over 72 hours.
 - b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in culde-sacs.
 - c. **Be considerate!** Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in Patio Homes.
- 5. **TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS:** *TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW* and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.

Deeds meets on the 2nd Monday of the month at 7PM at the Clubhouse. There's no meeting in December. The next meeting will be on January 13, 2025.



<u>Men's Group</u>

The Men's Group (TMG) meets weekly on Thursdays at 9:00 AM at the Rec Center. We have stimulating and lively roundtable discussions on topics of interest to the group. Besides our projects for DVCA, and the community at large, we mix in some fun and fellowship which includes a monthly book club. Earlier this year TMG toured the Transtar facility, and we recently toured the new fire station. We usually have a monthly Astros watch party or meals out. If this sounds like fun, then come and join us.

COMMUNITY SERVICE TMG members volunteer with Meals on Wheels, at the Special Pals animal shelter, at hospitals, including the VA, CERT (emergency response), and at food pantries including Mesa Outreach. Several members mentor at schools, help with the Boy Scouts, and work with St. Vincent de Paul to aid the needy. It is tax time again and several TMG members are doing free tax prep for low-income families. Words that guide us, "You can't help everyone, but everyone can help someone."

FOOD DRIVE The monthly Food Drive will be held Dec. 9-14. Drop off your non-perishable donations in the box outside the office. A reminder, no glass containers or items long past their expiration date.

ONGOING ACTIVITIES Each week we sort the thin films that we collect. The grocery bags go to local Food Pantries—Mesa, KCM, and Meals on Wheels, and the rest go to TREX. We collect used tennis balls and take them to Special Pals or the dog park. Additionally, we continue to collect used eyeglasses and suitcases.

CHRISTMAS STOCKINGS Once again this year TMG will be filling 60 Christmas stockings that will be distributed to our needy Meals on Wheels clients. Your donations at Pancake Breakfasts fund this activity. A big thank you to the ladies of the Sewing Bees of Texas for making the stockings again this year.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS As in previous years TMG members installed Christmas lights, and other decorations, at both the Clay Rd. and north entrances, and around the clubhouse.

SERVICE PROJECTS: This past month TMG held another successful Food Drive for Mesa Outreach and completed some carpentry and electrical jobs. We power washed additional sections of the brick walls at the Clay Rd. entrance and also power washed and marked all the blue recycle cans around the Rec Center. TMG repaired one of the fence poles at the tennis courts and installed a replacement "no parking" pole. We removed the existing matting in the Rec Center breezeway and replaced it with 530 sq. ft. of sports tiles. TMG washed the windows in the clubhouse and annex and assisted with the flower planting around the Rec Center. In addition, we improved the drainage from the sidewalks along the pipeline ROW and added

It has been decided that we will be extending the tile to the walkway in front of the ice machine leading to the parking lot, as well as by the Office. Pet Hotline News

- Make sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- Did you know that you can register your pet with Deerfield's Pet Hotline? Call Marie Nugent, 713-818-5799 for a Pet Hotline tag for your pet. The tag has Marie's home and cell phone number. She keeps a log with a photo, breed, pet's name, and your address, and phone contact numbers. A rabies tag is a great ID, but many Vets are not contactable 24/7 and the finder may not able to keep your pet for several days.
- If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were micro-chipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- Please make sure your fence is secure so so your pets don't escape.
- PLEASE remember your pets, DON'T leave them in your hot car!
- PLEASE be a responsible pet owner, both cat and dog, and pick up their poop, thank you.

Tennis Committee

The Tennis Committee welcomes all residents to come out to enjoy the courts for both tennis and pickleball. Please sign yourself up on the Tennis/Pickleball Sign-up sheets located on the office window at the Recreation center. All residents are reminded to legibly sign up for court time with a FIRST and LAST NAME on the sheet. The player themself must sign up for the courts. Players can sign up for 2 hours at a time and no more than 3 guests per resident and household when playing.
