Are you interested in participating in the **SAYOR** program to swim outside of lifeguarded times? See Cat our Office Manager to help you get signed up for the program or answer any questions.


Don't forget April 15<sup>th</sup> is Tax Day this year, for those waiting until the last minute.

# Nothing but water should go down our storm drains

Do not dump chemicals down our storm drains, as they will make their way to the greenbelt ditch and be poisonous to our pets/animals drinking the water and/ or children playing. Please make certain that the grass/ yard clippings along curbs are bagged. In case of a heavy rain, these clippings will be swept into the sewer system and block the runoff water; which in turn will flood our streets.

Please do not put your trash at the curb earlier than the night before collection day. Note: Budgeted expenditures that have not yet been expensed but are expected to be expensed in subsequent months are reflected in the Year End Forecast.

#### 2025 Assessments and Collections:

Yearly Assessments are the primary source of funds for operation of the Deerfield Village Community Association for the benefit of Deerfield residents. 2025 Collection rate as of the end of the month (85.0%) was about the same as last February but 2.5% lower than the same-month-average for the previous 5 years.

Invoices for 2025 Assessments plus outstanding balances from 2024 and prior years were mailed October 2024. Payment was due by January 1, 2025 and was considered late after January 31, 2025. Beginning in February, late fees, interest, and other penalties started to accrue. If you have not received your 2025 invoice or are unable to locate it, please contact the DVCA office to request a duplicate. All payments to DVCA should be sent to the DVCA office.

# **Community Services**

Spring starts on March 20, and that means warmer weather and spring showers – perfect weather for mosquitoes. Spraying and Larvicide treatment in the drains will start in April, and we can help the effectiveness of the mosquito treatments by taking some simple steps to eliminate breeding grounds.


- Remove empty containers that hold standing water, including bird baths, pet water bowls, and flowerpots.
- Cut the grass and trim the bushes. Grass clippings, raked leaves, piles of downed branches, and compost piles are all attractive hiding places for mosquitoes.
- Check the rain gutters for obstructions and areas that don't drain. One of the best ways to keep mosquitoes from your home is proper drain and gutter maintenance and cleaning.
- Fill in any low-lying areas in the yard.
- Look after your pool

There is no guarantee that cleaning up possible breeding sites will keep mosquitoes away because they can still breed elsewhere and fly into the yard. But most mosquitoes feed within a few hundred yards of where they were hatched, so it will help reduce the number of biting mosquitoes in the immediate area.

We've just finished a round of repairs, renovations and painting of the restrooms in the main buildings at the Recreation Center. Please leave them clean after using them and turn off the lights and make sure the doors are closed when you leave.

As always, I encourage interested residents to join one of the Committees that keep Deerfield a great place to live. The Community Services Committee is a small group of residents working on the upkeep of our facilities and other facets of Deerfield life such as pest control and keeping the greenbelt lights on. If you would like to help with this effort, please come to our meetings on the first Monday of each month at 7pm at the Rec Center. Next meeting is April 7<sup>th</sup>. We hope to see you there!

# MUD 136 Report

Harris County MUD 136 (the District) monthly meeting was held in the Deerfield Village Recreation Center, 6:00 PM on Thursday, March 13, 2025. Meetings are open to the public, with the agenda posted at the Deerfield Recreation Center and on the District's website <u>www.hcmud136.org</u>. Key documents can be found on the District's website, including meeting information, District's activities, records, financial statements and drinking water quality reports.

Presentations were made by MUD 136 consultants and issues affecting the District were discussed. The 2024 property tax payments exceed 96% of the total billed. Thank you for your timely payment. Cost of sewer service for the District's commercial customers was reviewed and rates adjusted. Reminder that 'sewer charges' on your bill include both trash and cost for sewer lines / sewer treatment.

MUD 136 Board reviewed all comments on the new trash service. We are working with Best Trash to achieve 100% pickup. However, during major yard cleanup times, yard debris pickup may be limited to 5 bags per home. This ensures all household trash is picked up before the trash trucks overfill with yard waste. If this happens to you, return the yard waste for the next service day. Recycling service is now on Tuesdays. We continue to have Tuesday and Friday trash service. Best Trash customer service number is <u>281-313-2378</u> or email to <u>customerservice@besttrashtexas.com</u>.

Deerfield Landscaping committee reported the completion of improvements at the Vanbury Drive playground. Several trees have been planted to provide future shade for the playground. The District provided the watering system for these trees.

https://mobile-text-alerts.com/hcmud136. Registered residents will receive alerts about drought conditions and water, sewer, trash and recycling services.

# Deeds Committee

- 1. **ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATION:** Please submit an Architectural Approval (AA) to the office PRIOR to the start of any repair, improvement, or addition to the exterior of your home or property. Forms, found on the DVCA website, should be submitted well in advance (7-10 days) of the project so the committee has time to review and approve. The website is: https: deerfieldvillageonline. com/deeds/ or contact the office at 281-463-2624.
- LANDSCAPE: All lots shall always be kept in attractive condition. Grass, including shrubs and trees, should be well maintained. PLEASE WEED YOUR FLOWER BEDS and EDGE WALKWAYS AND CURBS and REMOVE ANY DEAD SHRUBS that did not survive the winter.
- 3. **TRIM TREE LIMBS AWAY from STREET LIGHTS:** If your tree is obstructing a streetlight, please trim it so the street is properly illuminated at night.
- CHRISTMAS and HOLIDAY DECORATIONS and LIGHTS should be removed from your home and landscaping in a timely manner.
- 5. **MOLD** and **MILDEW** are always a problem. With spring on the horizon, please remove mold and mildew that may be growing on your home.
- 6. FENCES: Please submit an AA prior to the project for approval. When replacing or installing a new fence that faces the street or is visible from ANY public area, no fence railings should be visible. The smooth, flat side of the fence must face out towards the street or public area. See Fence Policy Non-Perimeter document on the DVCA website under the Deeds tab.
- 7. PARKING:
  - a. No cars, boats, trailers, campers, or vehicles of any kind, may be parked or stored on a public street or in your driveway for over 72 hours. This includes the Patio Homes.
  - b. There should be NO HEAD-IN parking in cul-desacs.
  - c. **Be considerate!** Please do not block your neighbor's driveway, especially in the Patio Homes.
- TRASH CANS and RECYCLING BINS: TRASH CANS, RECYCLE BINS and PLASTIC YARD DEBRIS BAGS SHOULD BE STORED OUT OF PUBLIC VIEW and placed curbside the EVENING BEFORE pick-up and removed from view the same day after pick-up.
- 9. Deeds members meet on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of the month at 7PM at the Clubhouse. The next two meetings will be on April 14<sup>th</sup> and May 12<sup>th</sup>. public area, no fence railings should be visible. # <u>Men's Group</u>

The Men's Group (TMG) meets weekly on Thursdays at 9AM at the Rec Center. We have stimulating and lively roundtable discussions on topics of interest to the group. Besides our projects for DFV, and the community at large, we mix in some fun and fellowship which includes a monthly book club. Earlier this year TMG toured the Transtar facility, and we recently toured the new fire station. In April we will resume our monthly Astros watch parties. **COMMUNITY SERVICE**- TMG members volunteer with Meals on Wheels, at the Special Pals animal shelter, at hospitals, including the VA, CERT (emergency response), and at food pantries including Mesa Outreach. Several members mentor at schools, help with the Boy Scouts, and work with St. Vincent de Paul to aid the needy. It is tax time again and several TMG members are doing free tax prep for low-income families. Words that guide us, "You can't help everyone, but everyone can help someone."

**LENDING LIBRARY**- TMG has installed new light bars above each of the shelves in the Lending Library.

**<u>USED EYEGLASSES</u>**-So far, we have collected about 300 pairs on our way to our goal of 500. There are two collection boxes next to the Lending Library in the breezeway at the Recreation Center.

**ANNIVERSARY**- At the end of February we celebrated our 8<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We had our first meeting in 2017-a lot of water under the bridge since then. Many memories to Celebrate!

SERVICE PROJECTS: This past month TMG held another successful Food Drive for Mesa Outreach and completed some carpentry and electrical jobs, including installing new lights at the Lending Library. Working with Landscape we planted almost 400 Canna bulbs as part of the Clay Rd. entrance improvement project. TMG installed the last sections of walkway mating and washed the windows in the clubhouse and in the annex. Prior to the return of the Purple Martins we cleaned out the houses, replaced one and repaired several others. In addition, we planted 4 large trees and repaired the sandbox at the Vanbury playground, and hauled two large truckloads of mulch to the Rec Center playground. TMG continued to work on drainage problems along the sidewalk that follows the pipeline ROW. "It's amazing what a team can accomplish when no individual wants the credit!"

The spreading of wildflowers we did appears to have mixed results. We will try the wildflowers again next year.

Spring flowers around the recreation center and community entrances will be planted in April. We haven't managed to get enough people in the community to help with our planting efforts as an organized group therefore, we will leave the planting to the landscape company professionals again this year. Other projects we have include freshening up around the pool area with new landscaping and surveying the common area drain situation and doing clean-outs as necessary.

We are in need of additional members who want to make a difference as we continue our beautification efforts around the recreation center for this Spring. Please bring your landscaping and grounds maintenance ideas to our next meeting.

### **Pet Hotline News**

- Make sure your pet has a form of ID on their collar. Key tags are available 3 for \$2.00 at most hardware stores and work fine for pet ID's.
- If you have your pet microchipped, make sure you register on the database and keep your information current. Pets have been found wandering around the neighborhood and, when taken to the vet, found they were micro-chipped but the information was obsolete, thus making it harder to contact the owner.
- Please make sure your fence is secure so so your pets don't escape.

## **Tennis Committee**

The Tennis Committee meets on the first Wednesday of each month at 7pm in the clubhouse. Residents are welcome to attend our meetings. The Tennis Committee was approved to resurface our courts and add marking lines on Court 3 for 2 more Pickle Ball Courts.

All Tennis and Pickle Ball players should legibly sign up for a court with a FIRST and LAST name <u>on the</u> <u>sign-up sheets</u> located on the window outside the Deerfield office for the 2-hour time slot. The resident them self should book the court required. Any resident can have up to 3 guest players per day. Players are asked to remove any trash after playing and put it in the respective trash bins outside the courts. There is 1 BLUE bin on each of the 2 courts for used tennis balls only which are no longer required... these bins are not for trash.

Players are asked to be respectful and considerate of other players and are reminded that no music or radios are allowed on the courts. Pickle ball players are asked to ensure that the nets are moved to the side of court 4 when they are finished. All players are particularly asked to ensure that the court gates are fully closed and locked after playing.

The next two Tennis Committee meetings will be on April 2<sup>nd</sup> and May 7<sup>th</sup>.




